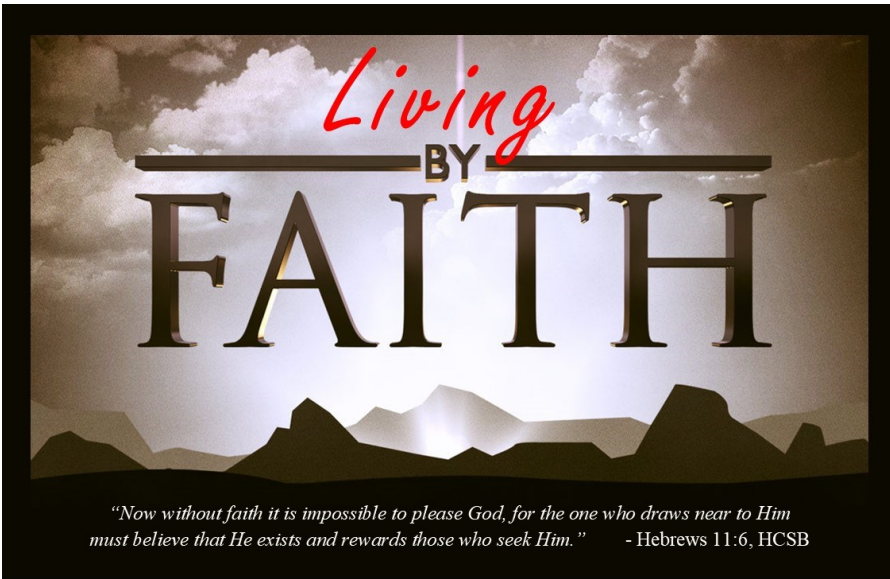

The Gospel Cannot Be Delayed by the Pandemic

COVID-19 (Coronavirus) has had a profound impact on every aspect of our personal lives. It has changed the way we shop, how we entertain, celebrate our victories and honor our deceased. For a short period, we thought we had turned the corner, but with the emergence of the Delta variant thoughts of going out to handle mundane errands continue to cause emotional turmoil and anxiety. Our lives have been upended and this new "normal" has caused us to change the way we do even the simple things in our lives.

In the face of the pandemic, we have had to reimagine our religious practices. Virtual worship services are now the norm and ministry outreach has been redesigned. A recent study shows that more and more Americans have taken to praying on a daily basis. Interestingly, many of these individuals admit that they do not belong to any religion and prior to the pandemic did not attend church service. This observation underscores one very simple premise; that is - that unbelievers have probably never been more willing both to listen and to consider the gospel of our Lord Jesus in their lifetimes than during this health crisis.

For this very simple reason, the pandemic should not stop evangelism -- it just means we have to change the way that we do it. As we consider ways in which we can continue our evangelistic work let us be reminded of Paul who evangelized while he was shackled-in-place. The question is - not whether we can or should continue the work of spreading the Good News, but how we might be able to do that in this ever changing "no contact" environment.

Do not lose this opportunity to advance the gospel. A few tips that might get you started.

1. Reach out to a lost friend or relative – this is a perfect time to reconnect. We all appreciate sincere care and concern and no one is ever offended by an offer for prayer
2. Leverage your social media connections – Consider hosting a virtual prayer group, bible study or discussion group and invite a few friends.
3. Record your testimony on one of the "Live" platforms such as Facebook or Instagram. You might be surprised by how many comments you might get. In fact, encourage people to comment and message you with questions. Answer questions and reach out to any who offered a comment
4. Pray daily for open doors – don't let any opportunity pass you by.
5. Volunteer to work with the Evangelism Ministry or any of the other outreach ministries of the church.

The list is endless – be creative – think outside the box. Very simply, the Gospel cannot be delayed and as disciples of Christ you are the perfect vessel and this is the perfect time to spread the WORD of our Lord.

Writer's Ministry - Deacon's Lesson - September 2021

Scripture: *"This is My commandment, that you love one another, just as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this, that one lay down his life for his friends"* (John 15:12-13).

