

### **No Worries**

Is it really possible to live of life of "no worries?" Can a person actually be worry free? The answer is yes! As human beings, we tend to worry because we allow our minds to become obsessed with the negative "what ifs" of life. If we are not careful these negative "what ifs" will cause us to write off the One "Who Is." There was a time in the life of David when by all human standards the negative "what ifs" were overwhelming. His own son, Absalom was leading a successful revolt against him. David was on the run as a common criminal even though he was king of Israel. It is believed when he had come to the place called Mahanaim (2 Samuel 17:24) that he remembered the One "Who Is" and therefore "Whose he is" that he wrote Psalm 23. David reveals in Psalm 23 why he was a man of "no worries."

David declares "Who Is" and "Whose he is." The first three words of Psalm twenty-three, when remembered can chase anxieties away. "The Lord is," the One who is the true and living God, the One who is faithful "is." He has been, He is right now, and will always be. There is no problem or adversary that will always be. The reawakened confidence in David was solidified when he reminded himself that he belonged to the One "Who Is." Notice what David says: "The Lord is my shepherd." You and I can never be free of worry if we don't have a personal relationship with the Lord. In it

### **Faith Chest**

"Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen" (Hebrews 11:1) "For we walk by faith, not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7).

Have you ever heard of a 'faith walk?' It is a behavior of faith when it looks like a situation is not going to work for you, but you believe it will work to your favor. Through many stories in the Bible, we learn that having faith is crucial in our belief. Like the two scriptures referenced above, Hebrews and 2 Corinthians, they are encouragement for us when we need to increase our faith.

And what about you, have you had to rely on faith? Times when you had done all that you could yet your efforts failed to fix the situation. You may have decided to turn to friends for help. You've received good advice or 'food for thought' from them in the past so why not try again. However, this time they don't have a solution. You reach out to family, maybe your spouse, big mamma or your favorite uncle. Still, no one could change the circumstance, and they each said they'd be praying for you. All that you've tried and all of your resources have been exhausted.

So, you decide to open the Bible for a comforting verse, or one that might give what you hope would be a 'quick' answer. You begin to realize that your problem-solving approach has been out of order. Finally, you bow down to the Most High God humbling your spirit at the Throne of Grace. It is here where you find God does what no one else could. It is in these moments with God you start to hear Him. Wisdom is being poured upon you and you begin to find peace in the middle of your problem. You breathe differently and then let go and let God. You are walking in faith. You trust that God knows all about it, and that He is working things out for your good. You recognize that the Holy Spirit has moved upon your circumstance and delivered you as only He can. Those who knew about your trial marvel at how you made it through.

After having many 'deliverance of grace' situations in your faith walk, you have built up a 'Faith Chest.' The place where you store the testimonies of the goodness of God during the toughest times in your life. The place where you can bring to your remembrance the faithfulness of God. Without a doubt God brought you out and you know that the Sovereign God lives.

As your faith walk becomes stronger you can use your 'Faith Chest' by:

- Regularly remembering the times God rescued you.
- Looking back into your 'Faith Chest' whenever you get fearful, insecure, or anxious and trust that He can deliver you again.
- Sharing your testimony. The marvelous miracles worked out in your life are not just for safe-keeping, tell others, who knows, your testimony might be the one that leads someone to Christ!

### Writer's Ministry Lesson: Will You Pray for the Church, and Its Members and Families

"This is a great mystery, but I speak concerning Christ and the church" (Ephesians 5:32, NKJV).

What would Christians do without the church? It would be like a bird without a nest, a duck without water, a refrigerator without food, or a plant without sunlight. The church is vital to Christians. For the unsaved, it is the life line to a destiny for eternal life in Christ Jesus.

For Christians, first and foremost, the church is a place to worship God in community and fellowship with other brothers and sisters in Christ. On Sunday mornings, the family can come together to worship God. After a week of each one going their separate ways, there's opportunity to learn together, to pray together, and to grow spiritually together. It is a wonderful unifying experience. Moreover, in the church, families can receive comfort, strength, and wisdom for whatever life has wrought. The expressed power of God's word nourishes and sustains the soul. In turn, we, as believers, get to express our love to Christ for His great undying love for us and the untold blessings He has bestowed. Worshiping God through music and song brings joy and delight. Often, certain sermons and songs are healing for a hurting heart.

"I will walk among you and be your God, and you shall be My people" (Leviticus 26:12, NKJV).

Not only is the church important to church members and families, but families are important to the church, also. Thom Rainer, in his book, *I Am a Church Member* (pg. 59), stated that we should pray together as family members for our churches. He discovered that his children grew up with a love for the church. At the same time, he noted that they were not blind to problems and challenges that occur in any church. No one is perfect. They learned, however, to love people unconditionally and to love the church (pg. 60). Unconditional love means love for the church will continue to grow even though you may not agree with something or encounter disagreeable people (pg. 62). For Christians, the church is more than a social convention and religious experience, it is part of our spiritual identity. On another level, the church is not a building, but the gathering of those who have been joined to Jesus Christ by faith. The church is the bride of Christ and Christ is the Head of the Church (see Revelation 19:7-10, Ephesians 5:22-33).

Many church members are single. Although there may not be any related family with whom they can worship in the church, by virtue of our Savior, we are a spiritual family in Christ Jesus. Rainer stated without our knowing, people watch each other and how our love of the church is expressed (pg. 61). Our devotion, levels of service, and sincerity become inspiring examples for others.

Last month we were urged to pray for the Pastor and our church leaders. This month, will you pray for the church? From Sunday to Sunday, life happens presenting multiple challenges and problems on various levels for the church, individual church members, and families within the church. No one is immune to difficulties. Will you pray for our church members and their families too?

in this personal relationship that the Lord provides all of what we need. The Lord can do this because He is perfect in all His ways, there is nothing lacking in Him. Because there is nothing lacking in Him, those of us who belong to will suffer no lack. Whatever He provides, He provides perfectly. This is why David says: "I shall not want."

When David considered "Who Is" and "Whose he is" the negative "what ifs" no longer taunted him. David understood that the Lord provided rest in times of distress. In times of exhaustion, the Lord would give him the refreshment of peace. David all too well knew his propensity to make mistakes, but he also knew that the Lord gives restoration. The Lord also provides routing, guiding David along the right paths. By now I am sure that you realize that no matter what you need, the Lord is able to provide. He provides relief from your fears by being present, resources in spite of your enemies, reassurance for the journey by His constant mercy and goodness, and a residence with Him forever.

The New Living Translation translates the twenty-three Psalm in this manner: "The Lord is my shepherd; I have all that I need. He lets me rest in green meadows; he leads me beside peaceful streams. He renews my strength. He guides me along right paths, bringing honor to his name. Even when I walk through the darkest valley, I will not be afraid, for you are close beside me. Your rod and your staff protect and comfort me. You prepare a feast for me in the presence of my enemies. You honor me by anointing my head with oil. My cup overflows with blessings. Surely your goodness and unfailing love will pursue me all the days of my life, and I will live in the house of the Lord forever" (Psalm 23, NLT).

The gospel songwriter Milton Thompson uses these words:

Because the Lord is my shepherd
I have everything I need
He lets me rest in the meadow's grass
And He leads me beside the quiet streams
He restores my failing health
And He helps me to do what honors Him the most
That's why I'm safe, that's why I'm safe
That's why I'm safe, safe in His arms
