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Count It All Joy!

How are we to deal with the plethora of challenges that life brings to us? How do we keep our heads up in times like these? James 1:2-4 gives us clear instructions concerning this matter. **James 1:2-4 (NKJV)** "My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience. But let patience have *its* perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing." The following article is an excerpt from a bible study I shared some time ago on these verses.

The word "count" used in this verse is *hegeomai* in the Greek. This word means to consider, to esteem, to value, to regard. All these meanings strongly suggest the process of thinking-through, exercising the intellect. James' use of this word orders us to use our heads concerning our problems before we use our hearts. In other words, before we go off the deep end of emotionalism, we should engage our minds that have been sanctified by our relationship with the Lord. This sanctified intellectual evaluation of our situations causes us to "regard them as all joy." James is not commanding us to embrace some first century brand the non-biblical, modern day vain practice of "positive confession." Nor is James setting before us the hypocritical posture of a Stoic, who merely paints on a smile on the face, denying the reality that exists. No, James is challenging you and I to apply our minds that have been enlightened by the truth of the Word of God and see our state of affairs as an opportunity for God to do something that only God can do with our state of affairs. James does not say "count it as enjoyment" but "count it all joy." James knows very well that enjoyment is predicated upon something being good to you in the immediate

A Witness at the Crossroads of Time

It is an understatement to say that our nation is at a critical juncture in its history. While still in the throes of a worldwide pandemic, we once again find ourselves dealing with the issue of division and conflict manifested in events of inhumane violence. It seems appropriate to quote the words of a man who was himself a victim of savage brutality by law enforcement on March 3, 1991: "People, I just want to say, you know, can we all get along? Can we get along?"

What will it take for our nation to resolve and reconcile racial, political and economic divisions that are all rooted in the inability and unwillingness of human beings to see other human beings as sacred – worthy of deepest respect, honor, love? Indeed, most are completely unable to see themselves as sacred, let alone their perceived adversaries and enemies.

How long can our nation last with this affliction that has been present since its birth – since the beginning of time? Not much longer. There has been too much bloodshed. Political movements, legislative reforms, economic plans have all been tried and have temporarily helped mitigate some symptoms of this disease from time to time. But the disease itself has not been eradicated. There is no human cure. The diagnosis is this: The nation's affliction is terminal and we need to take some action.

Nonetheless, the Great Physician has been revealed with the necessary cure and the desperately needed healing. Why are we - who know the Truth - keeping it a secret? Why are we not sharing it wherever we can? Has our compassion grown cold? Has our vision grown dim? Have we forgotten our calling, our [Great] commission and our purpose? Have we forgotten our first love?

Now is the time for the church to be what she was sent to be. She must step up before the victim she was sent to witness and minister to dies. We must repent from our hiding and our aimless trivial pursuits disguised as religious activity. We must humble ourselves and come to the Almighty in unified prayer as He has commanded us (2 Chronicles 7:14). We must ask Him for the Spiritual power, wisdom, courage, passion and compassion to witness to this nearly dead nation and then to the rest of the world. We must finally obey Him (Matthew 28:18-20).

Time – is – running – out....

July Writer's Ministry Lesson

There seems to be so much confusion in the world today. How does the church survive in such a chaotic society? We are in the midst of a pandemic (COVID-19), unemployment rates have skyrocketed, and we have witnessed people of color experience blatant social injustices. However, we must continue to believe that the Church is essential. It is the foundation that has stood the test of time especially in the Black Community. Most of all, Christ is the head of the Church, He controls every part of it and gives life and direction. There is nothing too difficult for our God (see Genesis 18:14).

As humans, we tend to panic when we feel that we don't have everything we need. This panic can cause us to not trust God and take matters into our own hands, instead of praying to God. On the other hand, when we feel that we have everything we need, it creates a feeling of security and calmness in us. Remember Abraham and Sarah were way past the age of child bearing. Even though they took things into their own hands, God faithfully delivered them a son, just as He promised.

Currently, we are unable to congregate but we have seen that our giving is stable and we are receiving donations from non-members who are hearing the Word virtually. We were awarded a grant (PPP) that has enabled our staff to continue working and no one has been laid off. In addition, all or most of our ministries are still functional. For example, Autumn Fellowship is still providing and delivering food to those in need. What does all of this say about our Lord and Savior? That He is loving, faithful and true to His Word. He is Jehovah Jireh, the Lord our God who looks ahead and sees our need and provides even from unexpected sources. He will never leave us nor forsake us (Hebrew 13:5).

