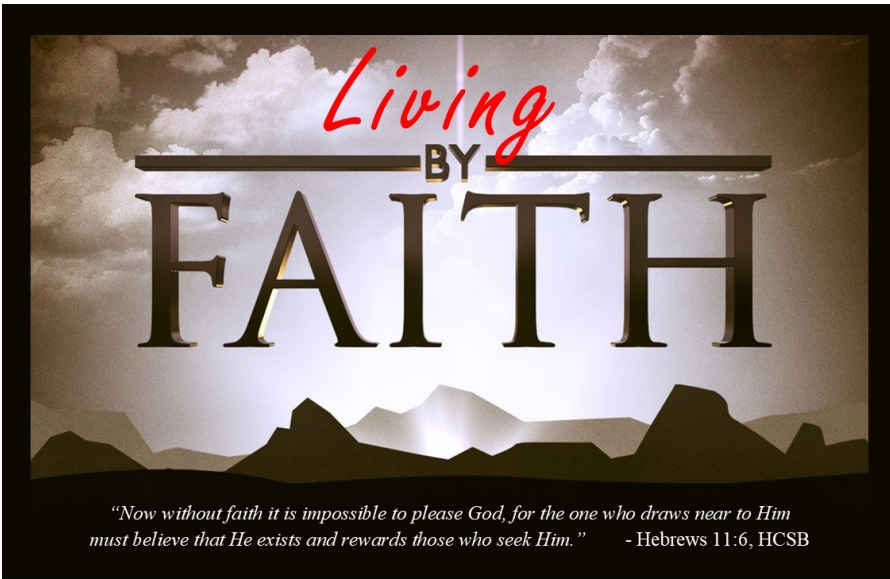

Share the Love of Jesus

We are living in a time when truth is being made up as we go along and is determined by the person declaring it. The only real truth is determined by God. This month we celebrate the freedom of our nation, but real personal freedom comes from God.

As Christians we have something to look forward to. We have been chosen by the God of Love, and placed in his family. So often our identity is wrapped up in who we love and how we are treated. Many people spend a lifetime trying to gain recognition and a sense of belonging. Because we are Christians our identity is found only in Jesus Christ. Searching for it in another person or in things will bring disappointment, insecurity, frustration and anxiety. Jesus said in order to save your life, you must be willing to lose it unto Him (Luke 9:24). You cannot experience the freedom and purity of your identity in Christ if you are still longing to be identified with the things of this world.

In reminding the early Christians of their identity, Peter told them, yes it was true, they were aliens, strangers in this world. (1 Peter 2:11-12) Yet they had been chosen by God to know and experience all the wonder and goodness of His glory and grace. Therefore, their identity was secure in Christ. Have you settled the need for identity in your life? If so, rest in the power of His embrace.

If not, settle the need for identity. Choose Jesus as your savior and your identity will be secure. Your identity will be good for eternity. This month, as you celebrate our nation's freedom, share the ultimate freedom: The love of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior.

Writer's Ministry - Deacon's Lesson - July 2021

Scripture Focus:

And my God will supply all your needs according to His riches in glory to Christ Jesus (Philippians 4:19).

There is so much confusion in the world today. How does the church survive in such a chaotic society and in the midst of a worldwide pandemic (COVID-19) accompanied by high unemployment rates, blatant social injustices, and threats against our democracy and voting rights? In spite of it all, we must continue to trust God and believe that the Church is essential. It is the foundation of truth that has stood the test of time especially in the Black Community granting us hope, clarity, focus, and strength to endure. Most of all, Christ is the head of the Church, He controls every part of it and giving life, wisdom, and direction. There is nothing too difficult for our God (Genesis 18:14).

As humans, we tend to panic when we feel that we don't have everything we need. This panic can cause us to not trust God and take matters into our own hands instead of praying to God. On the other hand, when we feel that we have everything we need, it creates temporary feelings of security and calmness in us. Remember Abraham and Sarah were way past the age of child bearing. Even though they took things into their own hands, God faithfully delivered them a son, just as he promised. We are far better off to trust God and rest in His promises.

Even though, we have been unable to congregate physically in the church, we continue to worship and receive the Word virtually. Our church members and friends continue to give of their time, talents, and treasures to sustain the work of the church. Most of our ministries remain functional along with a dynamic Church School Panel every Sunday morning and rich Bible studies Wednesday afternoon and Wednesday evening Bible study and prayer sessions. Christian Education, Retreats, and Super Saturdays continue. Autumn Fellowship still provides food to those in need. What does all of this say about our Lord and Savior? That He sustains His church and takes care of His own. He is loving, faithful and true to His Word. He is Jehovah Jireh, the Lord our God who looks ahead and sees our need and provides even from unexpected sources. He will never leave us nor forsake us (Hebrews 13:5).

