

He Leadeth Me in Paths of Righteousness

Many times in life, we find ourselves at the crossroads of decision-making. We often know not which way to travel. In life, there are many paths from which we must choose. But when we look at Psalm 23, we discover that we are not left alone to make the decisions in our lives. We are not left on our own to try to figure out everything. David is the writer of this cherished song. Many of us can quote it in its entirety. But the phrase "He leads me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake" begs for our attention! What a comforting word-Just to know that we have the leadership of God at our disposal.

David found himself at a challenging time in his life when he composed this song. David found himself in unfamiliar places. He found himself alone. He found himself in situations that he had not been in before. But this psalm, Psalm 23, is David's recognition that he is not alone. David declares: "The Lord is my shepherd. I shall not want. He makes me to lie down in green pastures. He leadeth me beside the still waters. He restoreth my soul. He leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for His namesake."

There is something quite comforting to know that you have God as your leader. Life affords us many paths, and sometimes it isn't easy to choose the right path. If we apply the analogy of sheep and their shepherd to the statement, we will understand the beauty of this phrase. Sheep are known not to have good eyesight. They don't see very well. Also, sheep are known to follow the herd. They sometimes don't even decide for themselves; they just follow along with the sheep moving before them. Because sheep don't have good eyesight, they can't always choose the right path. It is the keen eyesight of the shepherd that knows the right path to take.

It is the shepherd who knows which paths are easily flooded out by the seasonal rains. It is the shepherd who knows the path that presents the least danger for the sheep. There can be no preventing of the seasonal rains from falling. But the Shepherd's chosen path can be high enough that it is not flooded out by those rains that fall. This is true in our own lives that frequently, we don't know the right path to take, and frequently the path we choose may appear to be the best path. But because we like sheep, we don't see well and don't know much about

A MANDATE: REPETITION OF THE TRUTH

In Romans 12:1, the Apostle Paul says: "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect" (ESV). We have read and heard that Scripture time and again, but the truth is, what Paul is saying does not only apply to our relationship to brothers and sisters in the church, but also to everyone we know and meet.

Although Paul continues Romans 12 discussing how to use our spiritual gifts in the church, Romans 12:1 instructs that we should do God's will and act with a renewed mind with everyone.

The spirit of the world in these times is to push lies, particularly political lies. But the Commandment Jesus gave us (which is the will of God) is not limited to those who think like we do. Jesus said, we are to, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:19-20, ESV). Political party affiliation does not countermand His Commandment. Jesus' Commandment has eternal consequences, and we can only successfully obey this commandment with a transformed, renewed mind.

There is a method to be learned from the world on how to effectively spread what Jesus has commanded. Politicians have learned the value of repetition. The more repetition the greater the chance to believe. Repetition works. We have the TRUTH. Jesus said, "You shall know the truth and the truth shall set you free" (John 8:32). We need to witness by repeating the truth repeatedly and freely.

We have been transformed by the Spirit of God, that is, we can look beyond our own vision and open ourselves up to encounter another's confusion, fears, or hopes. When we know someone does not believe in Christ, we should be bothered by their lostness. We should be driven to reach out to deliver to them the truth of salvation in Christ. First, we must not fear. Second, we must repeat the truth repeatedly, without fear that we will make ourselves a nuisance. We must push the BIG TRUTH, until our lost family members, lost friends, lost acquaintances, hear. We should continue to push THE TRUTH until our words, empowered by the Holy Spirit, win over the minds and hearts of those we encounter.

Our transformed minds should broaden our concern so that we become preoccupied with not just our own needs, but with the needs of others. That need is to keep witnessing to the TRUTH of JESUS CHRIST until it takes; keep telling our own stories about how we were saved and what God has done in our lives, until the Word convicts. This is not popular to say or to teach. We are afraid of being a nuisance. But Jesus does not view it that way. We are following His command – to "Go and make disciples."

Do we have to learn what evildoers already know? Repetition works! Keep repeating the Truth! Be creative to tell it in various ways until it convicts the sinful soul. Keep telling how Jesus came and died that we might be forgiven of our sins and reap the joys of heaven! Defeat the BIG LIES of Satan by SPEAKING and REPEATING the SAVING TRUTH of Jesus Christ!

Grace to Exercise Our Spiritual Gifts - Writer's Ministry Lesson

Scripture: "Now there are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. And there are differences of administrations, but the same Lord" (1 Corinthians 12:4-5).

Most of us love to receive gifts. The idea that someone thought enough of us to give us a gift can be exhilarating, especially when it is a surprise. Such is the case when we receive Christ as our Lord and Savior. The Holy Spirit, Himself, gifts each of us. How many of you have taken the time to discover what your gifts are? Our gifts were graciously given to us, but not for self-edification. Instead, they are intended for use to strengthen and edify the entire body of Christ. What are spiritual gifts? They are special gifts bestowed by the Holy Spirit upon Christians for the purpose of building up the church (see *Nelson's Illustrated Bible Dictionary*). Spiritual gifts are God given graces to benefit the church and to serve or help others and to advance the kingdom of God.

As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace (1 Peter 4:10, ESV).

The gifts are given according to the sovereignty of the Spirit. 1 Corinthians 12:11 says, "All these are empowered by one and the same Spirit, who apportions to each one individually as He wills." Our special prayer focus for this month is that God would grant us grace to exercise our spiritual gifts to edify the church and exhort others to good works. To realize this prayer petition we will need to spend time discovering what they are. We need to take time to familiarize ourselves with the following Bible passages which describe the gifts of the Spirit: Romans 12:6-12; 1 Corinthians 12:1-11; Ephesians 4:7-12; and 1 Peter 4:10. In 1 Corinthians 12:10, it is important to note that tongues as used in the original language of Greek here are glossolalia meaning languages. It is the ability to speak in an unlearned living language as opposed to unintelligible jargon. See Acts 2:11.

