Resurrection and Ascension of Our Lord and Savior

This is the time of year when we bring our attention to the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Jesus' resurrection brings hope to the believers that we too will one day be resurrected. In 1 Corinthians 15:20-23 it states: But now Christ is risen from the dead, and has become the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since by man came death, by Man also came the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive.

"Jesus said, 'I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in Me, though he die, yet shall he live, and everyone who lives and believes in Me shall never die.'" (John 11:25–26) The resurrection does not end here, Jesus Christ ascended into heaven. Acts 1:9-11 states when He had spoken these things, while the disciples beheld, He was taken up; and a cloud received Him out of their sight. And while they looked steadfastly toward heaven as He went up, behold, two men stood by them in white apparel; which also said, "Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus, which is taken up from you into heaven, shall so come in like manner as ye have seen Him go into heaven." We have a risen Savior that ascended into heaven. He sits at the right hand of the Father with all power and authority; interceding on our behalf. Hallelujah!

Jesus' ascension completes the resurrection. However, He did not leave us comfortless. In John 14 it states And I will pray the Father, and He shall give you another Comforter which is the Holy Ghost that He may abide with you forever. He shall teach you all things and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you. Even the spirit of truth. Aren't you glad the Holy Spirit dwells richly in you?

This Easter share the full Gospel of Jesus Christ with everyone -His birth, His life, His death, His burial, His resurrection, and His ascension. Then invite them to accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Amen.

Partnership in the Gospel

Goal: To learn what true community is and to practice biblical *Koinonia*.

Lesson Objective: To experience *koinonia through Partnership in the Gospel* based on biblical principles with others who share a common life in Jesus Christ.

Scripture: "I thank God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now." (Philippians 1:3-5

Lesson: Previous lessons have dealt with Koinonia when translated from the original language as fellowship with one another within the body of Christ. This month's lesson will focus on Koinonia when translated, from the Greek, as *partnership*. When we build up and enjoy one another, we are in fellowship, but when we join together to spread the gospel, we are in partnership. In the latter, our objectives are focused outside of ourselves on those who need to be brought into the fellowship of God's people. Today's lesson centers on gaining a perspective on how to become actively involved in partnership in the spread of the gospel throughout the world by providing ministerial support. The great commission given by Jesus tells us, "Go ye therefore and teach all nations baptizing them in the Name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Ghost...." –Matthew 28:20. This biblical mandate is fulfilled through the practice of partnership in the gospel. We are all called to spread the gospel, but for practical reasons the majority of us are limited to the geography in our local areas.

Our partnership in the gospel, once clearly understood ought to inspire us to become actively involved in the *spread of the gospel* through fervent prayer and financial contributions without leaving home. Paul's letter to the Philippian gives us a biblical model to follow and we can come to value this fellowship by engaging as partners in the gospel. "He considered his dear friends in Philippi to be actively engaged in partnership with him in the spreading of the gospel to other cities, even though most of them never left Philippi." In a similar way, we can become actively engaged with the body of Christ in fulfilling the great commission.

There are two significant ways that enables everyone to share in partnership in the gospel. Paul first acknowledged the Philippians church and remembered to thank God for them in his prayers for their partnership in the gospel from the beginning of his ministry up to the end. We can do likewise. The second way believers can practice partnership in the gospel is through regular and meaningful prayer for those who are called to go and spread the gospel throughout the world. There are members within our own church body who travel regularly to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ. We must be willing to put in quality time and go out as fishermen among men even within our own communities. As a result, when we as a community of believers truly apply the principles of koinonia, this should compel us to grow in spiritual fellowship with one another.

For they gave according to their means, as I can testify, and beyond their means of their own accord begging us earnestly for the favor of taking part in the relief of the saints. (2 Corinthians 8:3-4)

Partnership in Giving

Paul's acknowledged the financial support from Philippi throughout in his letter to the Philippian Church. "Every Christian today has the same privilege as did the believers at Philippi of being a partner in the gospel enterprise. Each of us has the opportunity to practice partnership with ministries by our prayers and/ or financial support far beyond our personal endeavors, both in cities at home and in countries overseas." Claiming our Jerusalem is gospel partnership effort all of us can support; physically, financially, and/ or through prayers.

Partnership in Prayer

The Philippians not only gave, they prayed for Paul. Prayer unifies us with other active participants to fulfill God's work as we seek Him to fulfill His purpose in us and in others. Paul relied on and gratefully acknowledged their prayers and monetary gifts not only to help us learn about the support he received from several churches, but to give us a powerful way to become involved as active partners in spreading the gospel throughout the world with prayers and monetary gifts.

Resurrection

This matter of history has theological significance. The truth of this event signals the settlement of the outstanding debt, due to sin, that mankind owed God. It also signified the conquering of the death and the grave. This frees those who believe in the Jesus Christ from the fear of death and the grave because they both were subjugated by our Lord.

One of the Greek words translated resurrection is anastasis. The word anastasis is a compound word consisting of ana, which means "again" and histemi which means "to stand." From this understanding of the etymology of the Greek word anastasis, the word resurrection means "to stand up again." When Jesus was buried in the tomb on Friday, death had Him "off his feet." However on Sunday morning the power of God caused Jesus "to stand up again." The truth that this happened for Jesus is amazing enough but God has extended to each of us the opportunity to experience this same power. Sin has caused all of mankind to be knocked off their feet. It is only through man's faith in Jesus Christ that man can be put back on his feet.

There are situations in our lives that have knocked us to the ground of discouragement, disappointment, distress and depression. The power of our faith in Jesus Christ can cause us to know for ourselves the wonder of God's resurrection power. God can stand you up again, no matter how you have fallen. Because of the power of the resurrection we should not feel that all is lost. We have the hope of recovery in Jesus. Yes, there is hope of standing up again from being knocked off

your feet by any failure, any addiction, any situation.

Many people have not appropriated this truth for themselves. They have chosen to allow their failures, their sins to consign them a deathlike existence. They have chosen to not believe in the resurrection power of God. They won't let God, due to their lack of faith, put them back on their feet again. You may be one of those persons. It is not too late for you to trust God and His power to resurrect your life. It is not too late for you to trust God and look forward to that great resurrection of those who die in Him. Make the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ more than an event in history. Make the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ more than a truth of theology. Make the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ a personal reality in your life today. Let the power of God put you back on your feet again, let Him do it today.




