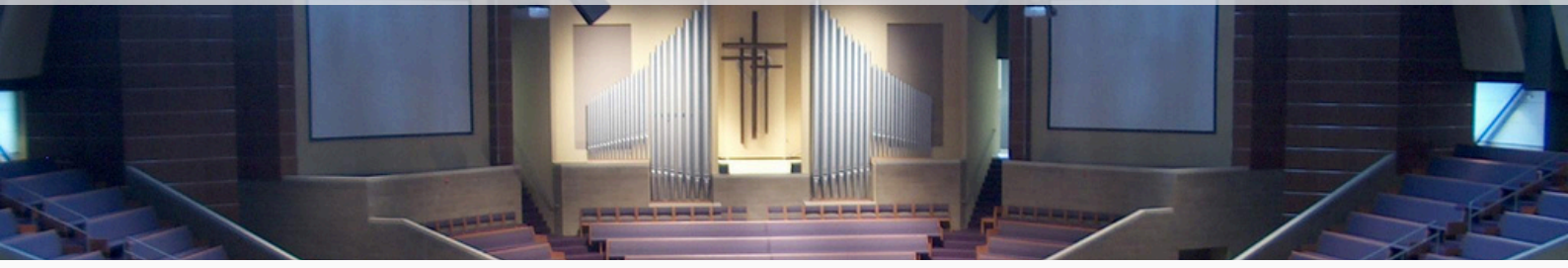

Acts 17:24–30 TPT**

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DAY 1

THE GREATNESS OF OUR GOD

Psalm 104:1-24

Devotional:

As we reflect on the unmatched greatness of God, let us marvel at His creation. The psalmist paints a vivid picture of God's creative power and sustaining presence in nature. Just as Paul stood in Athens, surrounded by idols, we too are often surrounded by things that vie for our attention and worship. Yet, none can compare to the majesty of our Creator. Today, take time to observe the world around you - the sky, trees, birds, or even the intricate design of your own body. Let each detail remind you of God's incomparable greatness. How does recognizing God's greatness change your perspective on your current circumstances?

Application:

Remember, the One who created the universe is intimately involved in your life.



DAY 2

THE GOODNESS OF OUR PROVIDER

Matthew 6:25-34

Devotional:

Our God is not only great, but He is also unquestionably good. As we read Jesus' words about God's provision, we're reminded that our Heavenly Father knows our needs even before we ask. The sermon emphasized that God needs nothing from us, yet gives everything. This truth should liberate us from the burden of trying to earn God's favor or provision. Instead, it invites us to trust in His goodness. Reflect on times when God has provided for you in unexpected ways. How can you cultivate a heart of gratitude for His daily provisions?

Application:

Challenge yourself to worry less and trust more in God's goodness today.



DAY 3

GOD'S SOVEREIGN RULE

Daniel 4:28-37

Devotional:

Today we focus on God's unimpeachable governance. The story of Nebuchadnezzar reminds us that all earthly power is subject to God's authority. Just as the sermon emphasized that God determines the rise and fall of nations, we see this dramatically illustrated in Nebuchadnezzar's experience. This truth can bring comfort in times of political uncertainty or when we feel powerless. Remember, no matter what happens in the world around us, God remains in control. How does this reality affect your view of current events or personal challenges?

Application:

Take time to surrender your concerns to the One who rules over all.



DAY 4

The Grace That Saves

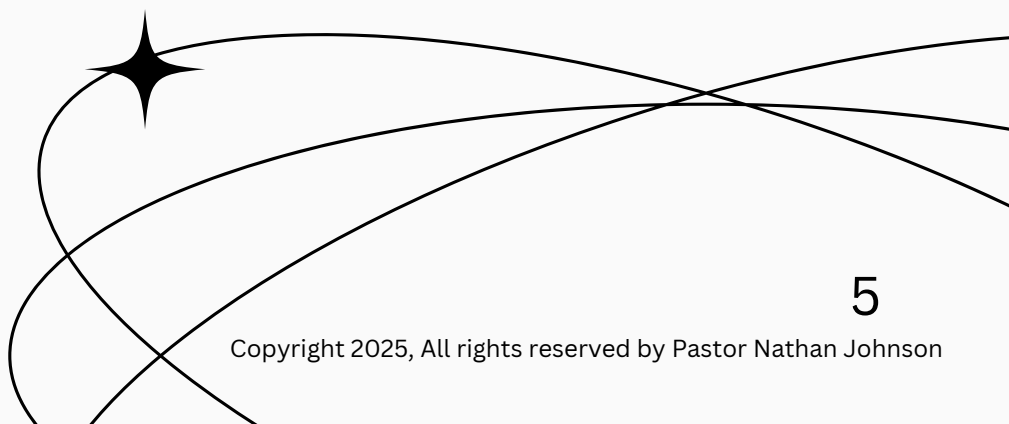
Ephesians 2:1-10

Devotional:

The undeserved grace of God is a central theme in our faith. Paul's words to the Ephesians echo the sermon's emphasis on God's patience, the privilege of repentance, and His pardon. We were dead in our sins, yet God made us alive in Christ. This is grace beyond measure. Reflect on your own journey of faith. How has God's grace transformed your life? Remember, it's not by our own efforts that we are saved, but by God's gift. Let this truth humble you and fill you with gratitude.

Application:

How can you extend this undeserved grace to others in your life today?





DAY 5

Unity in Christ

Galatians 3:26-29

Devotional:

Our final day focuses on the unity we have in Christ. The sermon powerfully reminded us that we all come from "one blood" and are part of the human race, created in God's image. Paul's words to the Galatians reinforce this truth - in Christ, our differences fade in light of our shared identity as God's children. This unity transcends racial, social, and economic boundaries. How does this truth challenge any prejudices or biases you might hold?

Application:

Pray for God to give you His perspective on the people around you. Consider how you can actively promote unity and equality in your sphere of influence, reflecting the heart of God for all people.
