

I Trust God!

What do you mean when you say "I trust God"? This is a phrase that is easily spoken but rarely practiced. It is often expressed by those who continue to worry. To worry is not to trust God, and to trust God is not to worry. We often trust God's ability to do anything as long as what He does is according to our agenda. It is not difficult to trust God as long as He is working our plan. But is this really trust? For sure, it is not total trust. To trust God totally is not just to trust His ability, but to trust His wisdom. Trusting God's wisdom is to realize that He knows more about our situation than we do. It is to accept the fact that He knows what is best because He is omniscient. When we say we trust God and seek to require Him to work by our plans, we are telling God we know more than He does. We also are limiting the outcome to the finiteness of our understanding. This really is a feeble attempt to control God by attempting to instruct Him on how to work out our situation. We only want God to use His power the way we have predetermined. This is to say to God, I know what needs to be done, but I don't have the ability to do it. Trusting God is to understand that He knows what we don't know, and He has options we don't have. Wow, could it be that there are options that are beyond our comprehension? Could it be that God sees what we don't see and can do what we can't do?

To trust God requires humbling ourselves to say: "Nevertheless, not my will

God's Love is Inclusive

Racism is pervasive in today's world, and many are complicit in the failure to confront its evils. No one is untouched by racism. It seems to be at the forefront of all discourse and constantly in the news. It's a controversy that can no longer be avoided.

As traumatic as racism has been in human history, it is an issue that forces all of us to examine the ultimate definition and purpose of humanity. Who are we? How did we get here? Why are we here?

If there is no purpose for humanity and human origins can't be determined, then it doesn't really matter how human beings treat one another. Let the strong survive and thrive – whoever that may be at any given moment. Let the weak be exploited and given no value. There is no need for justice, no need to seek the truth, no need to look for meaning or dignity in ourselves or others.

However, if the idea that humanity has no purpose or intrinsic value seems wrong at its very core, then it forces all of us to look deeper. This is the only way the issue of racism, (that affects us all), will be resolved.

Scripture begins with the beginning – Genesis. Genesis shows us that an all-powerful, all-knowing, transcendent God created the universe, the earth and all living things. The very Name of this God – "Yahweh" or "I AM" – indicates that God is The Being who causes all others to "be," (i.e., to exist and be

sustained). That makes God greater than all other things and necessary for all other things to exist. In other words, God is holy.

I AM has made man, (humanity, both male and female), in I AM's own image. That means that every human being is a reflection of the ultimate Being who is the God I AM. That makes all humanity – every human being from womb to beyond the tomb – holy and sacred. There is no distinction given by color, gender or geography.

Racism says at least some human beings are unholy – not sacred, with less value than others or with no value at all. Racism places value on skin color, culture and geographic origin. Therefore, racism does not attribute human value to God. If the I AM of scripture is truly God, then racism is God-less in its very essence. Racism smacks of false, idolatrous religion centered on a false god.

False gospels, (gospel = good news), that entertain or ignore racism have been perpetuated for more than 1,500 years. A gospel that is neutral about - or justifies - the superiority and domination of one people group over another on the basis of culture, geographic origin or skin color is antithetical to the truth.

False gospels are pervasive and are rooted in the idolatrous love of material prosperity, of power and self-centered pleasure. The love of prosperity, power and pleasure are elevated over reverence for the dignity of each individual fearfully and wonderfully made in the image of I AM. This materialistic love is an offence to I AM.

The true scriptural gospel of Jesus the Christ tells us that God values humanity as sacred and holy. The God I AM made the greatest of sacrifices: God the Son, (i.e., the self-expression of I AM), offering His very life for "whosoever will believe" – male, female, Jew, gentile, slave, free, poor, rich, young, old, etc. I AM values each human being as an image bearer and potential heir of I AM's own holiness.

The true gospel is the solution to racism: God the Father, (i.e., I AM in full incomprehensible totality), loving humanity so much that He gave His Only Begotten Son, (the self-expression of I AM), that "whosoever," (i.e., male, female, without regard to skin color, geography or culture), believes on Him should not perish, (die), but have everlasting life. That life is in God the Holy Spirit, (i.e., I AM in internal, life -giving union with humanity). That life overcomes and transcends death. The Holy Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead will give life to our mortal bodies by faith in the true gospel in Christ Jesus – God the Son.

Jesus – God the Son – declared in his humanity: "I AM the Way, the Truth and the Life. No man, (human being - male or female), comes to [God] the Father but by me."

What is the answer to racism? Jesus says "I AM."

Know. Do. Grow.: A Meditation

Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly handling the word of truth (2 Timothy 2:15, ESV).

As a young child, I was a people-pleaser. I wanted to make everyone proud of me. So, I studied hard and got all A's and B's on my report cards and I was frequently on the honor roll. I can remember sitting at our kitchen table reviewing my spelling words, asking my mom to quiz me until I could spell them all correctly.

