

#### **Don't Lose Your Hope!**

We are living in dark times. So much that we thought would never change has changed. Wall Street is now full of economic potholes, and great companies are falling like the walls of Jericho. Health care for many has become a fruit that is always out of season. These are only issues of economics. There are many other issues that confront us, that seem to take our hope away. This reminds me of another dark time in the history of our world. It was a time of hopelessness. A group of loyal friends gathered to observe a special meal memorializing the Passover. After the meal, the leader of the group went into a garden to pray. He seemed sorely stressed, and no one around Him really understood. All of a sudden, the night silence was broken by the hustle and bustle of a group of soldiers. These soldiers were not there for prayer; they were there to arrest Jesus, the leader of this group. One thing led to another, from judgment hall to judgment hall. Things came to a head on a hill outside of Jerusalem. No one would have thought that Jesus would be hanging on a cross outside of Jerusalem. It seemed as if all their hopes were being nailed to that cross.

Have you ever felt like your hopes were being crucified? Just as they stripped the clothes of Jesus away, we feel that we have been stripped of our dreams and aspirations in times like these. It is not difficult to understand the behavior of the followers Jesus that revealed their hopelessness. Hopelessness causes you to hide away out of fear. Many disciples were hiding from the authorities; they were seeking to avoid being arrested. Hopelessness causes you to become dismayed. When we are dismayed we tend to consider the things we have discarded as a possible source of regained hope. The disciples left their fishing businesses to follow Jesus. Now that Jesus was gone and so was their hope, they returned to their fishing boats. They lost hope. Sometimes when we lose hope we find

#### Accepting the Gift

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be My witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Acts 1:8, NIV

Have you ever been anxious to share good news? I mean something that was so good that you could hardly contain yourself? Imagine if you will the disciples having spent time with Jesus after He had risen from the dead. He gave them proof for forty days of His resurrection. Jesus brought peace and joy as He went about sharing the Word of God to those who'd receive it. He demonstrated loving the unlovable and forgiving those who were considered unforgivable. The disciples communed with Him, eating, and listening to Jesus talk about the Kingdom of God. Surely the disciples must have been elated to hear about it directly from Jesus. They must have enjoyed sharing the good news amongst themselves and others. The disciples followed Jesus until it was time for Him to depart for Heaven. Jesus told them that He had a gift promised from His father to give to them. That gift is the Holy Spirit.

Just as the disciples received the gift so can we when we accept Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior. Knowing what we believe the Kingdom of God will be, is so exciting to us, we too must spread the word. This should make evangelizing easy for us. However, evangelizing is more than knocking on doors to get people to 'join the church' or talking about our good news. So how can we lead others to receive all that God has for them? One way is to consider role modeling Jesus with the enthusiasm of the disciples. Our enthusiasm to share the goodness of God should be seen by others. This could be blessing them with something they didn't expect to receive. Or providing them with your testimony of what only God has done.

Take a moment right now to think of a specific situation where you can see the fingerprint of God on it, it should give you some encouragement to want to tell others. Realistic examples and our being on fire for the Lord should emanate when we are in the presence of others. Our word choices as we speak about God, will be captivating and not demeaning when evangelizing. There is a certain tone of care when we converse with strangers, family and friends. All of this is the Holy Spirit working through us to draw others to Christ. It is up to us to look for opportunities to reach those who are in need of a Savior. The opportunity can be great or small but remember the gift of the Holy Spirit will be within us when it is time to reach out to others. So, accept the gift, go forth witnessing, and make disciples of all.

#### Real Worship

"Let Everything that has breath praise the LORD. Praise ye the LORD" (Psalm 150:6)

Are you saying "yes" to God? Like most Christians, you probably agree that you've already said "yes" to God. After all, you've accepted Christ as your Savior and committed your life to Him. But what if I asked you what constitutes good worship? You just may give me an answer vastly different from other Christians. This is because some of us have been conditioned to view worship as good when we like the music being played during worship, the choir that's singing, or even the way we feel during worship. However, real worship is centered solely on God, not our preferences. In his book, *The Seven Basics of Belonging*, Tom Rainer states that "Worship is more than what you experience in a church service. Worship is a posture of submitting to God's will" (p. 15). Therefore, our preferences cannot be a measure of good worship, only the submitted posture of our hearts to God.

