Getting to Know God

Ever had someone approach you in such a way that it left you feeling offended by the familiar way they spoke to you? So many times I've heard others say "I don't even know that person or they talk to me like we're old friends but I barely know them." Paul commanded the evil spirit to come out of the woman following behind them, taunting in such a way to appear to know them saying, "These men are servants of the Most High God, which shew unto us the way of salvation." (Acts 16:17 KJV) How offensive it is to hear someone using the Lord's name in vain. They call on Jesus for any trivial circumstance with no respect for His holiness.

It's so important to get to know someone before you try getting too familiar or personal with them. So how important do you think it is to get to know God? Getting to know God is so important. Your first introduction is when you say, "Yes" to Jesus as personal Lord and savior. Once you place your total trust in His finished work on the cross for your salvation, opening your heart to him through saving faith, He takes his rightful place on the throne of your heart. You are now a child of God with the awesome privilege of an open invitation to talk with Him in prayer anytime, anywhere, He hears you. You are no longer a stranger. "Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellowcitizens with the saints, and of the household of God;" (Ephes. 2:19 KJV). Jesus said," I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. If you really know me, you will know my Father as well." (John 14:6-7b NIV) Our relationship with God grows through prayerful study and obedience of His word. The word He inspired is useful

for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness. (See 2 Tim 3:16-17)

What if we were more excited about following the Lord's word than the TV programs Scandal and How to Get Away with Murder? Let's face it, nobody gets away with murder and the news has more than enough real life scandal broadcasted every day. If scandal is what you're looking for, what about David and Bathsheba, Sampson and Delilah, Ahab and Jezebel, and the list goes on and on. The difference is scandal and murder in the bible shows life consequences and life lessons. "Turn my eyes from worthless things; preserve my life according to your word." (Ps 119:37 NIV)

Questions we can ourselves: Am I seeking God for His will and purpose for my life? Am I striving for holiness, not holier than thou or walking in judgment over others? Am I truly getting to know God and His word? Has my church attendance become more social than spiritual? Do I set Sunday aside for worship or do I give the Holy Spirit a time limit? Do I examine myself in the light of God's word? Do I purposefully read and follow the church covenant practicing its principals or do I just recite it in ritual on 1st Sunday? Am I saved to serve or be served? Do I sacrifice time, talent and treasure for the good of God's kingdom? Am I a kingdom builder or do I tear it down with my words? Do I pray and ask God for opportunities to share my faith?

Knowing God in a personal relationship will lead you to know yourself, your gifts, and give you the heart that longs to see others saved and set free. How well do you know Him?

Writer's Ministry

Goal:

To learn what true community is and to practice biblical Koinonia.

Objective:

To experience koinonia by actively desiring to know Christ and the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of serving.

Scripture:

"You...were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature; rather, serve one another in love." (Galatians 5:13)

Overview:

We have explored various expressions of koinonia over the months to include union with God, sharing a common life, partnership in the gospel and the fellowship of suffering. This month we expand our concept of koinonia by studying the fellowship of serving. As a biblical community, we share a common life, in Christ, with other believers through relationship, partnership, and fellowship. One primary meaning of koinonia is sharing together with others what we have. One of the most valuable things we can share in the body of Christ is ourselves, time, talents, and energy to serve one another.

There is no greater model and teacher of service than our Lord Jesus Christ who in His incarnation took on the very nature of a servant. [Phil. 2:7] We saw this demonstrated when He washed the feet of His disciples and blessed two fish and five barley loaves of bread to feed more than five thousand hungry people. Although He Himself is the sovereign God, creator and sustainer of the universe, He performed acts of service in spite of His greatness and authority. Regardless, of any position we hold, we too must serve one another.

