I Trust God!

Our Witness to the Unchurched

Are the fields white for the harvest? (John 4:35)

There is a growing phenomenon occurring in America today where we are witnessing nearly a whole generation who are unfamiliar with church. This group has been dubbed "The Unchurched." But who are the unchurched? It would not surprise you to learn that a segment of this group includes those who do not attend a Christian Church nor practice religion of any sort. However, it may surprise you to learn that another segment of this group, by necessity, must include Christian cults such as Jehovah's Witnesses and Mormons and those who practice other religions such as Islam, Hinduism, Buddhism and some in Judaism. The common denominator of the unchurched is that they do not accept Jesus for who He truly is. As witnesses for Christ we need have a genuine concern for the lack of knowledge of some and the distortion of knowledge of others regarding Jesus.

How should we live out this genuine concern? Christians must become stronger witnesses. Are you confident enough in the Lord to speak to any person about Jesus? If not, with the help of the Lord, you are more than capable of becoming equipped to stand boldly for Jesus.

- 1. We must read our Bibles daily so that we may develop spiritually.
 - a. Set aside some time each day to spend with God. Look for an opening in your daily schedule where you are able to spend at least one hour with the Lord. Give God priority.
- 2. We must attend our Bible Studies weekly so that we may increase in knowledge and skill.
 - a. Several Bible Study classes and Sunday Church School classes are available. Ask the Lord to lead you as you choose. Practice what

# Writer's Ministry - Deacon's Lesson

Lesson 8: First Place in Our Affections

Scripture: Colossians 3

**Goal:** To embrace and fulfil our covenant relationship with God and one another.

**Objective:** To understand why the church should have the highest place in our affections.

#### Introduction:

First place in our affections is that part of the church covenant that addresses the questions of where our priorities, affections, and loyalties lie. Colossians 3:2 instructs us to set our affections on things above. Can we love Christ and not love the church which He founded (Eph. 1:22-23)? The church is a holy institution and was established by God (Matt. 16:18). It is not to be compared to any other organization and requires our best in regard to our time, talent and resources. Through the church the gospel of salvation is revealed to mankind. The church should receive the highest place in our affection because through it God gives the grace of life. Finally giving the church its proper place in our affections demonstrates our commitment to the Greatest Commandment (Matt 22:37). It is not the church building that we set our love upon, but it is to God that we primarily direct expressions of love with the church sharing the greatest affection above any institution.

# **Lesson Summary:**

"The church is not of human origin and must have the highest place in our affections." "Unlike other institutions, the church was instituted by our Lord. Its origin is in the will of the Father, the sacrifice of the Son, and the power of the Spirit." What characteristics make the church different from all organizations on earth? No other organization has a divine imprint, destiny, or purpose. Because it is centered in the will and purpose

We make a fatal mistake when we treat the church as if it is on the same level as other human institutions. No one can bring anything to gain entrance into the body of Christ-no initiation fees, dues, or qualifications can accomplish it. The only "rite of passage" is through the shed blood of the Lamb of God-Jesus Christ. When we accept Jesus Christ as our personal Savior, we are escorted into the Body of Christ by the Holy Spirit—this is "baptism in the Holy Spirit". Because the church was founded on the finished work of Christ and is directed, sustained and kept by the work of the Holy Spirit, we err when we impose human understanding and restraints on it. The church is the witness of God's response of love and grace towards a sinful and wayward mankind. To adopt and impose the world's ways of governing, accomplishing the work or patterns of living for the church is an affront to a Holy God! Our blueprint for governing, accomplishing God's goals and living together are found in God's Word. This powerful understanding has great implication for both leadership and followership in the church. The church is our place of worship where we gather with expectations of receiving God's blessings to sustain us through our earthly pilgrim journey and into eternity. When we covenant "to give [the church] a place in our affections, prayers, and services above every organization of human origin" we are promising to live our lives (individually and corporately) as God has ordained us to live, to fulfil His purpose and mandates for the church, and to do it HIS WAY!

Wow, could it be that there are options that are beyond our comprehension? Could it be that God sees what we don't see and can do what we can't do?

To trust God requires humbling ourselves to say, "nevertheless, not my will but Your will be done." You and I must recognize that we often cheat ourselves of the greater, better, and more beneficial outcomes to our situations when we fail to trust God. We do this by closing our minds to any solution that is not born in our mind. When we do this, I wonder can this really be called trust. I am not suggesting that we should not bring to God our desires, plans, and hopes. However, in the bringing of our desires, plans, and hopes, we must be willing to yield them to God. Yielding our plans, hopes, and desires to God does not necessarily mean that He will not fulfill them. Yielding our plans, hopes, and desires to God means that we recognize that He is God and He always does what is best. Yielding our plans, hopes, and desires to God means to never end up with less than He plans, hopes, and desires for us.

We often don't trust people when we doubt their intention to do us good. When it comes to God, we should never doubt God's intention to do us good. God has demonstrated his intention on Calvary. God's intention really is his love for us. God has put his love on display because he intends to do us good. In fact, since the beginning of time God has always intended good toward us. We should trust God completely because he not only intends to do us good, he is the only one who can and will do us good all the time. We must trust God without reservation.

I trust God, do you? I trust not only His ability, but also trust His wisdom, His unfailing love for me, His unimpeachable integrity, and His eternal intention to do me good. I trust God, do you? I trust God with my life, my present, my plans, my desires, my hopes, my future, my problems, my circumstances, my doubts and my fears. What about you, what do you trust God with?

'Tis so sweet to trust in Jesus, just to take Him at His word, just to rest upon His promise, just to know, "Thus saith the Lord."

O how sweet to trust in Jesus, just to trust His cleansing blood, just in simple faith to plunge me 'neath the healing, cleansing flood!

Yes, 'tis sweet to trust in Jesus, just from sin and self to cease, just from Jesus simply taking life and rest and joy and peace.

I'm so glad I learned to trust Thee, Precious Jesus, Savior, Friend; and I know that Thou art with me, wilt be with me to the end.

Chorus: Jesus, Jesus, how I trust Him! How I've proved Him o'er and o'er! Jesus, Jesus, precious Jesus! O for grace to trust Him more!

you learn. Once you are able to correctly practice what you have learned you will develop skill as a result.

- 3. We must pray asking for opportunity and courage to share the glorious gospel of Jesus Christ with the unchurched.
  - a. As you grow spiritually and as your knowledge increases you will discover a readiness to lean on the Lord as you have opportunity to share. He will certainly give you the words to speak.

It is quite literally a matter of life or death that we reach the unchurched. The first segment of the unchurched is perhaps the most vulnerable because they are susceptible to the predatory ways of the second segment. We must reach them first. The second segment of the unchurched is perhaps the most difficult because they have been thoroughly deceived by Satan. This is the segment that the majority of Christians try to avoid. Jesus did not avoid Samaria. In doing so He teaches us not to avoid those with whom we have differences. Simply share the Good News.

We must ask ourselves are the fields white for the harvest?


