Prayer in Evangelism

Prayer is one of the greatest and most powerful tools God has given us. When we pray, we are brought to a spiritual level where we are in communion with God. Prayer releases God's presence in our lives and empowers us as we reach out to others. We cannot accomplish what God has committed into our hands unless we make a full use of the resources (including prayer!) that have been made available to us through His Word. Without prayer, your witness will be far less effective and you will be far more susceptible to the foils of the enemy. When you witness, you need the blessing and support of the Lord. Prayer makes this all possible.

Add power to your witness through scripture inspired prayer. Ask God (1) to open their spiritual eyes (2 Corinthians 4:4); (2) to give them ears to hear; (3) to give them a receptive heart (Luke 8:11-15); and (4) to give them faith to believe (Acts 20:21). When you evangelize you plant the seeds of the Gospel, but it is God who causes the growth. In prayer you ask God to give that growth. In prayer you ask God to convict them of their sin and awaken in them the need and desire for salvation. Pray for yourself. Pray for that Holy Spirit boldness, confidence, and conviction to be able to present the Gospel with the compassion and grace demonstrated by Jesus. Prayer is a powerful tool and a vital part of witnessing.

Prayer is not just an indirect tool in evangelism; we can also evangelize by praying for people. Imagine what could happen when you begin to really pray for your friends, neighbors, and family? Imagine how they will feel when you ask them what we can pray for them about? Do you know what a testimony it will be when they receive answers to your prayers?

Jesus prayed and preached the Gospel. It was His habit to wake up before dawn to go to a solitary place to pray (Mark 3:5). He sometimes spent all night in prayer (Luke 6:12). He often separated Himself to be alone with God (Matthew 14:30). Jesus is our example. If Jesus, Son of God, needed to spend so much time in prayer, how much more time do we need to spend with God in prayer?

Prayer is a privilege and a very powerful tool to be used by every Christian. Prayer offers a direct connection to our Lord -- your power source. Prayer is where you meet Him. It is not enough to talk, write, and read about prayer. Quite simply--we just need to PRAY!



Writer's Ministry - Deacon's Lesson

Lesson 20: Participate in Each Other's Joys and Sorrows

Scripture: Philippians 2:1-18

Goal: To embrace and fulfill our covenant relationship with God and one another.

Objective: To understand the importance of participating in each other's joys and sorrows

Church Covenant Segment: "We further engage ... to participate in each other's joy, and with tender sympathy bear one another's burdens and sorrows."

This segment of the covenant charges us to become the earthen vessels through which the joys and sorrows of one another are recognized and embraced. Participating in the joys and sorrows of another reflects sensitivity, care, love, and concern, all of which serves to strengthen the body of Christ. Let us not behave as the Pharisees, who scorned Jesus for the time He spent with the publicans, harlots and sinners. They hated it when sinners came into His presence and found forgiveness, and experienced abundant joy. Love calls us to rise above our resentment, jealousy, covetousness, and anger so that we might be brought to a higher level of fellowship and a deeper dimension of love. It is only through Jesus that we are able to fulfill our responsibility in this area. He is the author and the finisher of our faith who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross. [Hebrews 12:2] The joy He had was once and for all, according to the will of the Father, He offered a sacrifice for sins for every person who would place their trust in Him. Having shared in our lowly estate and paid the ultimate price for our sins, it would bring Jesus joy for us to share in each other's joys and to bear one another's sorrows. The fullness of this joy is related to the unity of believers sharing the same mind and exhibiting the same kind of sacrificial love by serving one another as modeled by Christ Jesus.

"Then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and purpose. Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves." (Philippians 2:2-3, NIV)

Questions 1: Why are we called to participate in the joys of one another and bear one another's burdens and sorrows? What are the benefits?

- •Participating in the joys of one another is God's plan for fellowship that rules out jealousy, covetousness and illwill. For some, participating in the joy of others increases our love and provides opportunity for greater strength and encouragement.
- •We will be better people when we intensify our search for ways to participate in the joys and sorrows of others. Finally, all of you be of one mind, having compassion for one another; love as brothers, be tender hearted, be courteous; not returning evil for evil or reviling for reviling, but on the contrary blessing, knowing that you were called to this, that you may inherit a blessing. (1 Peter 3:8, 9)

Summary: We have been purposed by God to build each other up. This building each other up entails the ability to show forth the love of God as we face the challenges and triumphs of life. Participating in each other's' joys and supporting each other through life's burdens and sorrows is one way in which God develops His compassionate character in us individually and corporately. This reveals God's divine intention to shape us so that we are more and

more like Christ. John 13: 35 tells us "By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another." Indeed, love becomes the witness and identifying mark of those who bear the name, Christian.

Question 2: What are the goals as we participate in the joys and sorrows of others?

