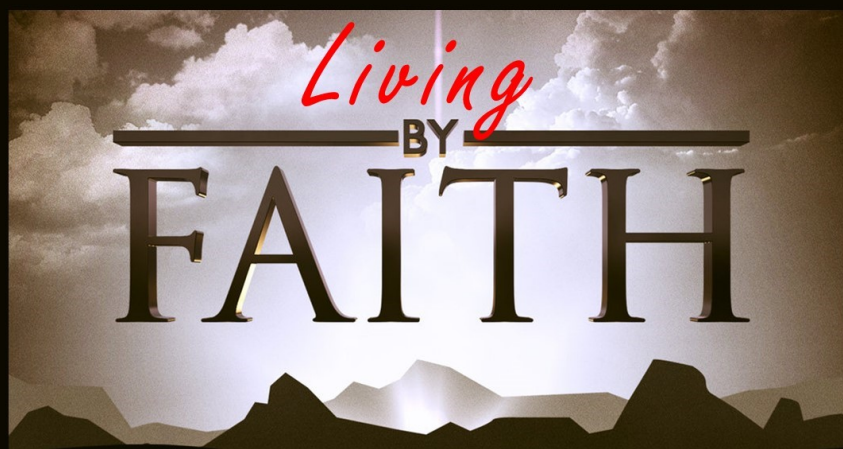

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An Attitude of Gratitude

There is a time of taking inventory for most stores. This taking of inventory is not only to determine what is needed but to assess how well business has been. We too, ought to take inventory of our lives. We should do this assessment of how good God has been to us. This personal inventory should produce an "attitude of gratitude." When we look around and truly observe, we would realize the vastness of our blessings. Far too many people don't see themselves as being blessed and therefore suffer from a poor "attitude of gratitude."

One of the reasons for this blindness of blessing is due to taking so much for granted. We assume or expect that someone or something will always be available. This assumption leads us to a failure to say "thank you." We often wait to express our gratitude to people at their "celebration of life" instead of while they still have life. Say "thank you" to the people God has placed in your life. These people may have done something extraordinary for you, or they may have consistently provided small acts of kindness. These people may be people who are members of your family, or they may be someone you encountered only once. Regardless of the level of what was done, we should say "thank you." Thank God for people in your life.

We tend not to be grateful for our health and strength until some physical malady limits us. Our fore-parents would often thank God for a "reasonable portion of health and strength." They often did not have perfect health, but they thanked God for the quality of health they had. They understood what a blessing it was to have the strength to take care of themselves. They knew that the day could come when they might not possess these blessings, so they said, "thank you." Don't take your health for granted; thank God now for health and strength.

It seemed strange to hear our ancestors thank God for a "roof over their head." This was

A Model for Evangelism (John 4:4-42)

Jesus witnessed to the Samaritan woman

When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, "Will you give me a drink?" (His disciples had gone into the town to buy food). How often do we miss an opportunity during our normal conversations to segue into a discussion about salvation? This setting was at a well where a woman came to draw water. Jesus made a natural request which did not threaten the woman in any way. Yet, she raises a horizontal social economic issue as to why they should not even be talking with each other. "You are a Jew, and I am a Samaritan woman. How can You ask me for a drink?"

Jesus was not distracted. He did not get involved in a discussion about earthly things. He moved the conversation to heavenly matters. Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water." The woman was still focused on earthly matters when she said, "Sir, 'You have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can You get this living water? Are You greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his livestock?'"

Jesus was persistent when He told her that "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life." The woman said to Him, "Sir, give me this water so that I won't get thirsty and have to keep coming here to draw water." Her attention was still on the here and now.

Jesus began to discuss some things in her life that she knew to be true. This perked her attention to be open to a discussion about spiritual matters. He told her that, "...You Samaritans worship what you do not know; we worship what we do know, for salvation is from the Jews. Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in the Spirit and in truth." The woman responded, "I know that Messiah" (called Christ) "is coming. When He comes, He will explain everything to us." Then Jesus declared, "I, the one speaking to you—I am He."

We must always be alert for opportunities to interject the Gospel of Jesus Christ into our daily conversations.

Worshipping God with Pure, Sincere, and Thankful Hearts (Philippians 4:8)

This month, our prayer is that the church will worship God with pure, sincere, and thankful hearts. Covid-19 brought about some major changes in our lives, but thankfully it did not affect our ability to worship God. Yes, we are accustomed to worshipping God in a congregational church setting, but we have found that we do not have to be in the “church house” to worship God. For the past fifteen months, we continued to worship in the privacy of our homes or quietly wherever we find ourselves. We have been blessed to worship via technology: Zoom, Facebook, and YouTube. The Psalmist said, “oh come let us worship and bow down and kneel before our maker” (Psalm 96:6). We can engage in worship in many forms; bow our heads, kneel before Him, or serve Him. The Psalmist says, “to serve the Lord with gladness” (Psalm 100:2). Let us not cease worshipping God.

