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Resurrection!

One of the most beautiful words in Christianity is the word resurrection. This word causes us to travel back some two thousand years to a garden tomb. This tomb is empty of the remains it once held. Life Springs Eternal

Every Spring, we experience new joy and hope as new life springs forth from what looked dead. Tiny buds dare to show themselves on the trees and bushes, even before Spring officially arrives. A few minutes of warming sunshine coaxes those buds forth. Life prevails. Likewise, life and light are in the Gospel message and that message overcomes death and darkness.

All around the world, humanity is experiencing darkness in a struggle to overcome Covid-19. Our great hope was that a remedy could be found to restore our health and well-being from Covid-19. And the good news did come. Not just one vaccine was developed, but three vaccines brought promise. The surprise is, however, that some people reject that good news and refuse to accept the remedies that could possibly save their lives. Doesn't that sound familiar?

Jesus Christ came to do what was for our good, to sacrifice His life that we might have everlasting life. His pure blood alone is the only remedy against sin and death. After the disobedience of Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden, all humanity became infected with death. We were lost in sin and suffering. But by God's will and love and the grace and sacrifice of Jesus Christ, we were given a sure remedy against sin and death – the blood of Jesus Christ. During this time of year, Christians contemplate the mystery of the cross and the empty tomb in which Jesus was buried. We bless the Father who raised up His Son from death; and we praise the Son who paid our sin debt and reconciled us to the Father.

Jesus Christ is the only remedy for our healing against sin and death. Our message to family, friends, co-workers, acquaintances and strangers, is to believe on Him. We can give them the message and the hope that is in the Gospel. That hope is not wishful thinking. Gospel hope is a sure certainty that the resurrected Christ, who sits at the right hand of God, the Father, saves. Without Him, the lost have no hope. Only Jesus brings new life and light.

As we celebrate Resurrection Sunday, it should not be lost on us that this pandemic may be a sign that God is moving toward His final solution for destroying His enemies – the devil, sin and death. Our responsibility as Christians is to proclaim the "Good News" of the Gospel to those who have not yet received Him. We must not lose heart if family, friends, co-workers or strangers do not accept our message right away. Just proclaim it and let the Holy Spirit do the rest.

Life, light, joy, hope and peace – all of these and more are in Jesus Christ. He brings life everlasting. In Him is the light that overcomes darkness. He is the joy that frees our hearts. He is the hope that heals. He is our peace. He is the conquering King over all the devil's devices, sin and death. Be a witness. Tell the Gospel story and your story. Proclaim the Name of Jesus to someone today.

“Therefore, Confess your sins to one another and pray for one another so that you may be healed. The effective prayer of a righteous man can accomplish much” (James 5:16, NASB).

From a Christian perspective, you have probably observed the confusion, chaos, and ill will toward others in the world today. Sin and self-centeredness are rampant in these uncertain times. Fewer people want to walk upright and do what is good, right, and safe for others. Thank God for new leadership in this nation with a godly conscience and compassion for others in this decline of morality, economy, and health. We praise God for the free vaccines that are being made available to all. Yet, there remain some people who are fearful or in denial about the seriousness of the coronavirus putting their families and others in grave danger. However, as believers, we know that there is a certainty of hope because we are convinced that our all-powerful God is in control and our lives are a living testimony of the saving power of Jesus Christ. How comforting it is to know that we have been freed from the power and penalty of sin in the face of rising crime and sin revealed on every level of society. Even so, we realize that we will encounter struggles and face challenges in the vicissitudes in life that might lead to sin, but when we confess and repent of our sins to God, we will be forgiven, cleansed and restored (see 1 John 1:9).

The Bible says that there is none righteous, no not one (Romans 3: 10). All of us have need to confess. What does it mean to confess sins? It is an acknowledgement or admission of sins. In other words, “to own it,” so to speak, meaning to take responsibility for having done it. Some have said it is to agree with God that we have sinned. Repentance takes it a necessary step further. To repent is to have a change of mind and attitude which results in a new behavior with regret over the former acts. Genuine repentance involves a turn; to turn from the sin to obedience to God. This pleases God. When we have fallen short of God’s Word, let us be quick to confess and repent of our sins. No Christ follower should want to be out of relationship with God for long. Our rendered hearts should lead to transformed living and right relationship with God.

