

An Exhilarating Compliance

As we continue to count our blessings during this Centennial Year, we are reminded that believers in Christ have more than just a feeling of satisfaction when getting things done. You might say that simple satisfaction is not sufficiently satisfactory.

From childhood to adulthood, most of us have experienced satisfaction to some degree after getting something done which was requested or required. Getting the dishes done before mother returns from choir rehearsal; scrubbing the floor before daddy returns from the barber shop; cutting the grass before going to baseball practice; completing the supervisor's assignment before the deadline; getting home from the party before midnight (even at 11:55 pm); receiving more B's than C's as expected by grandma, even though skimpily and rarely rewarded by grandpa, are not to be belittled. It is well to be pleased to some degree with such accomplishments.

But for true believers, there is more.

Since 1920, members of the Christian fellowship now called Tabernacle Missionary Baptist Church have engaged in functions not only authorized but mandated by Christ. These members have derived pleasures much greater than

TMBC members have witnessed for Christ around the neighborhood of the original church facility on the Eastside of Detroit, on Woodrow Street on the Westside of Detroit, the later church house on Beechwood Avenue and now, around the present church facility on West Grand Boulevard. If you have not yet experienced this exhilaration of compliance, be like so many others in the Tabernacle Missionary Baptist Church. Make yourself available. The power is already available. Comply now and be exceedingly glad about it. To God be the glory!

Unity and One Accord for Kingdom Purposes (1 Cor. 1:10)

"Now I plead with you, brethren, by the name of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, that you all speak the same thing, and that there are no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly joined together in the same mind in the same judgment" (1 Cor. 1:10, NKJV).

In the world we live in today, there appears to be great division. In our government, we have Democrats and Republicans who are consistently divided on which direction the country should proceed. Our local church should be different. We must first know and believe the true doctrine of God's Word. After gaining understanding, it is our duty to commit to gathering on one accord as a unified body.

We should not eliminate diversity, but instead have unity of all parts like a guilt with various colors and patterns, blended together as a whole (Bible Knowledge Commentary). Even in the midst of diversity, having single-minded Christian purposes, agreement on essentials of the faith and the Gospel, and harmony in relationships and attitudes would allow us to be more perfectly joined together to benefit the church and please God (1 Cor. 1:10).

In 1 Corinthians 1:10, Paul writes to correct the disunity that occurs when the disciples identify their ministry purpose through one of the prominent Christian leaders instead of Christ. Paul leaves no doubt as to the one he believed should be the focus of Corinthian unity. That is Jesus Christ. We must fully fix and center our focus on Christ.

Paul pleaded for an outward expression that comes from an inward spirit. He encouraged the Corinthians to speak the same thing and allow for "no divisions among you," and be perfectly joined together. There is a difference between having opposing viewpoints and being divisive. Believers can work together harmoniously if they agree on what truly matters - Jesus Christ as Lord of all.

In the book of Acts, the early church gathered together in the upper room tarrying as Jesus instructed. They continued with one accord in prayer and supplication after the ascension of Jesus. United with one mind and purpose devoted to prayer, God sent the Holy Spirit as promised. (Acts 1:14;2:1-21). February's centennial prayer focus for Tabernacle is that we will be in unity and on one accord for kingdom purposes.

What are some kingdom purposes? Our church mission statement is a very good example. It is listed as follows:

Exalt the Savior through worship and prayer.

Expound the scriptures through biblical preaching and teaching.

Embrace the saved through membership and fellowship.

Evangelize the sinner through the sharing of the good news empowered by the Holy Spirit.

Encourage the struggling through ministry for the whole family.

Equip the saints through Christian education and discipleship for the work of the ministry.

Prayer: Father God, please help the members of our church to talk and behave in a way that will reduce arguments and divisions, while increasing harmony and fellowship. Create in us the unity of purpose that advances the Kingdom of Our God and Christ. Hear our prayer. Amen.



The Grace that I speak of is the grace of our salvation. This grace **Redeems** us. It has paid in full the price for the penalty of our sin. This grace **Rescues** us. It snatches and delivers us from eternal damnation. You and I were doomed to die without God and suffer eternally, but God's grace rescued us. This grace **Revitalizes** us. It is grace that gives us life in exchange for the deadness of our previous existence. This deadness made us insensitive to the things of God, but grace brings back our sensitivity, our responsiveness to God. This grace **Restores** us. It fixes the most important relationship that any man, woman or child can have, that is our relationship with God. This grace **Redirects** us. Because of God's grace you and I now have a new purpose in life. We have been created in Christ for good works. This grace **Refocuses** us. We now have something to look forward to, because of grace we now have hope.

The amazing paradox of grace is that it is free but costly. A great price had to be paid because a debt was made. Our sin, our rebellion toward God made us debtors and we had nothing in our possession to clear the debt. Our works, though many, are inadequate. Our wealth, though much, is insufficient. It took something that was beyond the vast holdings of this earth, it took the sacrifice of the Only Begotten Son of God. He gave His life to pay our debt and grant us what we don't deserve and that is God's Grace! Truly the hymn writer is right: Jesus Paid it All! Yes, I am blown away by God's Grace. I join with John Newton and declare:

Amazing grace—how sweet the sound— that saved a wretch like me!

I once was lost but now am found, was blind but now I see.

'Twas grace that taught my heart to fear, and grace my fears relieved; how precious did that grace appear the hour I first believed!

Thru many dangers, toils and snares I have already come; 'tis grace hath brought me safe thus far, and grace will lead me home.

The Lord has promised good to me; His word my hope secures; He will my shield and portion be as long as life endures.

When we've been there ten thousand years, bright shining as the sun, we've no less days to sing God's praise than when we'd first begun.


