

Sharing the Love of Christ

"But thanks be to God, who always leads us as captives in Christ's triumphal procession and uses us to spread the aroma of the knowledge of him everywhere. For we are to God the pleasing aroma of Christ among those who are being saved and those who are perishing..." (2 Corinthians 2:14-15).

The woman who wet Jesus' feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair poured perfume on His feet. Jesus says that because of her great love for him she has performed this great act of worship for him. In fact, Christ has also forgiven us our many sins. Because of this we also have a great love for him, and hopefully we too want to express our love for him. While we can't fill the house with a physical aroma like this woman did. Often the spiritual state of a person or a group of people in Scripture is referred to with reference to the sense of smell. We can express our love for Christ by offering up a spiritual sweet aroma to Christ. In fact, our entire lives can be a sweet aroma to God.

The first way we can be a sweet aroma to God is repentance and cleansing from sin. Ungodliness is a stench in the nostrils of God. Genesis 19:13 says "For we will destroy the city completely. The stench of the place has reached the LORD, and he has sent us to destroy it." Here the angel is speaking to Lot about the sin of Sodom.

The same savior is preached to all by the messengers of the Gospel. To some it is fatal; to others it is life giving. Paul's testimony is that he does not, like many false teachers corrupt the word of God. Follow God's example, therefore, as dearly loved children and walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God. (Ephesians 5:2)

Once we have a relationship with God by confessing our sins and accepting Jesus Christ as our personal Savior, then wherever we go, He uses us to tell others about Him and to spread the Good News like a sweet aroma. Our lives are a sweet fragrance presented by Christ to God. We don't have to pour out the whole bottle of sweet aroma at one time. We can squirt some here and there as we go through life. A "God bless you." A "Have a good day." A "Praise the Lord." A "God be with you." A friendly smile. They can all be a sweet aroma right where you are. Your sweet aroma may prompt someone to ask you why do you have the hope that you have? Be ready to lovingly share the Gospel of Jesus Christ in a natural unscripted way.





Partnership in the Gospel

Goal:

To learn what true community is and to practice biblical Koinonia.

Objective:

To experience Koinonia through Partnership in the Gospel based on biblical principles with others who share a common life in Jesus Christ.

Scripture:

"I thank God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now." (Philippians 1:3-5

Previous lessons have dealt with Koinonia when translated from the original language as fellowship with one another within the body of Christ. This month's lesson will focus on Koinonia when translated, from the Greek, as partnership. When we build up and enjoy one another, we are in fellowship, but when we join together to spread the gospel, we are in partnership. In the latter, our objectives are focused outside of ourselves on those who need to be brought into the fellowship of God's people.

Today's lesson centers on gaining a perspective on how to become actively involved in partnership in the spread of the gospel throughout the world by providing ministerial support. The great commission given by Jesus tells us, "Go ye therefore and teach all nations baptizing them in the Name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Ghost...." – Matthew 28:20. This biblical mandate is fulfilled through the practice of partnership in the gospel. We are all called to spread the gospel, but for practical reasons the majority of us are limited to the geography in our local areas.

Our partnership in the gospel, once clearly understood ought to inspire us to become actively involved in the spread of the gospel by means of fervent prayer and financial contributions. Paul's letter to the Philippians gives us a biblical model to follow and value as partners in the gospel. "He considered his dear friends in Philippi to be actively engaged in partnership with him in the spreading of the gospel to other cities, even though most of them never left Philippi."3 In a similar way, we can become actively engaged with the body of Christ to fulfill the great commission.

There are two significant ways that everyone can be partners in the gospel. Paul first acknowledged the Philippian church and thanked God for them in his prayers for their partnership in the gospel from the very beginning of his ministry up to the end. They entered into partnership with Paul by making material and financial contributions. Their partnership with Paul allowed for the spread of the gospel to cities that lie far beyond them. We can do likewise, even from the comfort of our homes.

The second way believers can practice partnership in the gospel is through regular and meaningful prayer for those who are called to go and spread the gospel throughout the world. There are members within and outside of our own church body who travel regularly to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ. Then, there are others who are called to do active missionary work not only locally, but also abroad. We, too, must be willing to put in quality time and go out as fishermen among men even within our own workplace

and communities. As a result, when we as a community of believers truly apply the principles of Koinonia, this should compel us to increase the body of Christ and to grow in spiritual fellowship with one another.

For they gave according to their means, as I can testify, and beyond their means of their own accord begging us earnestly for the favor of taking part in the relief of the saints. (2 Corinthians 8:3-4)

Partnership in Giving

Paul acknowledged the Philippian Church for their financial support from Philippi throughout his letter. "Every Christian today has the same privilege of being a partner in the gospel enterprise. Each of us has the opportunity to practice partnership with various ministries by our prayers and/or financial support far beyond our personal physical endeavors, both in cities at home and in countries overseas." Claiming our Jerusalem, the Autumn Fellowship, Hope Ministry, and CRU are some of our opportunities to engage in a gospel partnership effort that all of us at Tabernacle can support; physically, financially, and/ or through prayers.

