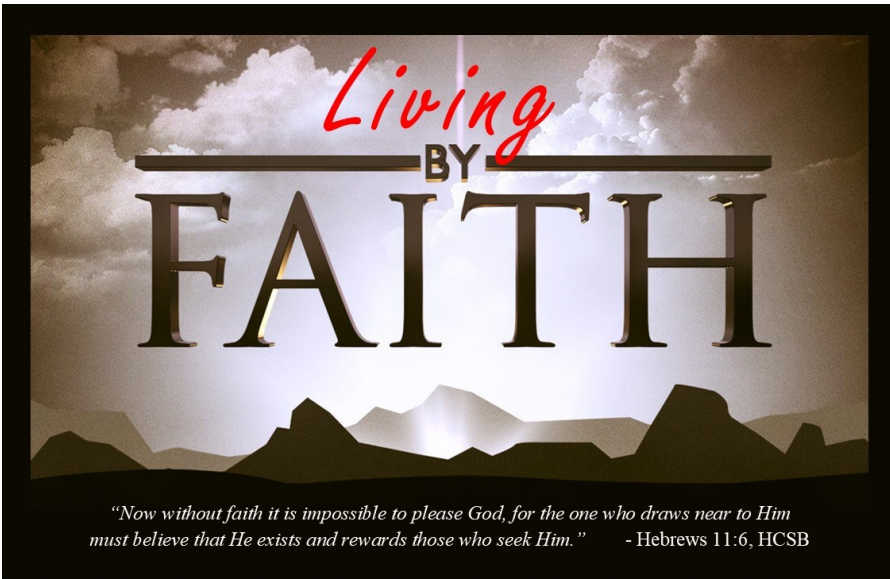

We are living in dark times. So much that we thought would never change has changed. Wall Street is now full of economic potholes, and great companies are falling like the walls of Jericho. Health care for many has become a fruit that is always out of season. These are only issues of economics. There are many other issues that confront us, that seem to take our hope away. This reminds me of another dark time in the history of our world. It was a time of hopelessness. A group of loyal friends gathered to observe a special meal memorializing the Passover. After the meal, the leader of the group went into a garden to pray. He seemed sorely stressed, and no one around Him really understood. All of a sudden, the night silence was broken by the hustle and bustle of a group of soldiers. These soldiers were not there for prayer; they were there to arrest Jesus, the leader of this group. One thing led to another, from judgment hall to judgment hall. Things came to a head on a hill outside of Jerusalem. No one would have thought that Jesus would be hanging on a cross outside of Jerusalem. It seemed as if all their hopes were being nailed to that cross.

Your Life is a Witness

In our current environment, we are living with heighten anxieties. Some things we can avoid if we are alert, but some things might present a dilemma, if it takes us by surprise. We spend time and energy preparing to live in this world, but some give little or no thought about preparing to live in the world to come.

This world is not our home, we are just passing through. Jesus went to prepare a home for us and He is coming back to take us to our new home where we will be with Him (John 14:2-3). The question is, will you be prepared to make the journey? Jesus is the way, the truth and the life. No one can get to the home that Jesus has prepared except he/she goes through Jesus (John 14:6). Your preparation begins by agreeing with God that you are a sinner and ill prepared to take the journey. You must confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord who died on the cross for your sin and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead (Romans 10:9-10). Once you do this and put your trust in what Jesus has done, you are assured of the place that Jesus has prepared for you.

Another question is what do you do in this world while waiting for Jesus to return for you? The answer is found in Matthew 28:19-20 where Jesus charged His disciples (and us) to make disciples of all nations teaching them all things that He has taught them. Our charge, then, is to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with everyone we meet so that they will be ready to go with Him when He comes. Your life is a witness whether you open your mouth or not. As you live a life of love, God will give you opportunities to share the love of Jesus Christ.

Writer's Ministry - Deacon's Lesson - August 2021

We are living in uncertain times. As never before, people worldwide are searching for answers for the dilemmas they are in and the challenges they face. As Christ followers, do you know that you hold the answer to their most critical need? It is so easy to remain caught up in our own concerns that we walk past people and even family members failing to see that they lack a personal relationship with Christ and the deep peace that comes with it. A relationship with Christ answers the deepest longings of our hearts. Perhaps, we have become distracted by TV and the daily dreadful news of the impact of the global pandemic, the coronavirus, economic crisis, voter suppression, political stalemates, climate change, natural disasters, and their effects that we may be weighed down and lax about sharing the good news about Jesus who gives us hope. Our sovereign God is in control. We must remind ourselves that God, our Father, is with us and that He takes care of us.