- •Our task is to lead brothers and sisters through their sorrows to the joy offered by the Lord for our strength.
- •As we participate in the joys of others we have the opportunity to be encouraged and strengthened.

Since you have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the spirit and sincere love of the brethren love one another fervently with a pure heart. (1 Peter 1:22)

Summary: As members of the body of Christ, we have been placed into a divine fellowship by the Spirit of God. We did not earn our place in the body of Christ. Acceptance of God's gift of grace is the only way we experience this 'koinonia" (fellowship) of the Spirit. Paul writes, "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you". (I Cor. 13: 14). It is God's grace and love that under girds this communion. Grace and love ought to be pervasive as we commune together. Keeping the fellowship of the Spirit means we are participants in everyone's joys and must be supporters in their pain and sorrow. We cannot pick and chose who we love and support. This is an opportunity to experience spiritual growth and demonstrate a love that is no respecter of persons.

Question 3: What is the role of the body of Christ in times of pain, suffering and joy?

- •We are called to be there for one another to offer material and spiritual support.
- •When we pray for others for God to move in difficult situations, we should rejoice when God has answered our prayers.

Until now you have asked nothing in My name. Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full. (John 16:24)

Bear one another's burden and so fulfill the law of Christ. (Galatians 6:2)

Summary: Our response to each other during times of joy, suffering and pain ought to be tangibly demonstrated. In times of sorrow and need, we are to provide the essentials needed to support each other. One of the marks of a vibrant church is that we hold "all things in common" so that everyone has what they need. God utilizes the resources of His church to demonstrate His power to meet needs. When we provide for the material, emotional, and spiritual needs of one another, we mirror God's ability to provide for us and others. The spirit of joy and love we exhibit when we provide for each other ought to flow just as Christ's blood flowed on Calvary in demonstration of God's love for us. In this way we demonstrate a living, vibrant, and compassionate faith!

- 1. In what ways have you participated in the joys of others?
- 2. How have you seen God use pain and sorrow to bring people closer together?

Have you ever felt like your hopes were being crucified? Just as they stripped the clothes of Jesus away, we feel that we have been stripped of our dreams and aspirations in times like these. It is not difficult to understand the behavior of the followers of Jesus that revealed their hopelessness. Hopelessness causes you to hide away out of fear. Many disciples were hiding from the authorities; they were seeking to avoid being arrested. Hopelessness causes you to become dismayed. When we are dismayed we tend to consider the things we have discarded as a possible source of regained hope. The disciples left their fishing businesses to follow Jesus. Now that Jesus was gone and so was their hope, they returned to their fishing boats. They lost hope. Sometimes when we lose hope we find ourselves embalming our yesterdays. The women who were headed to the tomb of Jesus were not looking for a resurrected Jesus. They had lost hope; they were only trying to slow the decay of a crucified hope.

By this time, you might be asking: "what is hope?" Hope is expectation. To "expect" is to see beyond your present situation. It is confidence that is anchored in the future. Hope is not wishful thinking. Hope is not some exercise of the mind. For the believer, it is the location of hope that makes the difference. The location of the believer's hope allows him to see beyond the darkness and see the glimmer of a new sunrise. The followers of Jesus could not see beyond crucifixion. They could not see because they had a limited view of Jesus. They lost their confidence because their hope was anchored in the things of this world and not in the truth that Jesus taught. Jesus taught them that His kingdom was not of this world. Because of the lack of anchoring they were easily blown off course by the winds of disappointment.

We have an advantage over the disciples; we can flip a few pages in our bibles and read about the resurrection. We know how the story is going to end. We know that the stone of buried dreams was rolled away. We know that the dead body of crucified hope is now risen and alive. We have the record to give us more reason not to lose our hope. Our hope is in the truth of who Jesus is. Our hope is in the truth that Jesus did get up from the grave conquering death. The hope we have is anchored in heaven, the place where Jesus sits at the right hand of the Father making intercession for us. The hope we have gives us confidence in spite of our present situation because we know how the story ends. If your hope is located in Jesus Christ you have every reason to maintain your hope in these dark times. Let us join the hymn writer who says:

> My hope is built on nothing less than Jesus' blood and righteousness; I dare not trust the sweetest frame, but wholly lean on Jesus' name. When darkness veils His lovely face, I rest on His unchanging grace; in ev'ry high and stormy gale my anchor holds within the veil. His oath, His covenant, His blood support me in the whelming flood; when all around my soul gives way, He then is all my hope and stay. When He shall come with trumpet sound. O may I then in Him be found. dressed in His righteousness alone, faultless to stand before the throne.

Refrain: On Christ, the solid Rock, I stand—all other ground is sinking sand; all other ground is sinking sand.








Young Adult Ministry Partners with H.O.P.E. to Provide Ministry to our Community