Have you ever wondered how God desires you to respond to life's circumstances? Does He want you to be in a state of panic and stress, or does He enjoy it when you feel a sense of security and calmness rooted in Him? If you guessed the latter, you are absolutely correct! In fact, when we rest in the truth of Philippians 4:19, we can feel safe and secure, because we know that God loves us and cares for us. Therefore, every need we have will be met by God! So, the next time you feel panicky about a situation in life, remember that we serve a God who provides ALL we need!

*Look at the birds of the air, do they not sow, nor reap nor gather in barns,
and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not worth much more than they? (Matthew 6:26)*

In the meantime, pray that God will grant all the needed resources to sustain the church and to build the body of Christ and continue to give to the poor and hungry. Needed resources include not only financial, but also spiritual, and human resources (meaning Christian laborers to serve). We need spiritual discipline, wisdom, knowledge, and understanding to evangelize and build up the body of Christ. We need the spiritual motivation, stamina, perseverance, and commitment to give and minister to the poor and hungry. God is able to grant all of these things and more; exceedingly abundantly above all that we can ask or think (Ephesians 3:20).

Prayer:

Oh Lord, we thank You for all of Your promises to us. We thank You for all You are allowing us to accomplish in this Pandemic. Lord, forgive us for the times we find ourselves not motivated, feeling sorry for ourselves. Forgive us when we aren't reaching out to see what we can do to support others in this peculiar time in our lives. Lord we come to You humbly asking that You continue to bless us with the finances to continue to care for the poor, hungry, and hurt. Lord, bless us with spiritual discipline, wisdom, knowledge, and understanding to enable us to continue the work to build up the body of Christ. Lord, we need motivation and perseverance to continue the work You have for us. You are our God who will supply all of our needs. In the Name of Jesus Christ, we pray. Amen.

sense, but to “count it all joy” employs a reasoning that looks beyond the immediate and gets a glimpse of the long-term benefit. James is calling us to a higher level of thinking concerning what may be our plight in life and seek to know the difference between what is simply “good to you” and what is ultimately “good for you.”

This process of “counting it all joy” is an any time circumstance. It is to be done “whenever you fall in various trials.” Contrary to the false doctrine that teaches people who come to Christ that you will have no problems, James sets the record straight. Life is problematic overall; and it is especially problematic for the believer. James did not state a possibility or probability but a certainty. He does not use the word “if,” he uses the word “when.” Trouble will certainly come, but the only question is “when.” The failure to accept this reality has caused many Christians to be knocked off their feet when trouble shows up. The nature of this trouble is that is not monochromatic but multicolored. James is commanding us to come to a definitive decision to esteem it all joy whenever we find ourselves surrounded by trials no matter what type of trial it may be.

We must realize that God never allows us to go through trials without a purpose. One challenge we have when we are in the midst of our trials is the challenge to remember. We often suffer from temporary amnesia when we are going through trying times. If we fail to regard properly our circumstances, we will allow them to cause us to suffer a mental block concerning what we know from our experience with God. How many times do we have to be reminded about what we know? James says to us that we already know what God is up to. The problem is that most of the time we do not like what God is up to.

God seeks to refine our faith. The word faith here is used subjectively. It deals with our quality of confidence in the Lord Jesus Christ. Because God is omniscient, He knows that our faith in Him needs refining. Some of us still have the dross of our old lifestyles in us. Others of us have mixed into our faith non-biblical ideas that have left us with a faith that is an alloy. The problem with both situations is that whatever is present under these conditions lessens the quality of our faith. God allows trials to come into our lives to serve as a refining agent to melt away the dross and break up the unauthorized additives of our lives. You and I must admit that there were and are some things that God had to and yet has to burn away from us. He loves us so much that He is willing to do whatever it takes to cause us to come forth as pure gold.