Going to God in prayer and reading His Word serves to redirect our thoughts and bring peace to our hearts. We can then bring encouragement and joy to other people, too, especially the lost. Proverbs 23:18 says; *For surely there is a hereafter, and your hope will not be cut off (NKJV).* Every Christian has the responsibility to give a reason for the hope that lies within us.

but in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect (1 Peter 3:15, ESV).

Jesus invited us to partner with Him in evangelizing others so that they turn from darkness to light and the power of Satan to obtain forgiveness of sins and eternal life in the kingdom of God. The last command Jesus gave was to go and make disciples of all nations (Matthew 28:18-20). We have a Christian duty to share the Gospel. We need to make Christ's passion our passion.

Our prayer focus for the month of August is that we may evangelize the lost so that they may receive forgiveness of their sins and the inheritance by faith in Jesus Christ. God is merciful to the lost. To evangelize is to present Jesus Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit that people come to put their trust in God and accept Jesus as their Savior. If we pray for it, God will give us the courage and clarity of Scripture to do it. He will open doors of opportunity to do it. When He does, walk boldly through them. Share the simple gospel in love and gentleness that Jesus died and shed His blood for our sins, was buried and God raised Him from the dead that we should be saved (1 Corinthians 15:3-6). Pray that God will help you to look for these doors as He draws the unsaved to Himself.

No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him. And I will raise him up on the last day (John 6:44).

Pray that God will give you the words to say. He has provided what we should say in His Word: God's great love - John 3:16; God's wonderful plan - John 10:10; The problem - Romans 3:23; A gap between man and God - Romans 6:23; The bridge to God: Trust Christ as Savior - Romans 5:8; John 14:6; Ephesians 2:8-9; Romans 10:9; 1 John 1:9; Romans 10:13; John 1:12; The life changing message- 2 Corinthians 5:21; 2 Corinthians 5:17; Romans 12:1-2.

In Matthew 9:37- 38, Jesus said: "He said to his disciples, 'The harvest is great, but the workers are few. So pray to the Lord who is in charge of the harvest; ask Him to send more workers into His fields'" (NLT).

Prayer:

"Father in heaven, we are - in obedience to the command of Our Lord and Savior Jesus the Christ - coming to You and asking You to instill in us the understanding and the desire to be better workers in Your fields, which are the souls of men, women and children who are yet to enter Your kingdom. Give us the passion and opportunity to testify of Your goodness, truth, love, holiness and Your message of salvation through Jesus the Christ to all that You have appointed to hear it. Let us faithfully do it through Your Holy Spirit with Your loving compassion. Let this be our highest priority, always operating with an attitude of joy, thanksgiving and reverence to You. Let those that hear our testimony believe and tell others, so that Your Gospel rings out loud and clear locally, throughout this state, throughout this country and throughout this whole world. Let Thy will be done. We ask this in the Name of Jesus. Amen."

they stripped the clothes of Jesus away, we feel that we have been stripped of our dreams and aspirations in times like these. It is not difficult to understand the behavior of the followers of Jesus that revealed their hopelessness. Hopelessness causes you to hide away out of fear. Many disciples were hiding from the authorities; they were seeking to avoid being arrested. Hopelessness causes you to become dismayed. When we are dismayed we tend to consider the things we have discarded as a possible source of regained hope. The disciples left their fishing businesses to follow Jesus. Now that Jesus was gone and so was their hope, they returned to their fishing boats. They lost hope. Sometimes when we lose hope we find ourselves embalming our yesterdays. The women who were headed to the tomb of Jesus were not looking for a resurrected Jesus. They had lost hope; they were only trying to slow the decay of a crucified hope.

By this time, you might be asking: "what is hope?" Hope is expectation. To "expect" is to see beyond your present situation. It is confidence that is anchored in the future. Hope is not wishful thinking. Hope is not some exercise of the mind. For the believer, it is the location of hope that makes the difference. The location of the believer's hope allows him to see beyond the darkness and see the glimmer of a new sunrise. The followers of Jesus could not see beyond crucifixion. They could not see because they had a limited view of Jesus. They lost their confidence because their hope was anchored in the things of this world and not in the truth that Jesus taught. Jesus taught them that His kingdom was not of this world. Because of the lack of anchoring they were easily blown off course by the winds of disappointment.