Have you ever wondered how God desires you to respond to difficult life circumstances? Does He want you to be in a state of panic and stress, or does He enjoy it when you feel a sense of security and calmness rooted in Him rather than in man, the world, or material things? If you guessed trust in Him, you are absolutely correct! In fact, when we rest in the truth of Philippians 4:19, we can feel safe and secure, because we know that God loves us and cares for us. Therefore, every need we have will be met by God! So, the next time you feel panicky about a situation in life, remember that we serve a God who provides ALL we need!

Look at the birds of the air, do they not sow, nor reap nor gather in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not worth much more than they (Matthew 6:26)?

In the meantime, pray that God will grant all the needed resources to sustain the church, build the body of Christ, and continue to give to the poor and hungry. Needed resources include not only financial, but also spiritual and human resources meaning Christian laborers to serve. We need dedicated and committed laborers. Pray that God will supply all the needed spiritual discipline, wisdom, knowledge, and understanding to evangelize and further the kingdom of God. Pray daily for the spiritual motivation, stamina, perseverance, and commitment to give and minister to the poor and hungry. God is able to grant all of these things and more; exceedingly abundantly above all that we can ask or think (Ephesians 3:20).

Prayer:

Oh Lord, we thank You for all of Your promises to us. We thank You for all You are allowing us to accomplish in this Pandemic. Lord, forgive us for the times we find ourselves lazy, apathetic, unmotivated, or feeling sorry for ourselves. Forgive us when we aren't reaching out to see what we can do to support others in this peculiar time in our lives. Lord we come to you humbly asking that You continue to bless us with the finances to continue to care for the poor, hungry, the hurting, and even to give scholarships to young people seeking higher education. Lord, bless us with spiritual discipline, focus, wisdom, knowledge, and understanding to enable us to continue the work to build up the body of Christ. Lord, we need motivation and perseverance to continue the work You have for us. You are our God who will supply all of our needs. In the Name of Jesus Christ, we pray. Amen.

destructive behaviors. People who are not free cannot move to personal wholeness and, therefore, are never able to enter into healthy relationships. Those who are confined often attempt to create a lifestyle of confinement for those with whom they have contact. A life that has no freedom produces a milieu of sour attitudes about life and tends to view people through the lens of cynicism. The freedom-less life is both negative and fearful of the future, it has no hope beyond this side. This really is a miserable life. These people may appear to be free due to freedom of physical activity and the enjoyment of some of this world's goods, but it takes more than this to be free.

Jesus has come to set every man, woman, boy and girl free. He is the only One who truly liberate. True liberate starts from the inside. It starts with the heart. Jesus frees us by dealing with the breach that our rebellion has caused. Our rebellion broke our relationship with God. There can be no freedom until we are reconciled with God, our creator. God has chosen to reconcile man unto himself through his son, Jesus Christ. This reconciliation, and consequently our freedom come by the sacrificial death of Jesus Christ. The only way that any person can be set free is through Jesus Christ. It is only when one places their faith in the finished work of Christ that the fetters of sin can be broken. It is only by trusting Jesus enough to follow Him that one can be led out of the dungeon environment of sin. Only by trusting Jesus can the one experience the sweetness of life and begin to enjoy what real living has to offer. Jesus is the only one who can remove the scales of cynicism from our eyes in order that we can view the wonder of the image of God on every life. Nothing but complete faith in Jesus can set us from the wretchedness of a hopeless life. As we celebrate and reflect upon political freedom, let spend some considerable time reflecting upon and celebrate the freedom that is only found in Jesus Christ.

“When he put it in these terms, many people decided to believe. Then Jesus turned to the Jews who had claimed to believe in him. “If you stick with this, living out what I tell you, you are my disciples for sure. Then you will experience for yourselves the truth, and the truth will free you.” Surprised, they said, “But we’re descendants of Abraham. We’ve never been slaves to anyone. How can you say, ‘The truth will free you’?” Jesus said, “I tell you most solemnly that anyone who chooses a life of sin is trapped in a dead-end life and is, in fact, a slave. A slave is a transient, who can’t come and go at will. The Son, though, has an established position, the run of the house. So if the Son sets you free, you are free through and through.” (John 8:30–36, The Message)
