Most Christians want to please God. We just aren't always sure we will have what it takes to make this happen. This uncertainty can cause us to shrink back from opportunities of ministry. If we are not careful, we can find ourselves mimicking the actions of the slothful servant who went and dug a hole in the ground and hid his talent. Some Christians, have been so harassed by those who have made it their business to keep ever before them their inadequacies that they, don't believe they can do anything worthwhile. For others, it is the personal pain of brokenness, even though this brokenness is camouflaged by the cosmetics of busyness. These things can keep you on the sideline of ministry. The audience of the Epistle of Hebrews knew firsthand about the temptation to check out of ministry due to others telling you, and you telling yourself that you won't make it because you don't have what it takes. The writer closes this letter of encouragement with this a powerful prayer-wish, a benediction for this discouraged audience. Even Now, Go Tell It

Many have observed that New Year's Resolutions are not promises to God. Rather, they are promises made to oneself to do or not do something. But when Ecclesiastes 5 is brought to mind, we discern a clear direction from God, and so we become less concerned about the failure of these resolutions to be promises to Him. [STOP!!!] Get your Bibles and read, Ecclesiastes 5:4-6.

Writer's Ministry - Deacon's Lesson

Lesson 4: Baptized in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost

"For there are three that bear record in heaven, the Father, the Word [the Son], and the Holy Ghost: and these three are one." 1 John 5:7

Goal: To embrace and fulfill our covenant relationship with God and one another.

Objective: To understand the significance of being baptized in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost and what it reveals about the nature of God.

Introduction:

The doctrine of the Trinity is one of the great mysteries of God. It reveals the unity of three distinct persons in one divine being. These three persons—the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are equal participants in the same nature, sovereignty and power of God. The Trinity (the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit) agree as one in unity having the same mind and purpose. "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is above all, and through all, and in you all." [Eph. 4:4-6.] The trinity is a divine revelation that can not be fully understood with our finite mind and must be accepted by faith in God. To be baptized in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit glorifies God who is the Creator, sustainer and source of life. The Son, Jesus Christ, is God's perfect gift who is with us being the visible image of the Father and is the author of eternal salvation. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life" (John 3:16). The Holy Spirit that dwells in us is our source of hope in a sinful world. We, as individual and collective believers, are given the assurance by the Holy Spirit that we are children of God and we have been sealed until the day of redemption. [Romans 8:16; Eph. 4:30]

Christ instituted Christian baptism, when He submitted to John's baptism, adopting its form, with some change of meaning. John's baptism was unto repentance and faith in Him who was to come. Jesus baptized (or His disciples) into Himself as the Messiah who had come, and as the sign that His kingdom had already been established in the hearts of those who received it.

Baptized in the Name of the Father:

The significance of baptism in the name of the Father confirms a personal relationship and oneness with God, the Creator of all creation. He is the Most-High God, who sought us and loved us with an everlasting love and gave us the very best of Himself. Consider what the Psalmist says about God, the Everlasting Father and Creator when he writes:

"Oh, Lord, our Lord, how excellent is thy name in all the earth; who hast set thy glory above the heavens! ... When I consider thy heavens, the work of thy fingers, the moon and the stars, what is man that thou art mindful of him? And the son of man, that thou visitest him? [Psalm 8:1,4].

When we are baptized in the name of the Father, we understand that a Most Holy, unchanging God had an intention of love towards a sinfully depraved, undeserving and unlovable creature - man. When we trace the history of God's dealings with man back to the Garden of Edenthis intentional love and grace are evident. It was His love, grace and mercy that drove our spiritual father and mother out of the garden after they committed sin. Had they eaten of the fruit of the tree of life, sin would have been entombed in our mortal bodies forever. But God drove them from the garden and barred their entry back. Even then. God's intention and perfect plan of redemption was in His mind.

