



## Jesus is the Reason for the Season

Luke 2: 9-10 Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to vou: He is Christ the Lord.

It was a supernatural beginning, it was a miraculous birth, and it was a sign of divinity. The Holy Spirit spoke to Mary in Luke 1:31 "You will be with child and give birth to a son and you are to give Him the name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High; vs33 ...His Kingdom will never end. The Holy Spirit also spoke to Joseph and told him in Matthew 1:21 "She shall bring forth a son, and thou shall call His name Jesus: for He shall save His people from their sins. vs23 ... and they will call Him Immanuel which means "God with us". Christmas is a Holy Day, a day for the Church (body of Christ) to commemorate the Birth of Jesus - The Messiah - The Anointed One.

## Forgiving One Another

LESSON SCRIPTURE: "Be ye kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you". [Ephesians 4:32, King James Version]

"And become useful, helpful, and kind to one another, tenderhearted (compassionate, understanding, loving hearted), forgiving one another (readily and freely), as God in Christ forgave you." [Ephesians 4:32, Amplified Bible]

**GOAL:** To grasp an understanding of true forgiveness and to practice it in our lives.

**OBJECTIVE:** Demonstrate and apply true forgiveness in daily Christian relationships.

This lesson on forgiving one another will be presented in two parts. Today's lesson will focus on the Christian necessity of forgiveness and what it is. Next month's lesson will highlight our volitional responsibility: choose to forgive and how to forgive.

#### **ESSENTIAL INSIGHT/ QUESTION:**

Human nature often compels and drives us to "teach people a lesson" or seek revenge as a way of getting back for a "wrong" or hurt we have experienced, but it never works. Jesus offers a better solution. There should be no revenge or getting back at another. He suggests simply that we become the "shock absorbers" of this world in that we exhibit humility, patience, and kindness towards others who wrong us. What practical steps of faith should Christians take to become "shock absorbers" for true forgiveness?

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

Time: About 60 - 64 A.D. Place: Rome

Our Scripture passage of study is from Ephesians. Ephesians is one of the seven prison epistles written by Paul who was incarcerated in Rome. Tychicus delivered this epistle along with other letters to Philemon and the churches of Collosia and Philippi.

Paul founded the church in Ephesus during his second missionary journey. He assigned Priscilla and Aquila whom he had met in Corinth to teach the Gospel. Later the Church was strengthened and firmly established by Paul during his third missionary journey where he pastored three years. Upon Paul's departure, Timothy headed the Church for about eighteen months. Timothy was constantly in conflict with the false teachers that erupted in the Church. Their ungodly teachings resulted in harmful disputes rather than faith building interpretations.

In chapter four of Ephesians, Paul tells of God's plan for faithful living. Christ endows and builds the Church and gives God's pattern and principles for Church members. Ephesians 4:32 deals specifically with forgiveness.

#### **LESSON INTRODUCTION:**

The church may not be benefiting from the full potential of its members because of tense relationships. The word of God is replete with exhortations to forgive. It is taught in the Gospels (Matthew 6:14-15, 18:35; Mark 11:25. Jesus referenced it in the Model Prayer; "Forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors." Subsequently, He became the supreme example of forgiveness. God Himself, in the person of Jesus Christ, hung on a cross, bled, suffered, and died in our place to forgive us of our sins. Though He had never sinned, He took on Himself the penalty for our sins. He forgave us and He asked His Father to forgive those who crucified Him. In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace (Ephesians 1:7). Since Christ has done this, as believers who have received God's forgiveness, we are compelled to forgive one another.

The scriptural passage in Ephesians 4:32 is the first mention of "forgive one another" relative to Christians in the church. The law of first mention in

a passage indicates that we will find out what God originally intended and communicated concerning that idea. The lesson to follow is to shed light on what Paul meant.

Forgiveness is a key biblical concept. Exactly what is forgiveness and how does it play out in Ephesians 4:32? Listed below are several definitions of key words found in Ephesians 4:32.

#### DEFINITIONS

Forgiveness Defined: Forgiveness is choosing to pardon, remit, or overlook the mistake, fault, offense, hurt or injury of the offender without demanding a penalty, punishment or retribution.3

A definition for forgiveness could be -- giving up my right to hurt you, for hurting me.

Forgive, charizomai,, (khar-id´-zom-ahee), 5483, "to show a favor unconditionally", is used of the act of "forgiveness," whether divine, Ephesians 4:32; Col. 2:13, 3:13; or human, Luke 7:42, 43 (debt) 2 Corinthians 2:7, 10; 12:13; Eph. 4:32 (1st mention).

Kind, chrestos, (khrase-tos) (5543) serviceable, good, pleasant" (of things), "good, gracious, kind" (of persons), is translated "kind" in Luke 6:35, of God: in Eph. 4:32, enjoined upon believers.

