## An Attitude of Gratitude

There is a time of taking inventory for most stores. This taking of inventory is not only to determine what is needed but to assess how well business has been. We too, ought to take inventory of our lives. We should do this to assess how good God has been to us. This personal inventory should produce an "attitude of gratitude." When we look around and truly observe, we realize the vastness of our blessings. Far too many people don't see themselves as being blessed and therefore suffer from a poor "attitude of gratitude."

One of the reasons for this blindness of blessing is due to taking so much for granted. We assume or expect that someone or something will always be available. This assumption leads us to a failure to say "thank you." We often wait to express our gratitude to people at their "celebration of life" instead of while they still have life. Say "thank you" to the people God has placed in your life. These people may have done something extraordinary for you, or they may have consistently provided small acts of kindness. These people may be people who are members of your family, or they may be someone you encountered only once. Regardless of the level of what was done, we should say "thank you." Thank God for people in your life.

We tend not to be grateful for our health and strength until some physical malady limits us. Our fore-parents would often thank God for a "reasonable portion of health and strength." They often did not have perfect health, but they thanked God for the quality of health they had. They understood what a blessing it was to have the strength to take care of themselves. They knew that the day could come when they might not possess these blessings, so they said, "thank you." Don't take your health for granted; thank God now for health and strength.

It seemed strange to hear our ancestors thank God for a "roof over their head." This was strange to us because most of us could not conceive of the idea of homelessness. This no longer is a strange idea; the possibility is painfully present all around us. We should be thankful for shelter. Your shelter could be a shanty. Your shelter could be a mansion, or anything in-between. Thank God you are not outdoors.

In the "land of plenty," we assume there is no reason to be grateful for food and clothing. Too many

## Your Life Is A Witness

In our current environment, we are living with heightened anxieties. Some things we can avoid if we are alert, but some things might present a dilemma, if it takes us by surprise. We spend time and energy preparing to live in this world, but some give little or no thought about preparing to live in the world to come.

This world is not our home, we are just passing through. Jesus went to prepare a home for us and He is coming back to take us to our new home where we will be with Him (John 14:2-3). The question is, will you be prepared to make the journey? Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life. No one can get to the home that Jesus has prepared except he/she goes through Jesus (John 14:6). Your preparation begins by agreeing with God that you are a sinner and ill prepared to take the journey. You must confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord who died on the cross for your sin and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead (Romans 10:9-10). Once you do this and put your trust in what Jesus has done, you are assured the place that Jesus has prepared for you.

Another question is what do you do in this world while waiting for Jesus to return for you? The answer is found in Matthew 28:19-20 where Jesus charged His disciples (and us) to make disciples of all nations teaching them all things that He has taught them. Our charge, then, is to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with everyone we meet so that they will be ready to go with Him when He comes. Your life is a witness whether you open your mouth or not. As you live a life of love, God will give you opportunities to share the love of Jesus Christ.

## Writer's Ministry Lesson: I Will Treasure Church Membership as a Gift

*"Now you are the body of Christ, and members individually" (1 Corinthians 12:27).*

One of the most memorable and effective marketing campaigns had a slogan that simply stated, *"Membership has its privileges."* Although this campaign theme ran from 1987 to 1996, this slogan is still synonymous with the exclusive American Express card. This clever statement was memorable and effective because in general, people like to belong. And after all, membership does have its privileges, especially if you are a member of the body of Christ!

Membership in the church offers believers the ultimate privilege—the privilege of serving. The church is not some exclusive country club, or card membership program where we are consumers focused on what we can get out of it, but rather, it is the entity through which we serve God and serve one another. Membership in the church grants us the opportunity to work alongside God—the creator of the universe. How awesome is that?

In his book, *I Am a Church Member*, Thomas S. Rainer encourages readers to treasure church membership as a gift. This approach ensures that we have the right attitude about the church. We are both a part of the universal church, which includes all believers, and we are also a part of the local church (p.72). According to Rainer, "When we receive a gift with true appreciation, we naturally want to respond to the Giver. We, therefore, see service to God as a natural outflow of the joy of our salvation and the consequent joy of our church membership. We consider it a privilege to serve the King, so we look for those opportunities at the church where can we serve" (p.73).

"For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve,  
and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45).

The way the church fulfills God's outward calling is through serving" (Sam Rainer, *Seven Basics of Belonging*, 2021, pg. 37). One writer said that love expresses itself in service to the needs of others (Hansen, G.W. (1994). *Galatians* (see Gal. 5:13–15)). Here are some ways to serve others: reach out with a phone call, card, written note, text, or email when a brother or sister is ill, in bereavement or suffering, experiencing anxiety, or just simply needs encouragement. Find out if they have any needs; food, meds, or errands they cannot do. Perhaps, all they need is someone to talk to or listen as they express what is on their hearts and minds.

"For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an  
opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another" (Gal 5:13).