Unconditional love is the most needed grace that will provide spiritual and emotional sustenance in our world today. Love should be the guiding compass in all we say or do. We are all in the midst of challenging times and the Church is not exempt. How can the Church continue to serve the community in the middle of such unrest; political chaos, racial injustice, and the deadly Covid-19 disease?

To serve effectively, it starts with having the love of God in our hearts and mutual love for each other. After all, God is love and "He so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son" (John 3:16). Love is at the heart of Christian witnessing where there is a genuine concern not to see people perish.

"Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things, Love never fails" (1 Corinthians 13:7-8).

As Christians we should be at the forefront demonstrating the love of Christ in us by the way we live, serve others, and work. This often requires sacrifice at many levels, understanding, empathy, compassion, patience, and caring. At the same time, we grow and mature by caring for and nurturing one another especially when we are grounded in the Word of God. It has been said that we are the living epistles of Christ written in our hearts. This means that our true transformed lives should be modeled in our everyday lives especially before unbelievers. This may be the only Bible they will ever read (2 Corinthians 3:2-3).

By delighting in the Word of God and the work of Christ and serving Him willingly, we can receive the peace of God, rest from unnecessary stress and anxiety, and calmness of spirit. Pertaining to our special prayer focus, this spiritual service of serving, and working in the church and the community is required of every Christian, not just church leaders. When we ask God, He grants us Godly wisdom to be prudent in the matters concerning the building of the Church body. Wisdom is the capacity to understand, apply knowledge, and act wisely. Wisdom enables us to do and say the right thing. This spiritually edifies and develops the Christian body of believers.

"But if any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God who gives all generously and without reproach, and it will be given to him" (James 1: 5).

"And the peace of God which surpasses all comprehension will guard our hearts in our minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4: 9).

Our special prayer focus for this month is that the love, peace and the wisdom of God will rule in our hearts as we live, serve, and work in the church and the community. We are asking God for three things; love, peace, and wisdom. We are asking God to allow love, peace, and wisdom to govern our lives and deeds as we serve Him, work, and live not only in the church, but also in the community.

Paul expresses these ideas well in Colossians 3:16-18:

"And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God."

Prayer:

Father God, we thank You for all You have done for us. We thank You that we can come to You with our prayers and concerns. Lord, we ask that what we lack, You will supply. Let us remember that You are the ultimate provider who loves and cares for His children. We ask that You bless us with the wisdom to make daily decisions that align with Your will. Help us to be Your hands in our communities and in the world at large as we serve the less fortunate, and spread the Good News of Jesus Christ. Let us be mindful that we represent the One true God, so that our speech and conduct is always pleasing in Your sight. Bless us now Lord as we continue to do the work You sent us to do. In the matchless name of Jesus, the Christ, we pray. Amen.

world all alone without family or friends. All of these things are about the grace of temporal things. None of these things last forever. However there is another Grace!

The Grace that I speak of is the grace of our salvation. This grace **Redeems** us. It has paid in full the price for the penalty of our sin. This grace **Rescues** us. It snatches and delivers us from eternal damnation. You and I were doomed to die without God and suffer eternally, but God's grace rescued us. This grace **Revitalizes** us. It is grace that gives us life in exchange for the deadness of our previous existence. This deadness made us insensitive to the things of God, but grace brings back our sensitivity, our responsiveness to God. This grace **Restores** us. It fixes the most important relationship that any man, woman or child can have, that is our relationship with God. This grace **Redirects** us. Because of God's grace you and I now have a new purpose in life. We have been created in Christ for good works. This grace **Refocuses** us. We now have something to look forward to, because of grace we now have hope.