What is worship? Worship is praise, adoration, reverence of God, and to serve God (Matthew 4:10, Romans 1:9, Revelations 7:15). In the model prayer (Matthew 6:8), Jesus said, “pray Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be thy Name.” To hallow God’s name is to affirm His greatness. We have read where David says, “Bless the Lord oh my soul, and all that is within me, bless His holy name!” (Psalm 103:1). We can bless the Lord; meaning to speak words of excellence about God. We can bless the Lord as we pray, work, shop, do our devotions, or meditate on Scripture. We can worship anytime and anywhere because God is spirit. Jesus told the woman at the well that “true worshipers worship God in Spirit and truth” (John 4:23–24). God is Spirit, and we who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth.

So how can we keep a pure heart when we pray, meaning a heart free of malice, evil, and self-promotion or selfish motivations? Paul gives us a lot of help. It boils down to where we focus our minds and what we allow to dwell in our hearts. “Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things” (Philippians 4:8). This verse, in Philippians 4, was offered in the context of praying about everything and as a safeguard against anxiety.

As part of our prayer focus for June, we are urged to pray with sincere hearts. God is a Holy God. He deserves our best not pretense or half-hearted lackluster. We do not want to be guilty of false worship, either. False worship can occur when we pray, fast, or give alms before men “to be seen by them” instead of in sincere devotion to God (Matt. 6:1–18 HCSB). In the Old Testament, the prophet Micah said, “What does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God” (Micah 6:8).

Because God loves us and is willing to do what is best for us, we should worship Him with thankful hearts. What are some things for which we can offer thanks? First of all, God is our maker, creator of the universe, and our sustainer (Col.1:16-17). He deserves gratitude and praise. Not only that He has done great and wonderful things for us. He has blessed and kept our church and our congregation. He has provided food, shelter, and clothing. On a daily basis, He provides wisdom, counsel, and guidance. He grants us His care during times of suffering. He sees us through our struggles. He heals the sick and comforts the bereaved. We have so many reasons to thank Him. He hears and answers our prayers. Not only that, He has given us eternal life with Him. Paul said in Philippians 4:6, “...in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God.” We should not take our blessings for granted. Thank God for peaceful days, for our health, and strength for each day. Thank Him for being our constant companion when things are not well. Thank Him for what He is doing, has done, and will do. Thank Him for His never-ending love towards us. Church pray that we will worship God with pure, sincere, and thankful hearts.

Prayer:

Dear heavenly Father, help us to always be aware that we live, move and have our being in You. Each breath we take is by Your grace and sustaining power. You always treat us justly. Sometimes in our limited understanding we think some things are unfair, but truly You are kind and merciful toward us far more than we deserve. You give us all we need for each day. Your constant and eternal Presence is light in our darkness, the cure for our despair and our peace.

Forgive us for our moments of doubt, our lack of appreciation for You and for placing self-centered desires above honoring You. Your mercy is greater than our sinful thoughts, words and deeds.

Thank You for the blessings we have received and the grace by which we live in this present moment. Thank You for our relationship with You that keeps us living abundantly through all situations. Thank You for the relationships and the loved ones that bring us joy. Thank You for the sure hope that all things will work together for the good of those that love You and are called to Your purpose.

Help us focus on the fact that Your love for us is unfailing and stronger than all that comes against us. Let Your perfect love cast out all our fears. Grant us peace of mind, purity of heart, strength and endurance for the temptations, trials and tests we face. Complete the good work You began in us when You saved us. Make us pleasing in Your sight. Your divine affirmation – Your “well-done”- is our great sense of purpose and the satisfaction for our souls. Amen.

strange to us because most of us could not conceive of the idea of homelessness. This no longer is a strange idea; the possibility is painfully present all around us. We should be thankful for shelter. Your shelter could be a shanty; your shelter could be a mansion or anything in-between; thank God you are not outdoors.

In the "land of plenty," we assume there is no reason to be grateful for food and clothing. Too many of us have permitted our children to develop a selective, if not absent gratefulness concerning these things. We thank God for what we like to eat and fall short of thanking Him for not allowing us to go hungry. We thank God for designer clothes and not for keeping us from having nothing to cover our bodies. Our children and we must thank God for food and clothing.

So far, we have addressed people and possessions as reasons for an attitude for gratitude. However, there is more cause to be thankful than these. The wonder of salvation is a great cause for thankfulness. God loved us so much that He rescued us from eternal ruin. He did this by sacrificing His only begotten Son, Jesus, for our sins. He allowed Jesus to pay the debt we could not pay. Without this act of love, we would have no opportunity to be delivered from our doom. We should be grateful for this. Salvation also provides for us the presence of God in our lives. Because of salvation, we have a future that is truly bright, a glorified body in the presence of God and all His glory. We also must have an unending appreciation for the grace and mercy of God. It is the mercy of God that keeps us from receiving what we are due for our wrong. Grace, on the other hand, keeps giving us what we don't deserve. These undeserved blessings may be in the realm of the tangible, or they may be in the form of fresh opportunities to get it right.

We should check our attitude. Have we taken our blessings for granted? Have we taken God for granted? Let us decide from this day forward to have an "attitude of gratitude." We have so much to thank God for! The prolific composer of gospel music, Richard Smallwood, uses these words to express his "attitude of gratitude."

For the many times I've fallen
And yet You forgave me, thank You,
Lord, I thank You
For unmerited favor,
And Your brand new mercies
Thank You, how I thank You
For wakin' me up this morning
For letting me see one more dawning
