

## **God With Us!**

Many people in our world find themselves distant, alienated, and estranged. They feel that they are in this world alone and must face the challenges of this world alone. This in itself is painful enough, but the pain becomes almost unbearable when the cause of this estrangement is self-inflicted. This is the dilemma of humanity without Jesus Christ. Humanity is completely separated from its creator, the source of what gives life meaning without Jesus Christ. The wonder of Christmas is that God remedies the distance, alienation, and estrangement experienced by man.

The wonder of Christmas is found in the term, Immanuel. Immanuel means "God with us." We must not lose the profundity of this term in its simplicity. The Creator God has come to dwell with us. He who has the power to make something out of nothing is with us. This fact should be an antidote for despair. The presence of God with us means that no situation is without hope. ## The Good News is the Old News was Wrong

Perhaps you struggle with feeling that you are powerless, worthless, and your life is meaningless. You are not alone. Many struggle. This struggle brings anxiety, depression, exhaustion, hopelessness, and despair. But here's the Good News: This old news of worthlessness or guilt in your head is wrong! "Even if we feel guilty, God is greater than our feelings, and He knows everything" (1 John 3:20, NLT).

Hear this: God loved you before He created anything. God loved and valued you before you became you - before you could do anything good or bad. "Even before He made the world, God loved us and chose us in Christ to be holy and without fault in His eyes" (Ephesians 1:4, NLT). You are loved!

"Can anything ever separate us from Christ's love? Does it mean He no longer loves us if we have trouble or calamity, or are persecuted, or hungry, or destitute, or in danger, or threatened with death? No, despite all these things, overwhelming victory is ours through Christ who loved us" (Romans 8:35, 37, NLT). You are important to God Himself! He wants to adopt you so He can pour out all of His love, all that He is and all that He has on you.

"God decided in advance to adopt us into His own family by bringing us to Himself through Jesus Christ. This is what He wanted to do, and it gave Him great pleasure. So we praise God for the glorious grace He has poured out on us who believe to His dear Son. He is so rich in kindness and grace that He purchased our freedom with the blood of His Son and forgave our sins." (Ephesians 1:4, NLT). It's greater and better than you can ever imagine or comprehend - but it's yours right now if you choose to believe it. God has made this possible by purchasing you through the death, burial, resurrection, and elevation of Jesus Christ over all things. Jesus' paid in full through His death on the cross for all your weaknesses, failings, shortcomings in other words, all of your sins.

"So now there is no condemnation for those who belong to Christ Jesus. And because you belong to Him, the power of the life-giving Spirit has freed you from the power of sin that leads to death. The law of Moses was unable to save us because of the weakness of our sinful nature. So God did what the law could not do He sent His own Son as a sacrifice for our sins" (Romans 8:1-3, NLT). You don't have to feel condemned and no one as the right to condemn you anymore - not even yourself. In Christ, you have the right to freedom from the bondage of a guilty conscience. Do not accept condemnation anymore!

Jesus will always speak up for you when you are accused. "Who dares accuse us whom God has chosen for His own? No one - for God Himself has given us right standing with Himself. Who then will condemn us? No one - for Christ Jesus died for us and was raised to life for us, and He is sitting in the place of honor at God's right hand, pleading for us" (Romans 8:22-24, NLT).

God has accomplished your victory by raising Jesus Christ from the dead. He rose and overcame sin, condemnation, and death for everyone who believes. His resurrection gave Him all power in heaven and on earth. You can find hope in all this. Here is what you need to do. "If you openly declare that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is by believing in your heart that you are made right with God, and it is by openly declaring your faith that you are saved. As the Scriptures tell us, 'Anyone who trusts in Him will never be disgraced.' Jew and Gentile are the same in this respect. They have the same Lord, who gives generously to all who call on Him. For 'everyone who calls on the name of the lord will be saved'" (Romans 10:8-13, NLT).

#### Writer's Ministry: Who Do You Say You Are?

For whom He foreknew, He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren (Romans 8:29, NKJV).

Sometimes, when we come across new people their question to us may be: "Who are you?" How would you respond? At that moment would you say: your full name, where you are from; or, would you state your vocation, office, title, or professional position? Some may even be inclined to say who they are the son or daughter of, or cousin of or even to whom they are married or where they are from. The question, "Who are you?" is a question of identity; who we believe we are.

