### **Definitions:**

- **Discretion:** Prudence, or knowledge and prudence; that discernment which enables a person to judge critically of what is correct and proper, united with caution; (Proverbs 2:11)
- **Knowledge:** Is referring to the knowledge of God. God has perfect knowledge of all His works. (Proverbs 2:10)
- **Knowledge and Understanding:** Refers to having the understanding of how to apply the knowledge or the wisdom of God in your life. (Proverbs 2:2,3,5,10)
- **Wicked:** Evil in principle or practice; deviating from the divine law; In Scripture, persons who live in sin; transgressors of the divine law; all who are unreconciled to God, unsanctified or impenitent. (Proverbs 2:22)