Each one of us has been uniquely equipped by the Holy Spirit to play specific roles or functions in the church. We should ask God to reveal our function in the body of Christ: or in other words, the particular task or purpose assigned by God.

For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; the one who exhorts, in his exhortation; the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness (Romans 12:4-8).

How do we discover what our spiritual gifts are? First of all, you must be a Christian. The gifts are given to Christ followers. Begin the process by praying and asking God to reveal to you what your gifts are? Read and study the biblical passages describing the gifts. Consider taking a spiritual gifts inventory that helps to pinpoint areas of giftings. Be willing to participate in church activities that require the use of that gift. For example, teaching is involved when working in Vacation Bible School or a Sunday School Class. Others in the body of Christ will confirm whether you have the gift or not. Be open to their evaluation and counsel. Seek the counsel of mature believers who display your gift to help you along.

Exercising our gifts first begins with a desire to use our gifts. If desire is lacking, then we need to go before the Lord in prayer asking Him to grant us both the desire and motivation to use our gifts. Once we are motivated to use our gifts, we must seek to use them faithfully as good stewards of God's grace. Why is it necessary then to pray for grace to exercise the gifts when God gave each one of use grace as noted in the following Scripture?

But grace was given to each one of us according to the measure of Christ's gift. Therefore it says, "When He ascended on high He led a host of captives, and He gave gifts to men" (Ephesians 4:7-8, ESV).

In our prayer petition, we are requesting grace to exercise the gifts God has graciously given us. Just because we are granted a gift does not mean that we will put it to use. How many gifts have we received that remain in the box or hanging in the closet unused? As Christians, we must put forth the required effort to use our gifts in the appropriate settings, at the right times, in accord with the values of the church, and the church leadership. Most importantly, adherence to biblical principles is first and foremost.

As we serve, we cannot always depend on our own strength but we need to draw strength from God to be effective so that God may be glorified through our ministry efforts. Moreover, the Holy Spirit is the true dynamic behind the gifts (see *Conformed to His Image* by K. Boa). Our gifts, whether they are teaching, helping, serving, leading, or exhorting, must be exercised in dependence upon His power. When a member exhorts us to do good works within the church, let us not get angry. Instead, seize the opportunity to glorify God.

According to Kenneth Boa, ministry roles such as intercession, faith, service, helps, mercy, and giving are the responsibility of all believers, not just those who are specifically gifted in these areas. For example, some have the spiritual gift of evangelism, but all believers have a role of evangelism that corresponds to the opportunities they have been given.

Finally, we should exercise our gift in love. Paul placed his great description of love (1 Corinthians 13) in the middle of the most extensive Biblical passage on spiritual gifts (1 Corinthians 12–14). Romans 12 and Ephesians 4 also include exhortations to love (see Romans 12:9–10; Ephesians 4:15–16).

Praver

Father, thank You for the spiritual gifts You have granted me. I pray that You will give me the grace to exercise them in the spirit of love for the edification of the church and the exhortation of the believers. God, allow me to serve with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, and forgiveness. I pray that what You enable me to do will be for Your glory alone. Amen. Bless us now Lord as we continue to do the work You sent us to do. In the matchless name of Jesus, the Christ, we pray. Amen.

the paths that lie before us. We often choose path paths that are easily flooded out and that are replete with great danger. David's heart is put at ease as he remembers the paths that his Shepherd has led him on up to this time in his life. David has to testify that the paths that his Shepherd has led him on in the past have kept him from being overwhelmed by the rainy seasons of his life. These paths that his Shepherd has led him on have protected him from many things that would have completely destroyed him. David reflects upon the previous leadership of his Shepherd; He gains great comfort as he expects his Shepherd to continue to lead him in the paths that will be best for him. Many of us would be free from anxiety if we just remembered the paths that God has led us. If we allowed the Lord to lead us in the past, we would have to admit that His choice of the paths has been for our best.

We might ask ourselves what makes the paths that the Lord leads us on the best for us. The reason why the paths that are chosen for us are paths that are not easily flooded out. The reason why the paths that are selected for us by the Lord are paths that provide optimum safety. We should find comfort in the paths that the Lord chooses for us because they are paths of righteousness. The paths that the Lord leads us on may not be paths of popularity. The paths that the Lord may lead us on may not be paths of great worldly prosperity. But be assured any path that the Lord would lead us on would be paths that align with his righteousness. The Lord will never lead us in paths of unrighteousness. The Lord will never lead us in paths that cause us to do wrong. In other words, the Lord will never lead us down the wrong path. Often we have difficulty accepting the path that God leads us on because it runs contrary to our own personal agenda. And sometimes, we reject the path that the Lord is leading us on because it runs contrary to the world's ways. We must never forget that the Lord will always do what is best for us, and He will always lead us in paths that line up with His righteousness.

One might ask, why would the Lord be so concerned about leading us? Why would the Lord take the time to guide us through life personally? The answer is in the last portion of that verse. The Lord leads us in paths of righteousness for His name's sake. Since the Lord is our shepherd, His name is on the line. No shepherd wants to spoil their reputation by being known as a shepherd who leads his flock down paths that are easily flooded out and down paths that are full of dangers. The Lord leads us in paths of righteousness because of His reputation. The Lord has a reputation for taking care of His own. The Lord leads us in paths of righteousness because it brings honor to His name.

Even though we may claim the Lord as our Shepherd, we must be willing to let Him lead us. Our daily prayer should be the words of Doris Akers's prayer hymn: "Lead Me, Guide."


I am weak, and I need Thy strength and power To help me over my weakest hour; Let me through the darkness Thy face to see,

LEAD ME, O LORD, LEAD ME.