On the other hand, when someone asks, "who are you in relationship to the church," would your response be different? Would you simply say your name, or would you respond with your name and your role in the church such as Sunday School teacher, choir member, usher, deacon, or minister? How we respond to this question in any scenario is often based on our sense of personal worth or a desire to raise our personal worth in the eyes of another individual. Regardless of status, importance, titles, roles in the church, everyone who joined the church upon receiving Christ as their Lord and Savior, can respond the same way: "I am a church member." This in and of itself is a powerful statement with many implications which we will explore over the next several months. Thomas Rainer in his book, "I Am a Church Member" (2013, pg. 6), stated that in the journey of discovering and rediscovering the joy of church membership, you will likely have a new or renewed attitude about your church. Rather than seeking to be first you can find joy in being last. Secondly, rather than being a whiner or complainer, you will be a unifier seeking what's best for the church. We pray that this will be our experience, too.

If we value and embrace the affirmation: "I am a church member," we will find that some decisions have to be made along the way. Not only this, each decision requires a commitment. High on the priority list is living true to the Word of God. The world tries to shape us and mold us in a way that is contrary to Christian values. Everyday, we are confronted with a barrage of messages from TV, the internet, social media, politics, and even certain groups of people who seek to sway us from the kind of person God intended us to be. Quoting Tara Leigh Cobble, "Secular culture tries to lure us into seeking our own pleasure, philosophy, popularity, and purpose outside of God. God glorifying people know their identity and know that their significance comes from God" (A Growing Love Shines Brightly, Devotional, 11-10-22 You Version).

As a church member, we do not have to remain the same as when we first joined the church. By God's Holy Word and in cooperation with the Holy Spirit we can grow and become conformed into the likeness of Jesus Christ our Savior (Romans 8:29). Our Christian identity is influenced by who God says we are. At the moment of salvation, we were uniquely placed into the body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12:13). Ephesians 5:23 says that Christ is the head of the church, His body, and is Himself its Savior. John MacArthur stated in reference to 1 Corinthians 12:12-27 that we are the body of Christ. This is unique. It has no Old Testament equivalent. This is our single identity. We are the body of Christ. We are a *koinonia*. We are a communion. We are a fellowship of one body, the body of Christ (The Body of Christ gty.org). What a dynamically accurate and powerful answer to the question of our Christian identity.

"And He put all things under His feet, and gave Him to be head over all things to the church, which is His body, the fullness of Him who fills all in all" (Ephesians 1:22-23, NKJV).

dispatch a proxy. Love caused Him to show up. It is this love that caused God to take upon Himself human flesh, without ceasing to be God, and live among us. It is this love that allows God to reach out to us despite our rebellion toward Him. God comes where He is not wanted because, in His infinite wisdom, He knows that he is needed. "God with us" is a manifestation of God's tenacious love for us. God refuses to let us go through life alone. He chose to come to us. The love of God is not only evidenced in His presence but ultimately in the payment for our sins on Calvary. The wonder of this is that this ultimate sacrifice, this testament of love, was demonstrated while we were yet His enemies.

This display of God's love toward us deserves a response. We should not merely rehearse the great truths of God loving us; we should receive the God of this great love in our hearts. God has shown up in the One who was born to die, the One who stood in our place on Calvary. The One we call Jesus. This is the One we should quickly invite into our hearts. So, this Christmas, if you have not received Jesus into your heart, do so. Receive the wonder of God's love and experience that which eliminates distance, estrangement, and alienation from the true source of life. The great Christmas hymn of Isaac Watts states it like this:

Joy to the world! the Lord is come! Let earth receive her King; let ev'ry heart prepare Him room, and heav'n and nature sing.

Joy to the earth the Savior reigns. Let men their songs employ, while fields and floods, rocks, hills and plains repeat the sounding joy.

No more let sins d sorrows grow, nor thorns infest the ground; He comes to make His blessings flow far as the curse is found.

He rules the world with truth and grace, and makes the nations prove the glories of His righteousness and wonders of His love.