One of my first academic disappointments came in the 5th grade. My English teacher gave us a "test." It was a Following Directions test. It contained about 20 items. I was so eager to be the best that I started my test and finished before anyone else. Our teacher had only given us one directive: Read the entire test before you do anything. Me? I skipped the directions. After my teacher had collected all the tests, she read the names of the people who had passed.

To my shock and dismay, I failed the test! I had never failed any test in my life! To this day, I can still remember the pit in my stomach, and the disappointment I felt. My teacher pointed out that the directions stated: "Put your name on the paper and put your pencil down. Do not do anything else." What a life lesson that I've never forgotten. I had done each and every item on the test. Math problems. Geography questions. All of the things that didn't matter in being successful on the test.

The Lord tells us in 2 Timothy 2:15, "Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." But how can we rightfully divide God's truths and share them with others if we are not making time daily to be in His Word? How can we grow in knowledge and obedience if we don't know what God expects of us? The Word of God is our instruction manual. It is impossible to be obedient to God without being aware of His expectations—just like the test I bombed in 5th grade. I failed because I didn't know what the directions said. As a result, I did things that were unnecessary and pointless. These things did not give me the outcome I desired which was success!

In life, we can choose to "live our best lives" as it's the phrase of popular culture. But we will find that we will often be engaged in activities and situations that are meaningless to our God-directed purposes. Provisions for our "best lives" have already been given to us by God. We can do a whole lot of "activities" without having true success—which is to please God.

Knowing the Word helps us to combat false teachings and helps us to steer others away from falsehoods as well. Our diligence in the study of the Word leads to obedience, which in turn leads to our spiritual growth and growth in other areas of our lives. We want to live a life that is both pleasing to God and meaningful to those around us, as God has called us in Matthew 5:13-16 to be the salt and the light of the earth. We can't afford to "skip the directions" that the Bible provides for us. The plans are all laid out. All we have to do is know, do, and grow!

Prayer:

Father, thank You for when we don't know what to do or which way to go, Your Word is a lamp unto our feet and a light unto our path. Your Word is reliable and available as we go through these dark and uncertain times. We don't have to be left to our own thoughts and imaginations which can cause us to stumble, fall in ditches, or find ourselves on dead end roads. Majestic and sovereign God, You are in control of everything to include all adverse situations. Help us not to lean on our own understanding. The brilliance of Your Word will instruct us and guide us practically in all of our decision making. In it, we find strength for uncertainties, reassurance instead of fear, comfort and peace. You said that You would keep us in perfect peace if our minds are stayed on You, because we trust in You. Grant us a focused mind and a steadfast spirit to study Your Word to show ourselves approved to rightly apply it to our lives. Most importantly, help us to obey its truths. Help us to habitually hide Your Word in our hearts so that we can grow thereby, live it out every day, and reflect the light of Christ for others. Amen.

but Your will be done." You and I must recognize that we often cheat ourselves of the more excellent, better, and more beneficial outcomes to our situations when we fail to trust God. We do this by closing our minds to any solution that is not born in our minds. When we do this, I wonder can this really be called trust. I am not suggesting that we should not bring to God our desires, plans, and hopes. However, in bringing our desires, plans, and hopes, we must be willing to yield them to God. Yielding our plans, hopes, and desires to God does not necessarily mean that He will not fulfill them. Yielding our plans, hopes, and desires to God means that we recognize that He is God and He always does what is best. Yielding our plans, hopes, and desires to God means never ending up with less than He plans, hopes, and desires for us.

We often don't trust people when we doubt their intention to do us good. When it comes to God, we should never doubt God's intention to do us good. God has demonstrated His intention on Calvary. God's intention really is His love for us. God has put His love on display because He intends to do us good. In fact, since the beginning of time, God has always intended good toward us. We should trust God completely because He not only wants to do us good, He is the only one who can and will do us good all the time. We must trust God without reservation.

I trust God, do you? I trust not only His ability but also trust His wisdom, His unfailing love for me, His unimpeachable integrity, and His eternal intention to do me good. I trust God, do you? I trust God with my life, my present, my plans, my desires, my hopes, my future, my problems, my circumstances, my doubts, and my fears. What about you? What do you trust God with?

'Tis so sweet to trust in Jesus, just to take Him at His word, just to rest upon His promise, just to know, "Thus saith the Lord."

O, how sweet to trust in Jesus, just to trust His cleansing blood, just in simple faith to plunge me 'neath the healing, cleansing flood!

Yes, 'tis sweet to trust in Jesus, just from sin and self to cease, just from Jesus simply taking life and rest and joy and peace.

I'm so glad I learned to trust Thee, Precious Jesus, Savior, Friend; and I know that Thou art with me, wilt be with me to the end.

Chorus: Jesus, Jesus, how I trust Him! How I've proved Him o'er and o'er! Jesus, Jesus, precious Jesus! O for grace to trust Him more!
