

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The Challenge of Delay

"O Jacob, how can you say the Lord does not see your troubles? O Israel, how can you say God ignores your rights? Have you never heard? Have you never understood? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of all the earth. He never grows weak or weary. No one can measure the depths of his understanding. He gives power to the weak and strength to the powerless. Even youths will become weak and tired, and young men will fall into exhaustion. But those who trust in the Lord will find new strength. They will soar high on wings like eagles. They will run and not grow weary. They will walk and not faint." (Isaiah 40:27–31, NLT)

Most of us have difficulty dealing with delay. The truth is that many of us are infected with the "right now" virus. We want what we want, and we want it right now. Delay challenges us because it frustrates our plans. In fact, delay appears to cancel our plans. We just expected things to be different by now, but they are not. Delay also impacts our sense of self-worth. We tend to feel that because of who we are, we should not have to deal with this awful thing called delay. If we are not careful, we can allow the delay to eclipse any hope of a better tomorrow. We might even begin to doubt the ability and the concern of the one we are waiting on.

This is where we find Israel in Isaiah 40:27-31. They are challenged by delay. At this time, Israel was in exile, and they figured they had been in exile long enough. They thought things should be different by this time. Since things had not changed, they came to some unholy conclusions. Israel concluded that the delay they were experiencing was because God had utterly lost sight of their plight. They believed that God couldn't really see how bad things were for them. Israel also concluded that God no longer cared for them. They

Intentionally True

Today we hear a lot about freedom - freedom to vote, freedom to make personal choices, freedom to purchase guns, freedom from any restraints that keep us from enjoying life and pursuing our dreams. Jesus also preached about freedom. But the freedom of which He spoke is a deeper freedom that pertains to the state of our souls and has nothing to do with the external nature of our lives. Jesus wants us to be free from every internal form of bondage preventing us from becoming the persons He created us to be.

Jesus offers freedom that can only be obtained by a knowledge of the truth. Jesus said: "If you continue in My word, then you are truly disciples of Mine; and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free" (John 8:31-32).

True freedom means continuing in God's Word, which means we abide in it. Abiding in God's word means His Word fills our mind, shapes our attitude, our emotions, and directs our behavior. Jesus' intent is to free us from sin and every form of bondage that imprisons us. Abiding in His Word will accomplish that goal. We must be *intentional* to abide in His Word.

However, we live in a world feeding on conspiracy theories and lies. Satan is relentlessly feeding the world's communication systems a bumper crop of lies and malicious diet of deceit. Satan intends to steal our minds, deaden our hearts, and make us captive to his will and not the Lord's will.

Jesus calls us to not only guard personally against the wiles of the devil, but also be proactive against him by being ambassadors of the truth that sets us free. Our marching orders are to teach all nations and baptize them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost (Matthew 28:19-20). We must be *intentionally determined* to be an ambassador for Christ.

We enlist in God's army when we confess that we believe in Jesus as the Son of God, confess our sins and believe that Jesus sacrificed His life on the cross and that His blood paid our sin debt. All those who make that confession must believe that in Christ, we are free from the fear of death and damnation. Then, we must intentionally put on the whole armor of God and stand against the lies and schemes of the devil.

In Ephesians 6, Paul teaches that the first weapon we need is the belt of truth. Considering the lies assailing us today, it is no wonder that TRUTH is the first weapon Paul describes. In fact, there are two pieces of spiritual armor centered on truth. The belt of truth and sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God. We must know the Word just as any good soldier knows how to handle his weapon if he/she intends to be effective. We must read, study, and meditate on the Word and be *intentional* to pray according to the Word.

Lest there be any misunderstanding, did not Jesus say these hard words in Matthew 10? "Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I have not come to bring peace, but a sword. And whoever does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me" (Matthew 10:34-39). Our sword is the Word of God.

If we intend to be intentional disciples, we must take the Word of God, our sword, and use it in service to our Lord. In our conversation with family, friends, and strangers, let us find ourselves speaking the Word of the Gospel in our conversations. That Word is Truth. There should be no doubt that we are on the Lord's side. No one should questions whether we are Christians.

Be intentional light. If we are the Lord's side - shine and say so! Let those who are in your world know the Lord has set you free from the darkness of worldly deception and lies. Let the Lord use you to tell His story to others who may come to Him. He is the LIGHT and absolute TRUTH. By His Spirit, God will graciously set them free from bondage. For the Word of God is Truth (John 17:17) and is eternal: "The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever" (Isaiah 40:8).

Be a disciple! Be a disciple intent on being a witness to God's Word. His Word is truth.

Honoring God with Our Giving

"What shall I render to the Lord for all His benefits to me? I will lift up the cup of salvation and call on the name of the Lord, I will pay my vows to the Lord in the presence of all His people" (Psalm 116:12-14).

For the past few months, we have been exploring what our church membership means and some of the basics of belonging to the church. Have you considered the fact that God is constantly giving to us; life, breath, mercy, answers to prayers, protection, well-being, health, shelter, jobs, etc.? Moreover, God loves us so much that He gave His very best; His Son. Jesus loves us so much that He sacrificially gave His life for us. The sincerity, depth, intensity, and immenseness of God's love for a sinful, rebellious, and wayward world is incomprehensible.