Throughout history, our Father has lovingly sought us with the intention of bringing us back into fellowship with himself. Consider the ways in which God has loved us despite ourselves. He sent forth Abraham, Moses, Joshua, the prophets-Isaiah, Ezekiel, Daniel, and Jeremiah, the judges, the kings, and yet we did not heed the invitation to live as his people. God desires to have fellowship with us. He longs for our worship, praise, and honor. It is for this reason we have been created "that we should be to the praise and glory" of the Father. [Eph. 1:12]. Throughout the entire Old Testament, we see examples of God's love for us and His continuous availability.

The great singer, Roland Haves arranged and interpreted an old Negro spiritual called "Prepare Me One Body." Its haunting refrain beautifully depicts God's tenacious intention towards us:

> "Prepare me one body. I'll go down. I'll go down. Prepare me one body like man's. I'll go down and die!"

equip you with all you need for doing his will. May he produce in you, through the power of Jesus Christ, every good thing that is pleasing to him. All glory to him forever and ever! Amen" (Hebrews 13:20–21,

The writer prays for two things in this benediction. First, he prays that God would "equip" them with all they needed for doing his will. We are never asked to "equip" ourselves. The truth is, we can't "equip" ourselves. The word "equip" is a translation of the Greek word katartidzo. In the Complete Word Study Dictionary katartízo is defined in this fashion; from katá <G2596>, with, and artízo (n.f.), to adjust, fit, finish, from artios <G739>, fit, complete. The fundamental meaning is to put a thing in its appropriate condition, to establish, set up, equip, arrange, prepare, mend.

The purpose for this "equipping" is the "doing of his will." God equips us not for our self-centered ventures, but for the doing of His will. God desires to use us to accomplish His will on earth. We have got it twisted; we think God exists to help us do our will.

The writer also prays that God would "produce in them every good thing that was pleasing to Him." You and I must realize that there will be nothing pleasing to God about our outward works, if He has not first worked in us. In other words, it is what God does on the inside of us that determines whether our outward expressions of service will be pleasing to Him. The means by which this is done is "through the power of Jesus Christ." All that God does for us is "through—by the means of" what He has done for us in Jesus Christ.

The writer does not pray to some institution. He does not pray to some man appointed Saint. He prays to God. The writer gives needed specificity in his identification of the one to whom his prayer is addressed. The God of peace is one to whom he speaks. In the original language, the word "peace" is proceeded by the definite article, "the." The writer is talking to "the God of the peace." The world offers "a peace" but only God offers "the peace." This is the peace that brings reconciliation and restoration. This is the peace that brings completeness to our incompleteness. This is the peace that only God gives. The God, who will give you what you need,

is the God who brought up Jesus from the dead. This is the God who displayed His power.

This Jesus, who was brought up from the dead, is the Great Shepherd of the sheep. The writer prays to the God who has displayed His power and demonstrates His long-term care for us by providing a shepherd not just any shepherd, but the Great Shepherd. This tells us that we are not without protection and provision.

The God of peace, the One who brought up Jesus from the dead, the Jesus, who is the Great Shepherd of the sheep, is the same God, who has ratified an eternal covenant with his blood. This God has provided a permanent solution to our estrangement, our alienation, our brokenness, our hopelessness, our future. He has done this through the blood of Jesus.

This is the God to whom the writer prays. It is this God, who has done all of this for you that will give you everything you need to do His will. It is this God who will work in you what pleases Him, so that what works out of you is pleasing to Him. This is the God who gets the glory. God does not get some of the glory; He gets all the glory. God does not get most of the glory; He gets all the glory.

This glory-giving can't be restricted by the calendar. This giving God the glory cannot be controlled by the clock. This giving God the glory is off the chain of the measured moments of humanity. This giving God the glory is forever. How long is forever? Forever is longer than you can imagine and even longer than that. Forever is where time loses count and dies from exhaustion. Forever is the only way to describe how long it would take us to say thank you for all God has done has for us.

The only sensible thing to say now is Amen! God has spoken, Let the church say Amen. God will do it, let the church say Amen. God will give you what you need, let the church say Amen. God will give you what you need to do His will in 2016, let the church say Amen.