Tenderhearted, eusplanchnos (yoo´-splangkh-nos) (2155), "compassionate, tenderhearted," lit, "of good heartedness" (eu, "well," and splanchnon), is translated "tenderhearted" in Ephesians 4:32.

#### God's Standard for Forgiveness

Scriptures: Luke 23:34, Matthew 6:12, 14-15 and Roman 5:8

It is God who initiated His relationship with us as believers. In the beginning, in the Garden of Eden when Adam sinned, God had already made a provision through His Son Jesus Christ to reconcile us back to Him. Jesus sacrificial death on the cross was sufficient for God to forgive us of all of our sins. Romans 5:8 states "But God commended His love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us".

God forgives us in Christ and mandates us to forgive others. When we forgive one another, God grants us a renewed strength and inner peace that passes all understanding. Christ sets the standard and we must strive to be like Him. He is our perfect example.

Even while Christ was being crucified on the cross, He cried out "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34). The Lord's Prayer states, "Forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors (Matthew 6: 12). When we forgive others of their sins or trespasses, God also forgives us; but when we do not forgive others of their sins and trespasses, God will not forgive us of our sins and trespasses (Matthew 6:14-15). This does not indicate that God withholds the justification from believers that are in Christ. We are still pardoned from the penalty and guilt of sin. God does admonish and chasten us to encourage us to forgive. As Lewis B. Smedes argues in Forgive and Forget, "When you release the wrongdoer from the wrong, you cut a malignant tumor out of your inner life. You set a prisoner free, but you discover that the real prisoner was yourself." Research has shown that high levels of forgiveness correlate with better health habits, lower anxiety, lower anger, lower depression, and more task coping behavior.

As believers who experience love, kindness, tenderheartedness, compassion and forgiveness from God through His Son Jesus Christ, we should reciprocate and live out these virtues as we receive new freedom through the act of forgiveness. Then and only then, can we be one with Christ as He is one with the Father. Forgiveness paves the way for treating others with kindness, love, and compassion out of a tender heart. We become serviceable for the Lord. What spiritual growth the church could experience if she were a unified body forgiving and loving one another!

would have no option of eternal life with Him, if He had not intervened. Without God's intervention, you and I would still be traveling at a deadly speed down a one-way street to eternal damnation.

Even the name Jesus has interventional meaning and purpose. Joseph was told to "call His name Jesus for He shall save His people from their sins." The name Jesus is the Greek version of the Hebrew name Joshua which means Jehovah is salvation. Jesus has come to save, to deliver, and to rescue us from the awful deserved penalty of our sins. Only God could do this. We had not the power, nor did we know of anyone who could free us from this life-taking, death-producing entanglement called sin. Guilt-ridden pride kept us from reaching out to God, but God's love caused Him to reach out to us. Jesus expressed this when He said to Nicodemus: "For God loved the world so much that He gave His one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish but have eternal life. God sent His Son into the world not to judge the world, but to save the world through Him." (John 3:16–17, NLT)

The sobering thought of this verse is that this giving of Jesus includes His dying for us on Calvary. The baby in the manger was born to die as a propitiation for our sins. Jesus came to clear the debt we owed to God due to our sins. He did this by laying down his life on the cross that you and I might have life. Jesus did die on the cross, but God raised Him on that Sunday for our justification. This means that the work of Jesus completely remedies our corrupt situation. Jesus is our salvation!

To appropriate the benefits of this divine intervention requires more than an affected emotional response at the site of a nativity scene, it requires believing. To believe according to Vine's Dictionary means: "to be persuaded of, and hence, to place confidence in, to trust, signifies, in this sense of the word, reliance upon, not mere credence". In other words, it takes more than intellectual and emotional acknowledgement of the truth of the existence of Jesus, it takes trust, total confidence, and complete reliance upon the purpose and power of Jesus to save us from our sins.

When we take all that God is doing through the coming of Jesus, we should have something far greater than sentimentality during this season of the year. This season calls for reverent but ecstatic joy. This is articulated in words of the well-known Christmas carol "Joy to the World" by Isaac Watts. Mr. Watts says it like this:

> Joy to the world! The Lord is come! Let earth receive her King; let every heart prepare Him room, and heaven and nature sing.

Joy to the earth the Savior reigns. Let men their songs employ, while fields and floods, rocks, hills and plains repeat the sounding joy.

No more let sins and sorrows grow, nor thorns infest the ground; He comes to make His blessings flow far as the curse is found.

He rules the world with truth and grace, and makes the nations prove the glories of His righteousness and wonders of His love.

May you have reverent ecstatic joy as you reflect upon the reason for the season.