Partnership in Prayer

The Philippians not only gave, they prayed for Paul, so should we regularly pray for ministries and missions in their spread of the gospel message. Prayer unifies us with other active participants to fulfill God's work as we seek Him to fulfill His purpose in us and in others. Paul relied on and gratefully acknowledged their prayers and monetary gifts. Not only did their partnership benefit his missionary efforts, but also, it helps us learn from this model. We can feel encouraged and inspired to become involved in a much needed and powerful way to be active partners in the spread of the gospel throughout the world with our prayers and monetary gifts.

Point to Ponder:

What ministries within Tabernacle can you partner with through prayer, financial support, or even join to facilitate the spread of the gospel of salvation to others?

Helpful Scripture Passages:

Mark 16:15, 1 Thessalonians 5:25, Matthew 9:38; 2 Thessalonians 3:1-2

Closing Prayer:

Father, as the Philippian Church, we desire to have a partnership in the gospel with fellow believers who spread the gospel. We pray that as a church, we will begin to work or continue working to spread the gospel beyond the walls of our church. Help us to extend monetary gifts and prayers to support ministry workers and those who need salvation. Our contributions serve to help bring unbelievers into fellowship with God and His people. When we cannot physically go, let us be of a mind to financially support ministries both at home and in other countries as Christ commands us, particularly those of our own household of faith. We know our prayers are powerful so we pray for our church, its endeavors, and missionaries in other countries who are separated from family, friends, and from the safety of this country. In Jesus Name we pray! Amen.

disciple at all. We are called to think about what God has done for us. A true disciple must not be guilty of selective amnesia. A disciple must not lose sight of what God has done for him. God could have left us to ourselves, but He extended mercy to us. The mercy that God extends to us is so great that Paul expresses a plurality of mercies. Paul calls us to reflect upon all that God has done to save us. This reflection should motivate us to do the only thing that would be reasonable. The only reasonable thing to do was to present what we were about to lose forever to the One who saved us from such a horrible plight. The only thing that makes sense is to give God the totality of ourselves as an offering of gratitude.

We are called to think about how we are fashioning our lives. Paul challenges us to think about what we are allowing to shape us. Far too many of us are permitting the world to squeeze us into its design. Paul calls this conformity. This conformity easily happens to nonthinking disciples. Non-thinking disciples go along to get along. They find themselves, without thinking, modeling their lives after the paradigm of this world. The disciple is to allow no longer the world to shape them but freely yield to the transforming work of the Holy Spirit. This transforming work is nothing short of a metamorphosis. It is a change that comes from the inside that creates a whole new sense of being and demeanor on the outside. The scripture says this metamorphosis takes place through the renewing of our minds. Non-thinking disciples feel that there is nothing wrong with their minds. However, when you think about it, the thing that impedes our spiritual growth and development the most is a mind that has not been renewed. A renewed mind is a mind that has been realigned by the Holy Spirit with the mind of God. It is only the renewed mind that will know what it takes to please God.

Disciples are called to think soberly about themselves. Too many of us are guilty of either marking ourselves up without a sanctified cause or marking ourselves down without a sanctified cause. We are to realize that whatever we are that is of any value is solely due to God and not to ourselves. Whatever we have going for us is a result of God's grace upon our lives. We must not claim credit for what God has done and we must not discount what God has done, we must think soberly about ourselves. Thinking soberly about ourselves would eliminate the unholy attitude of superiority among us. It would prevent us from thinking that we are better than each other. Thinking soberly about ourselves would also dismiss the isolating position of inferiority among us. It is an affront to God to discount and count as less than the

grace God has bestowed upon your life.

As disciples, we are to think about who we are to others and who others are to us. God in His wise design has made us interdependent. God has not designed us to operate with each other. The church has become infected with the worldly virus of individualism. This virus renders the body ineffective. It highlights the individual parts at the expense of the whole. The world we live in encourages us to compete with each other and teaches us nothing about being a complement for each other. This disease of individualism has infected our churches and our denominational work. We are here for the benefit of each other. The Divine wisdom of mutual reliance runs counter to the isolationist, autonomous attitude that says -- "leave me alone." God created interdependence. Without interdependence, the body would never function properly. The same is true for the church locally and at large.

We must think about the unique contribution God has designed us to make for the benefit of the body. We must not seek to bring sameness where God has designed uniqueness. Every disciple has his Godgiven role to play. What an insult to the creative mind of God to be created with originality and then choose to live our whole life trying to be an unauthorized copy of somebody else. Just be who God made you be and with His blessing let that be your contribution for the good of the body.

Hezekiah Walker also helps us:

I need you; you need me. We're all a part of God's body. Stand with me, agree with me. We're all a part of God's body.

It is his will that every need be supplied. You are important to me; I need you to survive. You are important to me; I need you to survive.

I pray for you; You pray for me.
I love you; I need you to survive.
I won't harm you with words from my mouth.
I love you; I need you to survive.