“Continual confession of sins is an indication of genuine salvation” (Study Bible Footnote, 1 John 1:9): John MacArthur Study Bible, KJV). That is why it is necessary to commune and fellowship with each other by sharing our needs and being open and honest. What is shared should remain confidential. This enables us to uphold each other in our spiritual struggles. When we confess our sins to one another and pray fervently, this strengthens us for our spiritual journey by placing us on the path to experience the compassionate heart of God.

Are any of you suffering hardships? You should pray. Are any of you happy? You should sing praises. Are any of you sick? You should call for the elders of the church to come and pray over you, anointing you with oil in the name of the Lord. Such a prayer offered in faith will heal the sick, and the Lord will make you well. And if you have committed any sins, you will be forgiven. (James 5:13-15, NLT)].

There is a remedy in plain sight for all that ails us:

Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The earnest prayer of a righteous person has great power and produces wonderful results (James 5:16, NLT).

James 5:16 expresses an essential truth that many have heard yet few believe or practice. Most of us are familiar with and sing with sincerity the words of the following song:

*O what peace we often forfeit, O what needless pain we bear,
All because we do not carry Everything to God in prayer!*

We need to practice what we preach and sing. Let’s start now and watch God turn things in the right direction. Let’s stop hiding our faults and troubles. Instead, pray for one another and watch God work.

Prayer: Father, awaken us to the great privilege and access You have given us to boldly come to Your Throne of Grace. Let us finally call on You to be the Difference Maker in all our turmoil and pain. Make us transparent about our faults and weaknesses – You know them all anyway. Make us compassionate, honest, and trustworthy so that we may safely confess our faults and fears to one another and pray for each other. Lord we come to You recognizing that TAB did not make it to 100 years on our own efforts. You are the One who has been gracious and merciful to us. Please forgive us for any time we may have taken credit for the successes You granted that we have experienced down through the years. Forgive us for times we lift ourselves up in any way suggesting it was our efforts. You are the One who has supplied us with all we have given. You are the One who has given us gifts and abilities to work in Your kingdom. Thank You Lord, for Your grace and mercy to us. May we be just as gracious and merciful to one another. Amen.

am speaking of no one else but Jesus, our Lord, and Savior. The truth of this is a matter of history. This matter of history has theological significance. The fact of this event signals the settlement of the outstanding debt due to sin that humankind owed God. It also signified the conquering of the death and the grave. This frees those who believe in Jesus Christ from the fear of death and the grave because our Lord subjugated them both.

One of the Greek words translated resurrection is *anastasis*. The word *anastasis* is a compound word consisting of *ana*, which means "again," and *histemi*, which means "to stand." From this understanding of the etymology of the Greek word *anastasis*, the word resurrection means "to stand up again." When Jesus was buried in the tomb on Friday, death had Him "off his feet." However, on Sunday morning, the power of God caused Jesus "to stand up again." The truth that this happened to Jesus is amazing enough, but God has extended to each of us the opportunity to experience this same power. Sin has caused all of humankind to be knocked off their feet. It is only through man's faith in Jesus Christ that man can be put back on his feet.

There are situations in our lives that have knocked us to the ground of discouragement, disappointment, distress, and depression. The power of our faith in Jesus Christ can cause us to know for ourselves the wonder of God's resurrection power. God can stand you up again, no matter how you have fallen. Because of the power of the resurrection, we should not feel that all is lost. We have the hope of recovery in Jesus. Yes, there is the hope of standing up again from being knocked off your feet by any failure, any addiction, any situation.