As we serve in the church and serve one another, the body of Christ, let us exhibit the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Let us not grow weary in well-doing. Remember all that we do is to the honor and glory of God.

"knowing that from the Lord you will receive the  
inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ" (Col 3:24).

By virtue of our church membership, we have all of these blessings and privileges along with so many more. Let us treasure our church membership not as a place to congregate but as a gift received with a heart of thanksgiving.

of us have permitted our children to develop a selective, if not absent, gratefulness concerning these things. We thank God for what we like to eat and fall short of thanking Him for not allowing us to go hungry. We thank God for designer clothes and not for keeping us from having nothing to cover our bodies. Our children and we must thank God for food and clothing.

So far, we have addressed people and possessions as reasons for an attitude for gratitude. However, there is more cause to be thankful than these. The wonder of salvation is a great cause for thankfulness. God loved us so much that He rescued us from eternal ruin. He did this by sacrificing His only begotten Son, Jesus, for our sins. He allowed Jesus to pay the debt we could not pay. Without this act of love, we would have no opportunity to be delivered from our doom. We should be grateful for this. Salvation also provides for us the presence of God in our lives. Because of salvation, we have a future that is truly bright, a glorified body in the presence of God and all His glory. We also must have an unending appreciation for the grace and mercy of God. It is the mercy of God that keeps us from receiving what we are due for our wrong. Grace, on the other hand, keeps giving us what we don't deserve. These undeserved blessings may be in the realm of the tangible, or they may be in the form of fresh opportunities to get it right.

We should check our attitude. Have we taken our blessings for granted? Have we taken God for granted? Let us decide from this day forward to have an "attitude of gratitude." We have so much to thank God for! The prolific composer of gospel music, Richard Smallwood, uses these words to express his "attitude of gratitude."

For the many times I've fallen

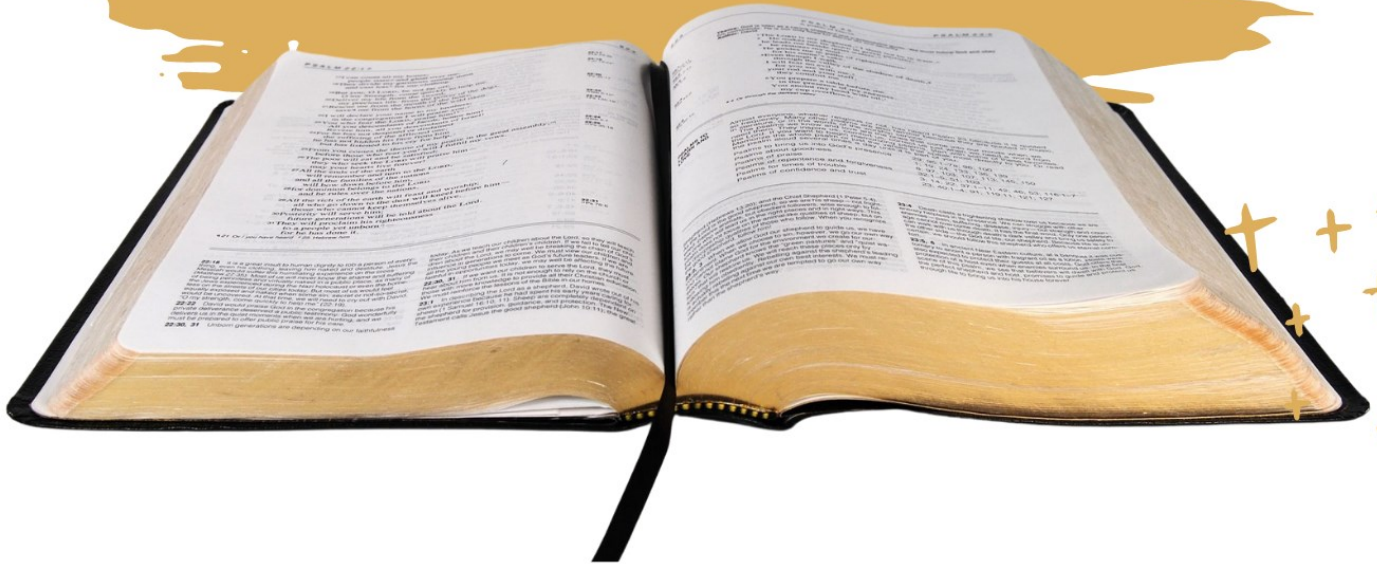

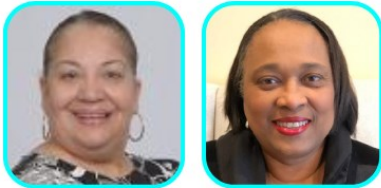

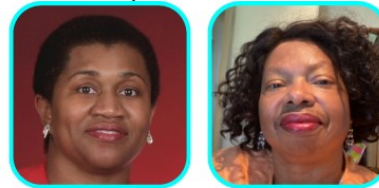