The amazing paradox of grace is that it is free but costly. A great price had to be paid because a debt was made. Our sin, our rebellion toward God made us debtors and we had nothing in our possession to clear the debt. Our works, though many, are inadequate. Our wealth, though much, is insufficient. It took something that was beyond the vast holdings of this earth, it took the sacrifice of the Only Begotten Son of God. He gave His life to pay our debt and grant us what we don't deserve and that is God's Grace! Truly the hymn writer is right: Jesus Paid it All! Yes, I am blown away by God's Grace. I join with John Newton and declare:

*Amazing grace—how sweet the sound—that saved a wretch like me!
I once was lost but now am found, was blind but now I see.*

*'Twas grace that taught my heart to fear, and grace my fears relieved;
how precious did that grace appear the hour I first believed!*

*Thru many dangers, toils and snares I have already come;
'tis grace hath brought me safe thus far, and grace will lead me home.*

*The Lord has promised good to me; His word my hope secures;
He will my shield and portion be as long as life endures.*

When we've been there ten thousand years, bright shining as the sun, we've no less days to sing God's praise than when we'd first begun.

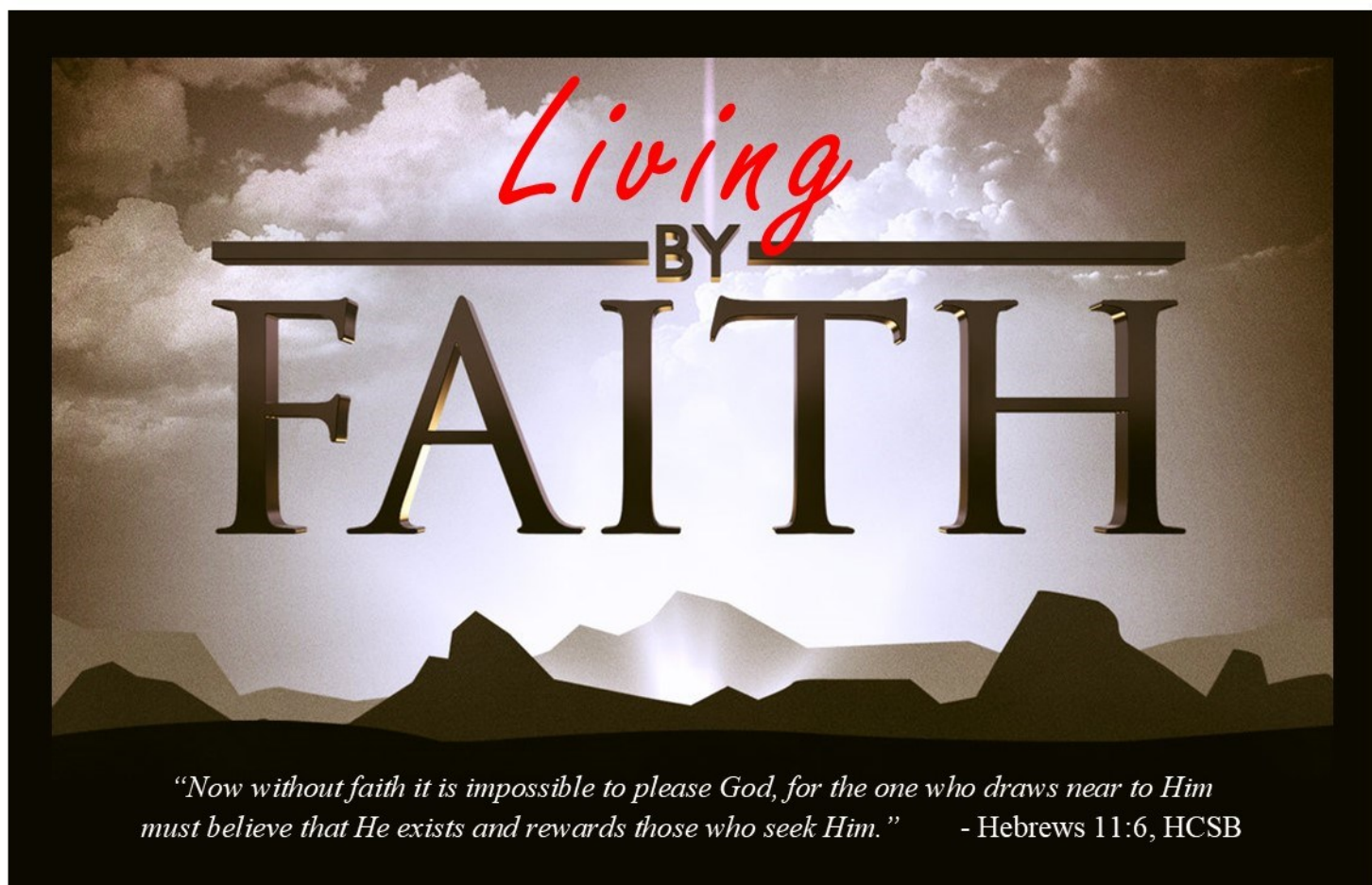

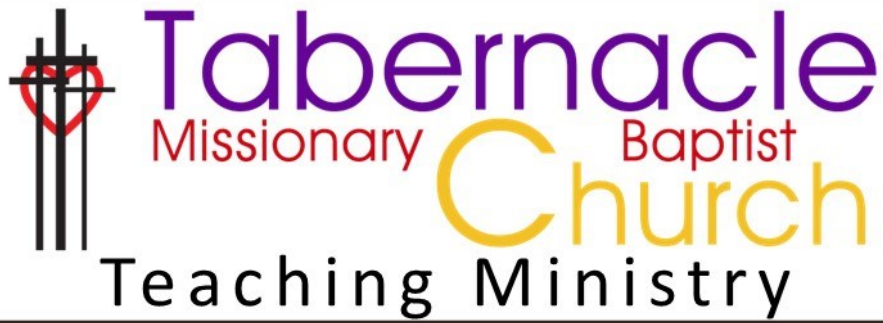

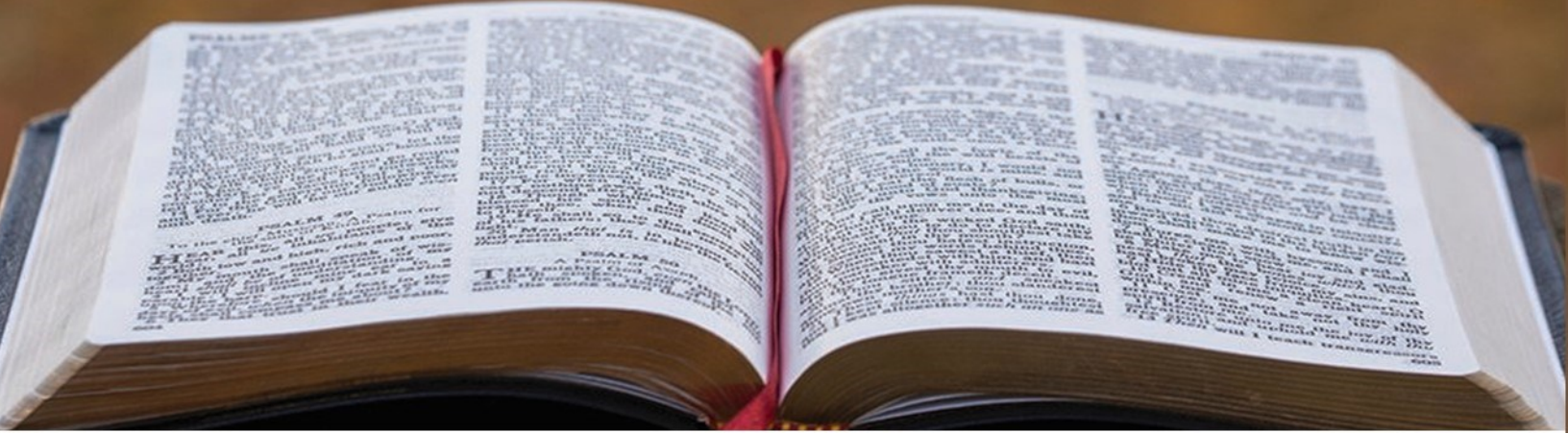