It is also God’s intent to make us resolute Christians. James knows that the quality of our faith determines our level of patience. The word “*hupomne*” is the word for patience used here. This word means to stay under the load. God gets the glory when we have become like tempered steel that is able, due the tempering process, to withstand the pressures of life. God uses our trials to give height to our stress, quitting and breaking threshold. We come through our trials able to take more than we were able to take before we went through our trials.

We must realize that God is not in the business of violating our volition. He does not force us to do anything against our will. Therefore, we must yield ourselves to Him and what He wants to do with us. It is our refusal to give over to God that keeps us from experiencing the many things God has for us. You and I always have the option of giving up in any situation. God does not take that away from us. We must stay under the load of circumstances until God has brought us to His desired end in the matter.

The phrase “entire and lacking nothing” has to do with completion, wholeness, integrity. James is telling us that if we allow the Lord to have His way with us we will have spiritual integrity. There will be no gap between our profession of faith and expression of faith. There will no break between our talk and our walk. There will be no separation between our orthodoxy and our orthopraxy. In other words, our living will line up with our saying. There will no shame in our game. We will have it together. We will be able to handle life instead of having life handle us.

Media Ministry

An intimate Introduction to the Media Ministry of Tabernacle Missionary Baptist Church

While many members never have to interact with the Media team of Tabernacle, there is rarely a time when they are not actively present in your worship, study, banquet, group, or fun family event.

The Media Ministry is made up of a few deeply dedicated Christian sisters and brothers who answered the call to this special ministry. You may wonder what is so special about the Media Ministry? Well, we're glad you asked.

To be a member of the Media Ministry means that you understand the role "media" plays in promoting the Gospel of Jesus Christ. You believe that God will use your gifts, talents, and skillset to fulfill His will that all people will have an opportunity to hear the gospel and be saved.

You are willing to accept the sacrifices that come with being a member of this team. What sacrifices? You really do ask the best questions. Let me explain. Members of the Media Ministry sacrifice time with their families to prepare for and to be present at each and every event that takes place in the life of our church.

Whether it happens early in the morning, in the middle of the day, or later in the evening, the Media Ministry is present. We prepare the spaces to be used with monitor and microphone set-up and positioning; sound checks, leveling the sound equipment to capture and promote the best possible sound quality throughout the building. We set our cameras to the proper positioning throughout an event to capture as much as possible of each event, in sharp crisp video. When an event is over, we finalize the recording and as needed can even edit and or duplicate the recordings.

The most unrealized sacrifice in the life of the Media Ministry is the sacrifice of sharing in the corporate worship experience. When you are a part of this ministry, you soon realize that you cannot really worship during worship service. It is imperative that you monitor the equipment and the service to ensure that everything is going according to plan. All the equipment and team members must work in concert. This means the members seldom have the opportunity to experience the worship service in real time.

We are the team that has to be timely. In this ministry, we rise early to get to church before everyone else and we stay late to ensure the information captured is complete, to gather up equipment, and to secure the space.

In the Media Ministry, we are engaged on a sensory level which differs from your average church goer. Our eyes and ears see and hear things no one else is aware of. We have to anticipate the movement of the people involved in the service, and how the Holy Spirit may cause the expected flow of service to suddenly change. We have to be flexible, to accommodate the changes that happen when you least expect them.

Finally, the Media ministry has to understand the processes and protocols of each service or event. Media has to be willing and able to work with all ministries in the church. We hear your goals and strive to help you reach them.

The transition from the physical to the virtual worship experience has been one filled with challenges and lessons learned. Media was the last ministry in the building on the final Sunday of in-person ministry. We engage with some part of this team seven days a week. We have met faithfully with our Pastor and at his direction each week we prepare, review, record, edit, debrief, test, and plan every element of our production. We seek to deliver a worship experience as close to live as is humanly possible. Each week we see God doing what only He can do and we are simply grateful to be used by Him.

If you want to join this ministry, you need to pray. Pray that you will be able to make time for training; Pray that you will be able to get up, get out of your house and to the house of the Lord timely. Pray that you will have patience as you work with various ministries. Pray that you will have clear eyes to see, and ears to hear. Pray that you will be able to be attentive to the movement of others and most importantly to the movement of the Holy Spirit. Pray that your family will understand the amount of time it takes to be a part of this ministry. Pray that you will have the opportunity to enjoy listening to the worship service. And if you find that you are not called to be a part of this ministry, just pray for those who are.




