

Fill Your Heart with Jesus Christ

When most Christians hear the words "personal evangelism," the most common response is fear. Many who respond with fear often compare themselves to gifted evangelists and the seasoned saints who have a commanding knowledge of the Scriptures and the natural ability to enter into life-changing spiritual conversations and think, "I can't do that!!!"

Just like many of these Christians, I too was once paralyzed by fear when anyone approached with a discussion about evangelism. Indeed, it took several years of hand wringing, praying, and patient encouragement from others for me to take the plunge and dip my toe in the evangelism pool. When I did, I learned that if I pulled my love for the Lord from the deep recesses of my heart and shared what I know to be true about the Lord - I could evangelize. I thank God for gifted evangelists and realize that I may never be as eloquent but I have learned that if I share my passion and love for the Lord and who I know Him to be - I can be just as effective as the most eloquent. And so can you!

When you simply recall what God has done for you... How He has brought you through... How the diagnosis you feared did not come... Then you my friend, can evangelize. When you simply recall the times when you saw the hand of God at work in your life, you can evangelize. When you recall that time you were running late for an important meeting/appointment and you knew that you could not make it in the 3 minutes you had, but God seemed to stretch that 3 minutes into 5 and you arrived just in time! When you recall that time you throught you did not have money for gas or to buy lunch only to find a stray 5-dollar bill in the pocket of the jacket you decided to wear, you can evangelize. If you can repeat what you recall about the favor of God, then you, my friend, can evangelize.

Your story may not be like any other. It does not need to be. It just needs to be your story. Simply repeating what you recall about what God has done for you, both in the big and small ways, is evangelizing. When you fill your heart with Jesus Christ, it is so easy to speak about His glory! And that is evangelizing!

If you are afraid that the words will not come, do not be discouraged. There is no right way or specific technique to share the goodness of God. Simply recall and repeat what God has done for you and how you have seen His hand at work in your life, and the lives of others. Think about the majestic glory of Jesus Christ. When you reflect on His glory so you will speak. Do not worry about how fluent you sound and how many Scriptures you can quote on the spot. Simply speak genuinely from the heart and your passion will communicate more about the magnificence of Jesus than repeating someone else's memorized script. "In your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy" (1 Peter 3:15, ESV).

The reality is that we are always "evangelizing." Talking about what is "holy" to us: A sports team, a TV show, the achievements of our children, and the absolute cuteness of those grandkids. What we hold as special, sacred, and of utmost importance to us will naturally flow from our hearts to our mouths. So just as you brag about those "other things" in life make sure in your heart that Jesus is Lord and it will indeed flow from your mouth.

Called to Serve

For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another (Gal 5:13).

We have been looking at various aspects of what it means to belong to our church. Related to our church membership, we explored several basics of belonging. In previous months, the newsletter covered "Saying "Yes" to God," "Real Worship," and "Growing in Christ Jesus."

Our Pastor, serving ministers, deacons, deaconesses, trustees, teachers, secretarial and clerical staff, and custodians, along with other hardworking church members are among our most valuable assets. They make it possible for us to serve and worship God comfortably, and more effectively. Yet, it is important to point out that all of us have been called to serve. Jesus informed us that 'the Son of Man (Jesus) came not to be served but to serve others and to give His life as a ransom for many' (Mark 10:45). If our Lord and Savior came to serve, so should we.

Given that we are no longer under the law, our Christian liberty compels us to serve one another in love. Service is part of the will of God. As we serve by the strength that God gives us, let us serve to His glory (1 Peter 4:11).

One writer said that love expresses itself in service to the needs of others (Hansen, G. W. (1994). <u>Galatians</u> (Gal. 5:13–15). "The third basic of belonging in the church is serving. It's about sharing with others, reaching others, and serving others. The way the church fulfills God's outward calling is through serving" (Sam Rainer, Seven Basics of Belonging, 2021, pg. 37).

All of us can serve. Each Christian has been given at least one spiritual gift by the Holy Spirit. Spiritual gifts are God given graces for serving others (Jerry Bridges, *True Community* - The Biblical Practice of Koinonia. Pg 87-89). Each believer has a unique spiritual gift that the Holy Spirit individually measured out according to God's sovereign will and design; spiritual gifts are given to each and every one of us (1 Petr 4:10, 1 Cor 12:7).

"Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms" (1 Peter 4:10).

The Phillips translation paraphrased 1 Corinthians 12: 7 quite clearly, "Men have different gifts, but it is the same Spirit who gives them. There are different ways of serving God, but it is the same Lord who is served. God works through different men in different ways, but it is the same God who achieves his purposes through them all. Each man is given his gift by the Spirit that he may make the most of it."

Two important questions to ask are: What opportunities to serve have been opened to you? It is also important to consider; what opportunities in some ways have been closed to you? Most important is the confirmation from other Christians. They can validate whether the church or others have been blessed, encouraged, or strengthened by your gift. All gifts must be developed and exercised. Every gift is a gift of grace whose purpose is to serve others, the church, and to glorify God!

Volunteer

With the launching of our virtual church services, we were able to continue our church service, Bible studies, and teaching ministry, Thanks be to God for talented and gifted people in the church with technology skills who are willing to teach others how to do zoom and host many of these events. Consider participating in a training session to help as a host for some of these sessions. Autumn Fellowship is a ministry within the church that serves the community. They are in need of volunteers. No technology skills are required; only a willing heart and hands on.

Reach Out

One of the most important ways we can serve now given the impact of the pandemic is to contact members of the church body. Reach out with a phone call, card, written note, text, or email. Find out if they have any needs; food, meds, household chores, lawn or yard care, or errands they cannot do. Not only will they be blessed so will you. Let us not grow weary in well-doing.

Share

Share your resources, friendship, time, talents, and skills. Perhaps, you have skills or abilities that could benefit the church such as painting, carpentry, lawn service, cleaning, plumbing, accounting, nursing, medical skills, music, legal abilities, or teaching. Consider sharing some of these with the church pro bono, without charge. "Knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ" (Colossians 3:24).

Sam Rainer, outlined Five Steps to Serving in Your Church: Look for Opportunities; Volunteer where there is a need; Take the Initiative; Invite your neighbors to church; Share Jesus with people.

We can serve on various levels: in the home, at church, in the community, and at work. As we serve in our homes, the church, and the community, let us exhibit the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

Reach Out, Support, Share, Serve

Remember all that we do is to the honor and glory of God.

We promote the Kingdom of God by using what God has given us to His glory. God has placed each of us in His family to make a unique contribution. The Apostle Paul challenges us with these words: "Just as our bodies have many parts and each part has a special function, so it is with Christ's body. We are many parts of one body, and we all belong to each other. In His grace, God has given us different gifts for doing certain things well. So if God has given you the ability to prophesy, speak out with as much faith as God has given you. If your gift is serving others, serve them well. If you are a teacher, teach well. If your gift is to encourage others, be encouraging. If it is giving, give generously. If God has given you leadership ability, take the responsibility seriously. And if you have a gift for showing kindness to others, do it gladly. Don't just pretend to love others. Really love them. Hate what is wrong. Hold tightly to what is good. Love each other with genuine affection, and take delight in honoring each other. Never be lazy, but work hard and serve the Lord enthusiastically. Rejoice in our confident hope. Be patient in trouble and keep on praying. When God's people are in need, be ready to help them. Always be eager to practice hospitality" (Romans 12:4–13, NLT).

Broadcast with Leadership Timeline: March 20, 2022 In-Person and Virtual Worship