For who is greater, he who sits at the table, or he who serves? Is it not he who sits at the table? Yet, I am among you as the One who serves. [NKJV, Luke 22:27]

This brings us to the biblical characteristics of a servant. First of all, one must have a servant's attitude. This allows us to do even the most menial tasks willingly and in a spirit of love. No

special talents or abilities are required. Contrary to the world's way of thinking, one of the main characteristics of a servant is that he serves downward. Within the body of Christ, no one is too important to serve others. Another important character trait in serving others is faithfulness or trustworthiness. Just because we volunteer our time to serve the church or others, we may be prone to think that faithfulness is not important, but it is God who requires that we be faithful. It is difficult for the body of Christ to maintain itself or move forward if the people who serve are inconsistent, uncommitted, or fail to fulfill their responsibilities.

Moreover, it is required in stewards that one be found faithful. [NKJV,1Corinthians 4:2]

How can we engage in the fellowship of serving in a manner that will bring glory to God? God must give us a servant attitude. We must allow Him to change us through His Word, Bible study, prayer, and obedience so that we may serve Him and the body of Christ in a spirit of love towards one another. God can get no glory from the one who serves in arrogance, impatience, and in a mean spirit.

Whatever capacity that we serve in brings its own set of challenges. Consider the ushers who are the doorkeepers in the house of God. If people are inconsiderate and disrespectful towards them as they try to perform their tasks, it creates tension and animosity in the body of Christ. In whatever area we serve, we must learn to cope with and pray regarding the inconsideration of others. There are many who work tirelessly behind the scenes keeping the church safe, the yards clean, or handling logistical details for events, but may not receive a 'thank you' for their relentless service. Yet, we must be prepared to accept ingratitude or being taken for granted. To all who serve, we must accept our role, persevere, and serve as unto the Lord. When being served, we need to express gratitude and be sensitive to the demands we make on others.

Blessed are those servants whom the master, when he comes, will find watching. Assuredly, I say to you that he will gird himself and have them sit down to eat, and will come and serve them. [NKJV Luke 12:37]

attempting to instruct Him on how to work out our situation. We only want God to use His power the way we have predetermined. This is to say to God, I know what needs to be done, but I don't have the power to do it. Really trusting God is to understand that He knows what we don't know and He has options we don't have. Wow, could it be that there are options that are beyond our comprehension? Could it be that God sees what we don't see and can do what we can't do?

To trust God requires humbling ourselves to say "nevertheless, not my will but Your will be done." You and I must recognize that we often cheat ourselves of the greater, better, and more beneficial outcomes to our situations when we fail to trust God. We do this by closing our minds to any solution that is not born in our mind. When we do this, I wonder can this really be called trust. I am not suggesting that we should not bring to God our desires, plans and hopes. However, in the bringing of our desires, plans and hopes, we must be willing to yield them to God. Yielding our plans, hopes and desires to God does not necessarily mean that He will not fulfill them. Yielding our plans, hopes and desires to God means that we recognize that He is God and He always does what is best. Yielding our plans, hopes and desires to God means to never end up with less than He plans, hopes and desires for us.

We often don't trust people when we doubt their intention to do us good. When it comes to God, we should never doubt God's intention to do us good. God has demonstrated His intention on Calvary. God's intention really is His love for us. God has put His love on display because He intends to do us good. In fact, since the beginning of time God has always intended good toward us. We should trust God completely because He not only intends to do us good, He is the only one who can and will do us good all the time. We must trust God without reservation.

I trust God, do you? I trust not only His ability, but also trust His wisdom, His unfailing love for me, His unimpeachable integrity, and His eternal intention to do me good. I trust God, do you? I trust God with my life, my present, my plans, my desires, my hopes, my future, my problems, my circumstances, my doubts and my fears. What about you, what do you trust God with?

'Tis so sweet to trust in Jesus, just to take Him at His word, just to rest upon His promise, just to know, "Thus saith the Lord."

O how sweet to trust in Jesus, just to trust His cleansing blood, just in simple faith to plunge me 'neath the healing, cleansing flood!

Yes, 'tis sweet to trust in Jesus, just from sin and self to cease, just from Jesus simply taking life and rest and joy and peace.

I'm so glad I learned to trust Thee, Precious Jesus, Savior, Friend; and I know that Thou art with me, wilt be with me to the end.