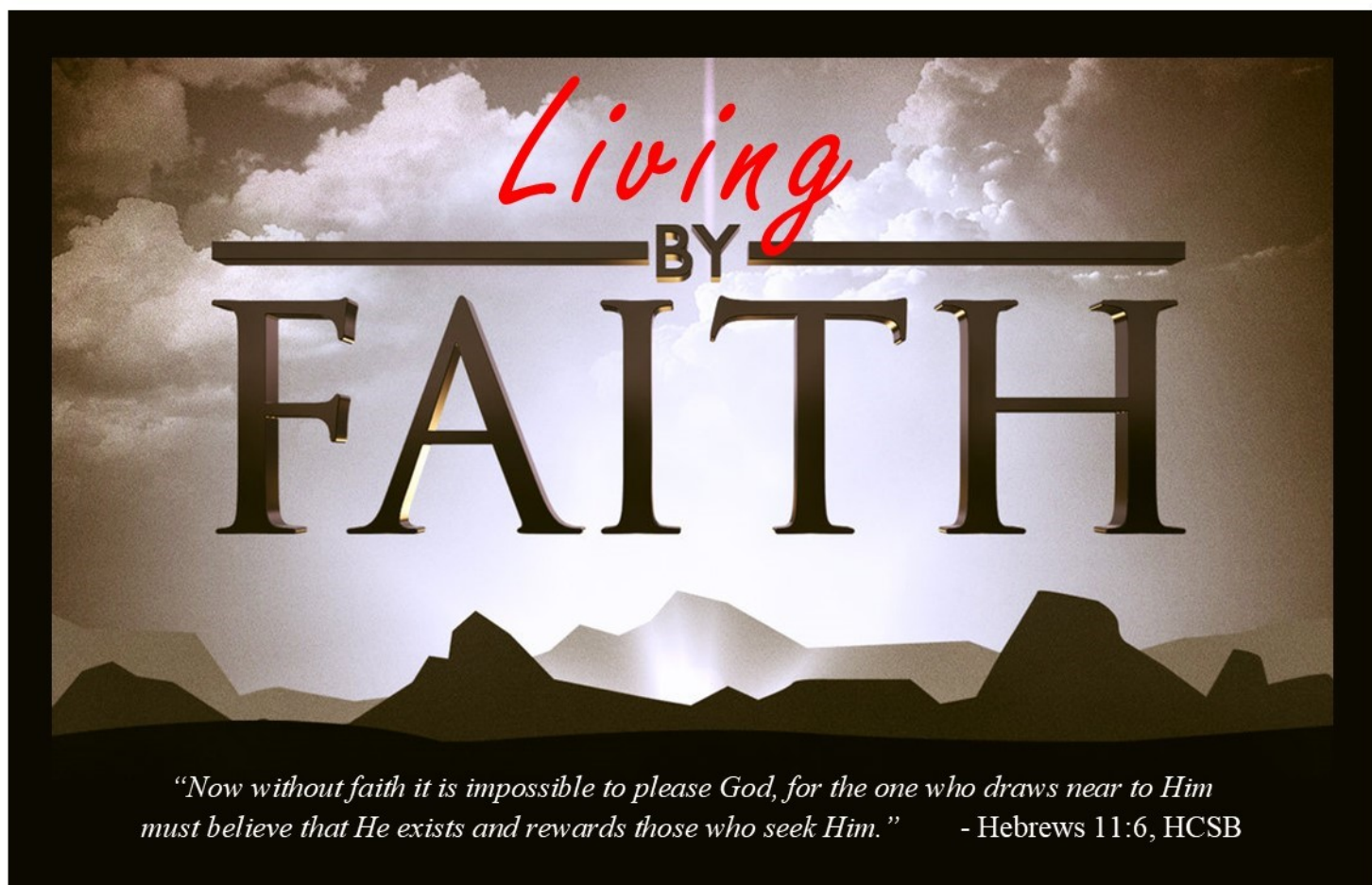
Many people have not appropriated this truth for themselves. They have chosen to allow their failures, their sins, to consign them a deathlike existence. They have chosen not to believe in the resurrection power of God. Due to their lack of faith, they won't let God put them back on their feet again. You may be one of those persons. It is not too late for you to trust God and His power to resurrect your life. It is not too late for you to trust God and look forward to that great resurrection of those who die in Him. Make the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, more than an event in history. Make the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, more than a truth of theology. Make the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, a personal reality in your life today. Let the power of God put you back on your feet again; let Him do it today.
