In times of great challenge our confidence in God is tested. In fact without these times of challenge it is hard to know whether our faith in God is genuine. We must resist the ever-present tendency to fret, find fault, blame and complain when we find ourselves in trying times. The Word of God calls for a different kind of response to life difficulties. The Apostle James records these words: "Dear brothers and sisters, when troubles of any kind come your way, consider it an opportunity for great joy. For you know that when your faith is tested, your endurance has a chance to grow. So let it grow, for when your endurance is fully developed, you will be perfect and complete, needing nothing. If you need wisdom, ask our generous God, and he will give it to you. He will not rebuke you for asking." (James 1:2-5, NLT)

Writer's Ministry

Goal:

To learn what true community is and to practice biblical Koinonia.

Objective:

To experience koinonia by actively desiring to know Christ and the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of sharing in His sufferings.

Scripture:

"I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings." (Philippians 3:10)

Overview:

Over the past months, we have been studying various expressions of true spiritual fellowship or koinonia within the church body and with other Christ followers. This month's lesson focuses on the fellowship of suffering. We will explore the often dreaded perspective of suffering with even unknown challenges that could lead to growth in relationship with Christ through our willingness to share in His suffering. "Most Christians can appreciate Paul's yearning to know Christ in a more intimate way, and we certainly identify with Paul's desire to experience the power of the resurrected Christ in his life, but we pause a bit when we come to his desire to know the fellowship of sharing in His suffering." "This fellowship refers to a partnership and deep communion of suffering that every believer shares with Christ who is able to comfort us when we suffer because He has already endured the same suffering and exceedingly more."

"The universal testimony of those who have suffered for the sake of Christ and His church is that they have experienced a deep fellowship, an intimate communion with Him in the midst of their sufferings." Paul's identification with Christ's suffering inspired him to desire the experience of a closer relationship with Christ. He shared this desire for growth with the Philippian church, which was to not only personally know Christ but also the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of sharing in His suffering. [Philip. 3:10] Paul's own experiences and suffering enabled him to express with sincerity through his relationship with Jesus: "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." [Philippians 3:14]. Every Christian who

places their faith and trust in Christ can realize the same confidence, strength and spiritual growth through a personal relationship with Christ even in the valley of suffering. We learn several things; that Christ is faithful, nothing can separate us from His love, and that His grace is sufficient for our weaknesses.

Paul realized that his sharing with Christ in his suffering would advance the cause of Christ and His church. He understood that his identification with Christ and work on behalf of Christ would certainly mean suffering. As Christ followers, we too can promote kingdom building. Our willingness to suffer for the cause of Christ is a sign of being God's children and we will be ultimately glorified with Him. [Rom. 8:17] The apostles rejoiced because they were counted worthy to suffer for His name. [Acts 5:41]

Christ does not leave His people to suffer alone. Neither should we leave our brothers and sisters to suffer alone. Fellowship is to stand with them in their suffering even those who are persecuted for the sake of Christ. The body of Christ is found among all nations and people of every color. Believers suffering in other parts of the world are members of Christ's body. We can pray sincere and fervent prayers on their behalf. God may reveal something that we can do toward meeting their needs.

As a community of believers we share in one another's suffering, as we partner with them during their trials, hardships, and losses. As we stand with them and experience what they experience, we can be a source of comfort and encouragement. "God does intend that we so closely identify with our suffering brothers and sisters that their hurts become our hurts." "Those of us who are parents tend to so identify with our children that we experience their hurts" As a parent would we place their need before our own. It is only God's love manifested through us that gives us an ability to reach out in true fellowship to others in need.

"But when you do good and suffer, if you take it patiently, this is commendable before God, for to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that we you should follow His steps." [1 Peter 2: 20-21]

end. We can have joy because we know that God is omnibenevolent, which means He is good all the time. Whether God ordains it or allows it. He is uniquely capable and always actively causing all things to work together for our good. So, joy is that holy gladness due to our confidence that is anchored exclusively in the sovereignty of a loving God.

This holy gladness exists in multifarious situations. You and I are expected to have and should have this joy no matter what the trial may be. Nothing that comes our way should be allowed to keep us from having this joy. No disease, no disappointment, no delay, no devastation, absolutely nothing should be seen as something outside this command of scripture. Of course the imperative nature of this scripture requires our volitional yielding in order to make it a reality in our lives. This choice is no denial of the realness of your circumstance. This choice is the confident awareness of God's superintendence over your circumstances.