Worship is the first basic of belonging (Rainer, p. 15). When we come together to worship God, we are operating as He intended. Corporate worship gives God glory, as each of us says "yes" to God by giving ourselves completely, understanding that the motivation for our worship is to get God Himself, and not get something from God (Rainer, pg. 15-16).

What is the definition of worship? Worship is ascribing to God the supreme worth that He alone deserves (Pate, C.M., (1996), *Evangelical Dictionary of Biblical Theology*, p. 97). Simply stated, worship is praise, adoration, and reverence of God. God, the sustainer of life, creator of the universe and all that is in it, is worthy of more praise than we collectively can give Him. Therefore, we must guard against lackadaisical worship where one is halfheartedly going through the motions. Not many of us are bubbling with energy and fiery passion every day, especially early in the morning and late at night, but the point is to have our hearts and minds engaged and focused on God who is worthy of our praise and the object of our worship. Understanding that we are in the presence of God when we worship Him is a safeguard against routine or uninvolved worship. God is worthy of our best.

Worshiping God on a regular basis is beneficial. Our spirits are lifted. Our love and faith in God is openly expressed to the Lord in the presence of other believers. Consequently, God is exalted. Moreover, an internal unity occurs within the body of Christ (Rainier, p. 19). Regular worship makes us healthier and stronger (Rainer, p. 21). We become stronger Christians, a stronger church, and spiritually healthy individuals. Rainer states that a worshiping church will pray, elevate the study of the Word of God, sing together, participate in communion, and serve others (p. 21). The more we consistently worship God with engaged hearts and minds, the more we will "say yes" to God's Word, His Will, and His Way.

ourselves embalming our yesterdays. The women who were headed to the tomb of Jesus were not looking for a resurrected Jesus. They had lost hope; they were only trying to slow the decay of a crucified hope.

By this time, you might be asking: "what is hope?" Hope is expectation. To "expect" is to see beyond your present situation. It is confidence that is anchored in the future. Hope is not wishful thinking. Hope is not some exercise of the mind. For the believer, it is the location of hope that makes the difference. The location of the believer's hope allows him to see beyond the darkness and see the glimmer of a new sunrise. The followers of Jesus could not see beyond crucifixion. They could not see because they had a limited view of Jesus. They lost their confidence because their hope was anchored in the things of this world and not in the truth that Jesus taught. Jesus taught them that His kingdom was not of this world. Because of the lack of anchoring they were easily blown off course by the winds of disappointment.

We have an advantage over the disciples; we can flip a few pages in our Bibles and read about the resurrection. We know how the story is going to end. We know that the stone of buried dreams was rolled away. We know that the dead body of crucified hope is now risen and alive. We have the record to give us more reason not to lose our hope. Our hope is in the truth of who Jesus is. Our hope is in the truth that Jesus did get up from the grave conquering death. The hope we have is anchored in heaven, the place where Jesus sits at the right hand of the Father making intercession for us. The hope we have gives us confidence in spite of our present situation because we know how the story ends. If your hope is located in Jesus Christ you have every reason to maintain your hope in these dark times. Let us join the hymn writer who says:

My hope is built on nothing less than Jesus' blood and righteousness; I dare not trust the sweetest frame, but wholly lean on Jesus' name.

When darkness veils His lovely face, I rest on His unchanging grace; in ev'ry high and stormy gale my anchor holds within the veil.

His oath, His covenant, His blood support me in the whelming flood; when all around my soul gives way, He then is all my hope and stay.

When He shall come with trumpet sound, O may I then in Him be found, dressed in His righteousness alone, faultless to stand before the throne.

Refrain: On Christ, the solid Rock, I stand—all other ground is sinking sand; all other ground is sinking sand.






Broadcast with Leadership Timeline: March 20, 2022 In-Person and Virtual Worship




