

Freedom

During this time of year, some people celebrate while others reflect on the significance of the Declaration of Independence and the Emancipation Proclamation. These two documents primarily address the concept of political freedom, one being the independence of American colonies from Great Britain and the other being the emancipation of enslaved Black people in America. However, there is a much more profound type of liberty that deserves recognition - spiritual freedom. Sin is a cruel and unrelenting slave master that enslaves many. Unfortunately, it can be difficult to discuss sin without causing offense as it involves rebellion against God. Despite the illusion of freedom that sin promises, it only leads to further enslavement.

This enslavement is a life void of freedom; it is a life of confinement. People who are not free are slaves to fettering manifestation of this rebellion toward God. It restricts their movement. People who are not free cannot move beyond their addictions and self-destructive behaviors. People who are not free cannot move to personal wholeness and, therefore, are never able to enter into healthy relationships. Those who are confined often attempt to create a lifestyle of confinement for those with whom they have contact. A life that has no freedom produces a

Spotting GOD

A pirouette is a graceful spin that's executed by ballerinas and contemporary dancers alike. Experienced dancers love to do pirouettes and spins in modern dance, whirling round and round. This spinning move for beginner and novice dancers can be a problem. They can easily become dizzy in the head and lose balance. A good instructor will tell them about a helpful hint that will help them maintain balance and control. It is called "spotting" where you identify a single point for your eyes to return to each time you make a full circle spin. Having a single focal point will enable you to master pirouettes and spinning with a graceful finish.

We all face many twists and turns in life. When we focus on our problems, however, the things we encounter seem unmanageable, leaving us dizzy and heading toward a disastrous fall. The Bible reminds us that if we keep our minds steadfast, or focused, on God, He'll keep us in "perfect peace" (Isaiah 26:3). Perfect peace means that no matter how many turns life takes, we can remain calm, assured that God will be with us through our problems and trials. He's the "Rock eternal" the ultimate "spot" to fix our eyes on because his promises never change.

May we "spot" our eyes on Jesus as we go through each day, going to Him in prayer and studying His promises in the Scriptures. May we rely on God, our eternal Rock, to help us move gracefully through all of life. Family, let's share, remember, focus and "spot" on this important scripture.

John 3:16 (ERV)

Yes, God loved the world so much that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him would not be lost but have eternal life.

Writer's Ministry Lesson: The Meaning of Church Membership

Instead, we will speak the truth in love, growing in every way more and more like Christ, who is the head of His body, the church. He makes the whole body fit together perfectly. As each part does its own special work, it helps the other parts grow, so that the whole body is healthy and growing and full of love (Ephesians 4:15-16, NLT).

Introduction

As a church we are so happy to return to in-person worship after a three - year pandemic. We are extremely excited about the new members who joined our church body during the Pandemic and since then. We welcome you and extend our heartfelt thanks to God for each of you. This series of lessons to follow are designed to acquaint you and inform our long-standing members of some basics of belonging to the church.

If someone were to ask you why you joined the church, what would your response be? Would you tell them you joined because your family has attended the church for years and you were expected to join as well? Would you say you joined because it's close to where you live? Maybe you joined because you love the singing and the pastor's preaching. Perhaps, you joined because of the undeniable call of God on your life and the prompting of the Holy Spirit. No matter what your reason was for joining the church, one thing is for certain: it didn't occur by happenstance. God is definitely up to something! He wants you to learn of Him and His Word, fellowship with Him, and worship and fellowship with your sisters and brothers in Christ. Moreover, God loves "community," and He wants you to be a part of one.

One way to be involved in God's community is by joining the local church where you can serve and where others can serve you. We are designed to live in communion with one another and serve the Lord together. In his book, *7 Basics of Belonging: The Meaning of Church Membership*, author Sam Rainer notes that one of the reasons to join a church is simply because "You belong here! You are not here by accident. God has a plan for you and that plan includes being a faithful and active part of a local church" (Rainer, 2021, p.7). For the next several months, we will be studying just what it means to belong and serve God in tandem.

We will explore several aspects of church membership. The fact that the church is a visible representation of God makes it unlike any other organization on earth. In fact, it goes beyond the confines of an organization—it's a living organism! With most human organizations, one can pay to belong or request membership, but your place in the body of Christ is without cost and a direct result of God's grace. God's commitment to each of us as His adopted sons and daughters is demonstrated by deliberately placing us in relationship with Himself and each other. He has begun a work within us and being a member of His body (the church) is part of the salvation process. With Christ as the head of the church (Ephesians 5:23, Ephesians 4:15), the church is called 'the body of Christ' (1 Corinthians 12:12-14, 27). The blueprint for the fellowship of the faithful flows directly from the heart of God and is directly linked to God's mission to seek and to save the lost. As Rainer (2021) states, "The church is not a destination point for crowds, but a vehicle designed by God to reach neighborhoods and nations" (p. 12).

The church provides an opportunity for us to be counter-cultural (Rainer, (2021), pgs. 10-11). This means we choose to live according to the truths and principles of God's Word versus the ungodly, immoral, and lawless ways of the world. In fact, the vision of Tabernacle Missionary Baptist Church is to become a totally biblical church creating a counter culture for Christ for the advancement of His Kingdom. Exactly, what is culture? Roughly, it is an integrated system of beliefs, traditions, ideas, philosophies, arts, and values of a society. Culture influences and shapes the way one thinks, behaves, relates to others, plays, or works. What culture believes about God, relationships, or being human may be different than what the Bible says. It takes resolve, discipline, faith, and commitment to live according to the Word of God versus the ways of the secular world. This does not happen all at once. It is a process made possible by the empowerment of the Holy Spirit within us. When we falter, God is merciful and kind. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness (1 John 1:9). As a church family, we can encourage each other, support one another, and joyfully grow in these areas and more all to the glory of God. You are not alone. It is such a joy and so gratifying to be part of a church family.

milieu of sour attitudes about life and tends to view people through the lens of cynicism. The freedomless life is both negative and fearful of the future, it has no hope beyond this side. This really is a miserable life. These people may appear to be free due to freedom of physical activity and the enjoyment of some of this world's goods, but it takes more than this to be free.

Jesus is the key to true freedom for everyone. While external freedom is important, the real transformation begins within our hearts. Our rebellion against God has created a divide in our relationship with Him, but Jesus came to reconcile us with our Creator. Through His sacrificial death, we can break free from the chains of sin. Trusting in Jesus Christ is the only way to experience the beauty of life and true liberation. By following His guidance and trusting in Him, we can escape the darkness of sin and see the divine image in ourselves and others. Without complete faith in Jesus, we cannot escape the despair of life. As we ponder political freedom, let us also celebrate the freedom that can only be found through Jesus Christ.

"When he put it in these terms, many people decided to believe. Then Jesus turned to the Jews who had claimed to believe in him. "If you stick with this, living out what I tell you, you are my disciples for sure. Then you will experience for yourselves the truth, and the truth will free you." Surprised, they said, "But we're descendants of Abraham. We've never been slaves to anyone. How can you say, 'The truth will free you'?" Jesus said, "I tell you most solemnly that anyone who chooses a life of sin is trapped in a dead-end life and is, in fact, a slave. A slave is a transient who can't come and go at will. The Son, though, has an established position, the run of the house. So if the Son sets you free, you are free through and through" (John 8:30–36, The Message).