Knowing that God is in charge increases your patience, your endurance. We grow in our faith towards God as we learn to wait on Him. We put away our running away shoes and choose to stand barefooted on the promises of God. So let your faith in God grow your ability to endure whatever comes into your life. We can count our multifarious trials as joy because our trials under God's care serve as an incubator for our maturity. We find that through our manifold trials we are no longer tripping over life with childish tantrums but we able to face life as spiritual grown-ups, making the most of every situation. Because you know that growth is the spiritual outcome of your trials, you find yourself having and expressing holy gladness, joy!

God knows that there will be times when we don't know how to have this joy come to pass in our lives. Since He knows this God says ask Him for wisdom. We can ask God, and he will show us how.

So when life throws you a curve, smile in your spirit because you know that God is in control. Smile in your spirit because you know that this is another opportunity to learn something new about God and His love for you. Smile in your spirit, because you know that you have a fresh opportunity to grow up a little more in the Lord.

Eugene Peterson paraphrases this passage like this: "Consider it a sheer gift, friends, when tests and challenges come at you from all sides. You know that under pressure, your faith-life is forced into the open and shows its true colors. So don't try to get out of anything prematurely. Let it do its work so you become mature and well-developed, not deficient in any way. If you don't know what you're doing, pray to the Father. He loves to help. You'll get his help, and won't be condescended to when you ask for it." (James 1:2-5, The Message)



Biblical Studies

Course Name	Course Description
Survey of the Old Testament	This course focuses on the content of each of the Old Testament books, the historical events that give context to the books, and specific questions that help draw out the overarching principles contained in the Old Testament from a birdseye perspective. The survey addresses the Old Testament as a whole and by major sections and individual books, exploring interpretation, geographical, archaeological, theological and literary elements.
Survey of the New Testament	This survey course addresses the who, what, where, when, why, and how questions that readers of the Bible may have, such as: When were these books written and why? And what can today's believers get out of letters addressed to people who lived two thousand years ago? The course will explore some of the major themes and emphases in the NT, seeking to apply the teachings found there to our lives.
Faith Fundamentals	What are the foundational biblical truths upon which our faith is based? All believers need to understand the basic biblical truths about God, salvation, sin, the Holy Spirit, reconciliation, grace, and other doctrinal truths if they are to stand strong in faith in a world where truth is never static. In this class, we will examine the foundational truths of our faith and also examine the articles of faith to grasp the truth of our denominational beliefs. This class will help you understand what we believe and give you a strong foundation in the faith.

Discipleship Studies

Course Name	Course Description
Disciple Making	This course will explore the fundamentals of victorious Christian living that will lead to a
	life time of joy in knowing God and making Him known.
Disciple Maturing	The purpose of this course is to help provide a solid base for your Christian life, especially
	in the area of relationships with other believers.
	This course gives an overview of the process of making disciples. The structure of class
	utilizes the "Teaching Process" 1. Tell them what you want them to do 2. Show them how
	to do it 3. Watch them do it 4. Praise what they do correctly 5. Correct what they do
	incorrectly, i.e., make suggestions for improvement 6. Repeat until they can implement
	the new skill consistently at the level needed.

Evangelism Studies

Course Name	Course Description
Beginners Evangelism	This course is designed to start the student on a lifestyle of evangelism as demonstrated by the early church. The course will initially prepare students to share their faith without fear. Providing instruction and encouragement in the basics of personal evangelism and seeks to equip the student for the task of evangelism. At the heart of the teaching will be a study of the Gospel.

Intermediate Evangelism	This course provides a natural flow of transitioning from a natural conversation to a spiritual conversation in a non-threatening manner with family, friends, coworkers, neighbors, and the stranger you meet in the supermarket.
Advanced Evangelism	This course will define evangelism and describe the role of the body of Christ regarding evangelism as a lifestyle. It includes the motivation of the saints, the methods of personal and group witnessing, holistic evangelism, and current issues related to sharing a person's faith.
	This Bible Study course will provide a survey of the basic tenets and principles of different world religions. It will also provide an objective overview to what is living and significant in the world's major religious traditions and in various new movements that are arising. It will provide a clear and straightforward account of the development of religion and the doctrines and practices of the major faiths that exist today.
	This course focuses on acquiring the knowledge and skills necessary for defending Christianity. In doing so, it equips students to respond effectively to the daily challenges to their faith. We will be seeking to develop an apologetic lifestyle that promotes commendation of the faith rather than criticism. In addition, we will be seeking to understand the biblical basis for apologetics, developing a biblical world and life view and engaging contemporary culture. We will also give some attention to the problem of evil.