We have an advantage over the disciples; we can flip a few pages in our Bibles and read about the resurrection. We know how the story is going to end. We know that the stone of buried dreams was rolled away. We know that the dead body of crucified hope is now risen and alive. We have the record to give us more reason not to lose our hope. Our hope is in the truth of who Jesus is. Our hope is in the truth that Jesus did get up from the grave conquering death. The hope we have is anchored in heaven, the place where Jesus sits at the right hand of the Father making intercession for us. The hope we have gives us confidence in spite of our present situation because we know how the story ends. If your hope is located in Jesus Christ you have every reason to maintain your hope in these dark times. Let us join the hymn writer who says:

*My hope is built on nothing less than Jesus' blood and righteousness;
I dare not trust the sweetest frame, but wholly lean on Jesus' name.*

*When darkness veils His lovely face, I rest on His unchanging grace;
in ev'ry high and stormy gale my anchor holds within the veil.*

*His oath, His covenant, His blood support me in the whelming flood;
when all around my soul gives way, He then is all my hope and stay.*

*When He shall come with trumpet sound, O may I then in Him be found,
dressed in His righteousness alone, faultless to stand before the throne.*

*Refrain: On Christ, the solid Rock, I stand—all other ground is sinking sand;
all other ground is sinking sand.*

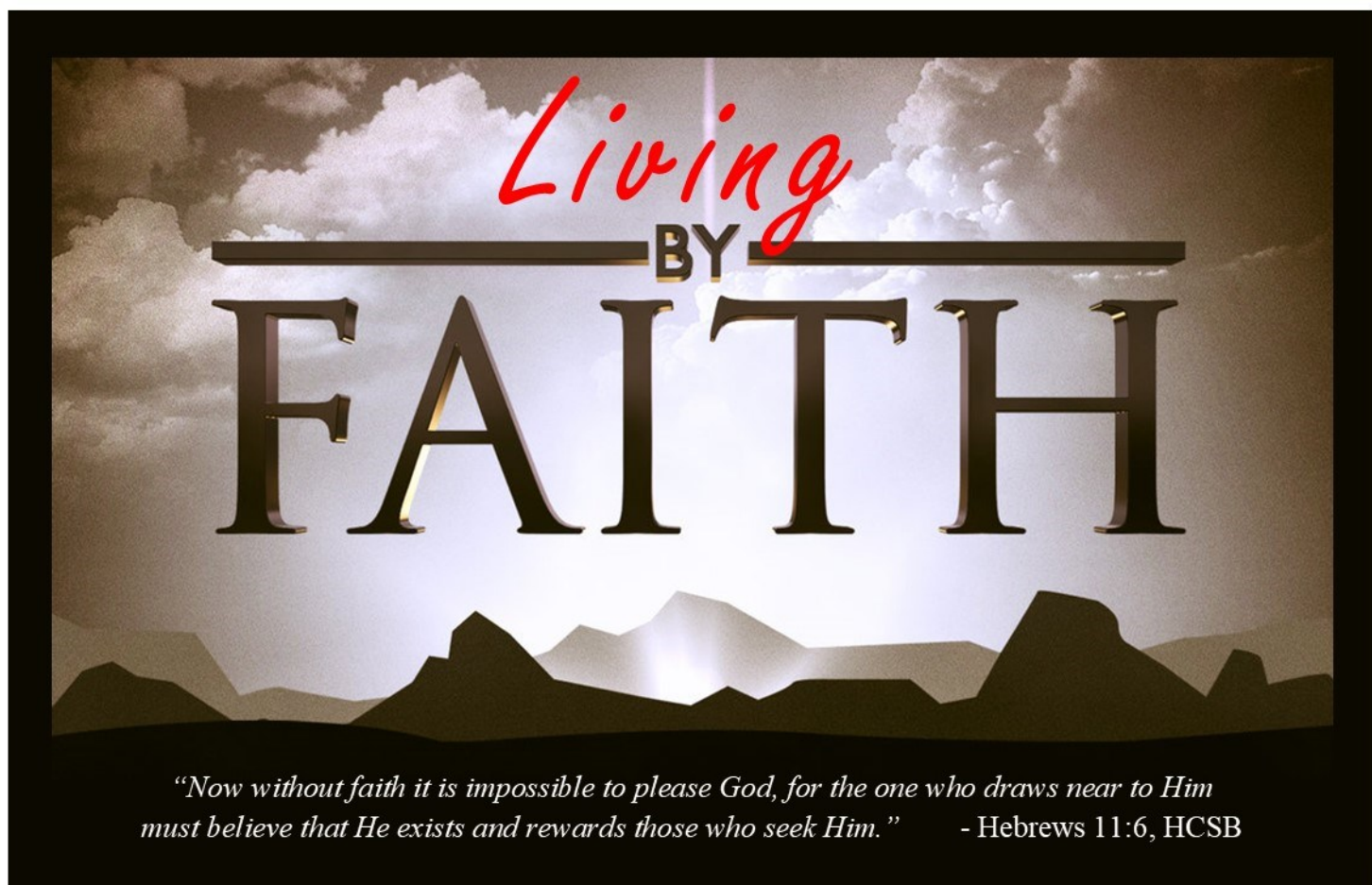

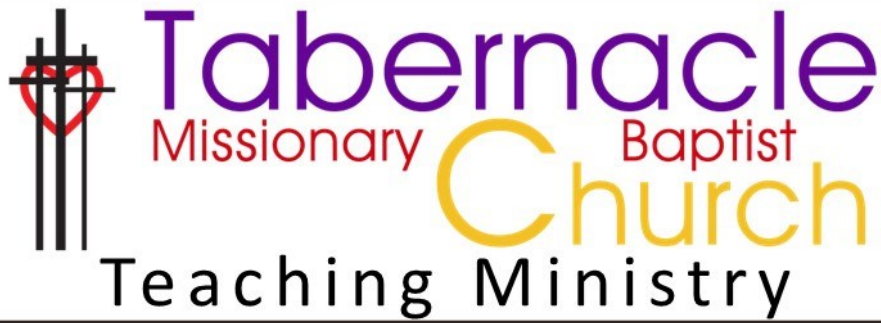

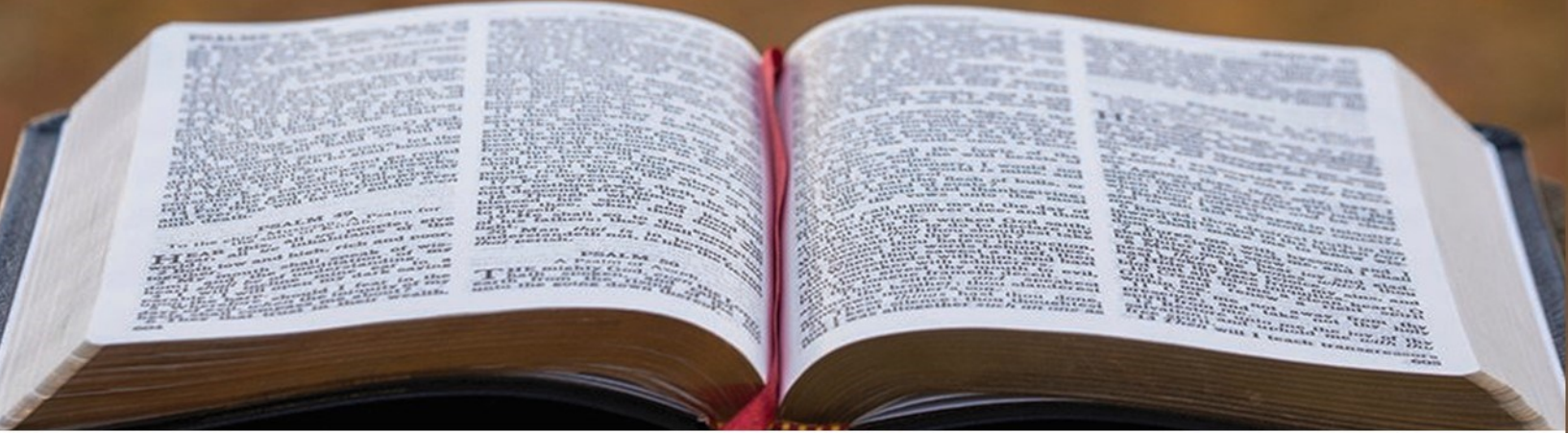
