Trust God

In times like these, God calls us to trust fearlessly. It's understandable to feel fearful during uncertain times, but God reminds us to trust in Him instead. Fear can cloud our perception of God's presence and hinder our ability to hear His voice. Therefore, God encourages us to replace fear with trust. This trust is not a general attitude but a trust in God specifically. Fear is actually a form of "trust," but it is misplaced and assumes the worst outcome. Fear is a negative force that can prevent us from considering a better tomorrow. It places confidence in the possibility of harm in our current circumstances. Essentially, living in fear means that we are letting our circumstances control us, especially the negative ones. God wants us to overcome our fears and not be emotional victims. Instead, He urges us to trust in Him. The question is "Can we trust Him?" This question infiltrates our minds as an uninvited guest who has overstayed their visit. There was a time when this question would not be worth considering. There was a time when we seemed to know that we could trust God; we had no doubt in our minds. Our doubt is often fed by our disappointment with God. Many are disappointed with God today because of a distorted view of God. This distorted view we possess of God requires God to work according to our agenda and for the fulfillment of our purpose. This is a strange ideology because we will embrace at the same time our limitedness while demanding that the unlimited God do our bidding. To trust God is more than believing that God can and will do what we ask. Trusting God is about trusting Him because of who God is.

God's trustworthiness lies in His nature as the embodiment of truth, incapable of falsehood. His justice is unwavering, always doing what is right. There is no need for Him to learn or acquire information as God is all-knowing and all-wise. He not only knows all the facts but also how to use them, ensuring that His knowledge is never misapplied. God's boundless power makes it possible for Him to

Willing & Available

I remember when I first decided I was going to stop calling myself a Christian - but instead I was going to walk, talk and act like a Christian. Back then I would look with envy at those around me who were able to live their faith out loud and were recognized as stalwart saints of the church. I would listen in awe as the spirit filled prayers flowed from their mouths without ripple or hesitation and I was fascinated by their ability to recite scripture by chapter and verse. I would look, listen and often wonder - *What about me Lord?* Little did I know that I was all I needed to be and where I was intended to be for God to use me in ways I never could have imagined.

I was not an evangelist, a Bible scholar, the most prolific prayer warrior, teacher or preacher. I did not have any of those titles. Yes, I was a fairly active church member and worked wherever I was asked to serve but nothing that required active ministry. I was simply a churchgoing believer who loved the Lord. But as I grew in Christ, the Holy Spirit showed me that God is not interested in our titles, He is interested in us. I learned that it does not matter if you wait tables at the local dinery or if you are a CEO of a Fortune 500 Company - you are equally important to God - and He has a plan to use you just where you are planted.

The Great Commission is to go out and "make disciples of all nations" (Matthew 28:19a). God did not condition or qualify this biblical mandate. He did not say you had to have a college degree, sing in the choir or look a certain way. This decree is not only for pastors, teachers, preachers, and evangelists. It is for you and me. It is for every believer in Jesus Christ and where you are planted is fertile ground. God has called you to be salt and light where you are and in all that you do. God is not hung up on titles. He is looking for a few good men and women who will shine Christ's light in a dark world.

You do not have to be a Bible scholar or hold any certain position in the church - you simply have to be willing and available. As you wonder where and how you fit into His divine plan - remember - God loves you more than you can imagine - He wants to use you for His Glory - you do not have to be a "perfect" Christian to be a vessel for the Lord Jesus Christ. It is not about you - it is how the Lord can work in and through you. Just make yourself available - that's it - God will do the rest.

Writer's Ministry Lesson: Our Church: A Gift or An Entitlement?

As Christians, we get a deep understanding of what God's done for us through the gift of salvation. II Corinthians 5:19-21-6:1 gives us a definitive picture. It tells us God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself; not holding our sins against us but drawing us to Him in fellowship. By placing us in the body of Christ—the church, we become ambassadors and partner with God in His Holy purpose. We have the greatest God-given opportunity of our lives—drawing others to God by walking and living lives of faith!

One silent killer that keeps a church from fulfilling God's purpose is the spirit of entitlement. Entitlement is the belief that one is inherently deserving of privileges or special treatment. Entitlement is rampant in our society, but tragically it's creeping into the church as the consumer culture infects the minds and hearts of many Christians. What does it look like in the church? It can disguise itself in many ways. Entitlement creates an underlying culture of everyone wanting church their way or wanting special treatment because of who they are or what they've done in life. Some become angry when they feel they've been overlooked for their efforts; they feel unseen, unknown, unappreciated, and uncompensated. It's in our human nature to want to be noticed; therefore, we must be vigilant! The cost of entitlement is often catastrophic in the church. Relationships are destroyed, ministries divided and rendered less effective, and the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20) is often overlooked.

With the help of God's Holy Spirit, we can recognize if the seeds of entitlement are growing in our hearts by prayerfully reflecting on the following and asking ourselves:

- Do I often feel discontent?
- Do I feel envy or resentment over the blessings, gifts, and opportunities others seem to have?
- Am I disappointed with life?
- Do I doubt God's faithful provision for me?
- Do I often unfavorably compare myself and my situations with that of others?
- Do I find myself grumbling about blessings not received instead of being grateful for those I have received?

After recognizing the spirit of entitlement, we must do everything in our power to eradicate it. We can start by yielding to the mission that Christ entrusted to us in Matthew 28:19, "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost." When we remember that we are bound by the Great Commission, we are duly reminded that our sole purpose is to serve God with wholeheartedness. Keeping this at the forefront of our minds makes it easier to place our needs and wants on the backburner, while we lift the most advantageous ways to advance the Kingdom. We learn to die to ourselves and commit to doing what we have been called to do.

Our next step is to promote unity in the body. Spiritual maturity is required for one to forsake his or her personal ideas of how something should be done in the body and come to a consensus so that ministry can move forward. Unity is gained and reinforced when we are able to do this regularly. It is even more imperative that we learn to come to a consensus without mumbling and complaining afterward because God desires for us to operate with a spirit of peace and not one of discord.

Finally, prayer and patience go hand in hand in eradicating the spirit of entitlement. Prayer puts God at the center of all decisions that concern the body. Coming together in corporate prayer honors God and helps us to build bonds with one another. "And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, and in breaking of bread, and in prayers," Acts 2:42. Fellowshiping, building bonds with one another, and praying together helps us to learn one another and become more patient with one another just as God is patient with us. We become what God created us to be—one with each other. As it states in 1 Corinthians 12:13, "For by one Spirit are we all baptized into one body, whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free; and have been all made to drink into one Spirit." There is no room for entitlement in oneness.

bring to pass whatever He has promised. He is also omnipresent, present everywhere at all times, and has promised to never leave or forsake us. His love for us is sacrificial and always seeks the best for us. Trusting God means believing that He knows what is best for us and will always act in our best interests. Moreover, God is eternal and immutable, unchanging in His nature and character. We can trust God because He is dependable and will never change on us.

It is possible to place our trust in God, but the real question is whether we are willing to do so. Can we relinquish our grip on things that have disappointed us in the past, and on things that will continue to disappoint us? Can we replace our anxieties with faith in God? Are we willing to trust God without any hesitation? God desires for us to have faith in Him because He is the only one who is completely dependable. Personally, I have chosen to trust God. Will you also place your trust in Him? W. C. Martin speaks my conviction in his hymn, "My Heavenly Father Watches Over Me."

My Heavenly Father Watches Over Me