Has it ever occurred to you that God's love and Jesus' sacrificial gift to us have eternal life-giving abundant value? Remarkably, this is the avenue to salvation, forgiveness, eternal life, the presence of God, His Word, access to God, communion with God, sanctification (set apart to God for holiness), justification (legally pardoned of our sins and declared righteous based upon the atoning work of Christ), the undeserved gift of grace, mercy – not getting what we deserve, and so much more! We have received so many gifts from the Lord. How shall we honor Him? God gave Himself for us, why not give ourselves completely to our great and loving God! Give Him a place in your life. Christ is the head of the church and is himself its Savior (Ephesians 5:23). What shall we give? Giving is the fourth basic of belonging, according to Rainer, that we are focusing on this month (Sam Rainer, *7 Basics of Belonging*, pgs.45-53).

God expresses His great love for us through giving. He has been so extraordinarily good to us. Why shouldn't we give? The Psalmist raised a question; "What shall I render to God for all of His benefits to me" (Psalm 116:12-14)? Many people want to know how we can embrace God's love. First and foremost, by accepting the Son, Jesus Christ, as your Savior. Sam Rainer stated that "One way to embrace God's love is through the act of giving" (pg. 46). Further, Rainer explained that "giving is one of the main ways of worshiping God" (pg. 46).

While there are numerous ways of giving, our service, expressions of love, and worship; monetary giving is just as important. The Bible says that whoever is kind to the poor lends to the Lord, and He will reward them for what they have done (Proverbs 19:17). Jesus paid attention to giving one day in the temple. Luke records Jesus' observation of a poor widow who gave all that she had: two small coins (Luke 21:1-4). At the same time, He regarded her giving as the most in comparison with others who gave from their surplus (Sam Rainer, pg. 47). This widows' sacrificial gift noted by the King of Glory has been recorded throughout history. Every gift is important to God. The issue is not wealth but, whether you are worshiping, pursuing, and obeying God out of a sincere heart. People have all kinds of motives for giving; to make amends for a wrong done, to make peace, to gain fame, seize control, to manipulate, to gain an advantage, or to show off. Some give to get. What is your motivation?

Give to keep the church going. Monetary gifts are needed to support ongoing ministries of the church, such as general maintenance, repairs, the cost of utilities, church personnel, new equipment, technology needs, Christian education, and more. Sometimes, the church has a need for a special offering to fulfill a needed project. Don't forget to make a special effort to fulfill your pledge to the church. "Giving financially is a way to be part of God's work through the church. Give in proportion to your income" (John Koessler, *Today in the Word*, Nov. 2018, Vol. 21, Issue 11, pg. 36). In fact, God regarded a failure to bring the tithe and offerings as robbery (Malachi 3: 8). The tithe is rightly God's. Our offerings are expressions of love and gratitude. He commanded us to bring the tithe and offering into the storehouse so that there would be food in His house (Malachi 3: 8 -12). He said to put Him to the test to see if He would open the window of heaven and pour down a blessing so there would be no more need. God is faithful to keep His Word. Are you faithful and committed to give? Honor God with your first fruits versus your leftovers (Deuteronomy 18:4). Many people have testified of how God provided, met needs, blessed their 90% that remained, and even added increase in unexpected ways.

Paul gave practical directions to the church on how to give financially: to place their contribution into the offering of the church on the first day of the week (1 Corinthians 16:2). He suggested that their gift for the collection should be proportionate to their economic status; *as he may prosper* (1 Corinthians 16:2, ESV). Given, our virtual and hybrid church services, our offerings can be given in person, mailed, or paid online. God has been faithful to keep Tabernacle for over 101 years. Are you faithful to do your part by honoring God today with your monetary gifts?

felt that delay was indisputable evidence they didn't matter to God anymore. Have you ever drawn some unholy conclusions because you felt that your stay in life's waiting room was too long? If we are honest, most of us, if not all of us, have done this.

We must never forget that God is always challenging us and transforming us even in times of delay. We also must remember that God is still at work, although we may not see real-time proof. Sometimes God uses delay to challenge us to accept our humanity. To recognize our limited ability to fix every situation. Delay humbles us. At other times, God uses delay to challenge us to analyze our history. To reflect upon the undeniable truth that He has already brought us through so many times. God is the faithful God of our journey.

Moreover, God uses delay to challenge us to acknowledge, to call back to the forefront of our minds His unique character. He is the Everlasting God. This means that time does not affect Him because there has never been a time that He was not God, and there will never be a time to come when He is God. He is our forever God!

Furthermore, God is the Covenant God. He is the God who keeps His promise. He never goes back on His Word. God had entered into an irrevocable agreement with the children of Israel, just as He has entered into an irrevocable covenant with those of us who believe in Jesus Christ. For God to go back on His Word would be for God to cease to be God. What God has promised, He will fulfill!

We also must remember that God is the Creator of the ends of the earth. This means that He has control of everything. He alone can bring forth solutions out of "I don't see it" situations. Also, because God is perfect in all His ways, He never leaves any unfinished work. It is terribly important that we don't measure God's understanding by our understanding. God knows and understands what we are incapable of understanding. God specializes in helping the weak and those who are faint in heart.

If you find yourself in life's waiting room, in a period of nerve-wracking delay, there is one more challenge for us. Instead of abandoning your confidence in God, delay challenges us to adhere to God. The "wait" in this text carries the image of binding threads of string together to make a rope. Figuratively it means to bind yourself to something, to wrap yourself around something. The something, rather the Someone that we are to wrap ourselves around, is the Lord Himself. When we do this, we gain the benefits of His character working on our behalf. We gain renewed strength. We gain soaring ability. We gain running ability. We gain walking ability. Accept the challenge and wait on the Lord!


