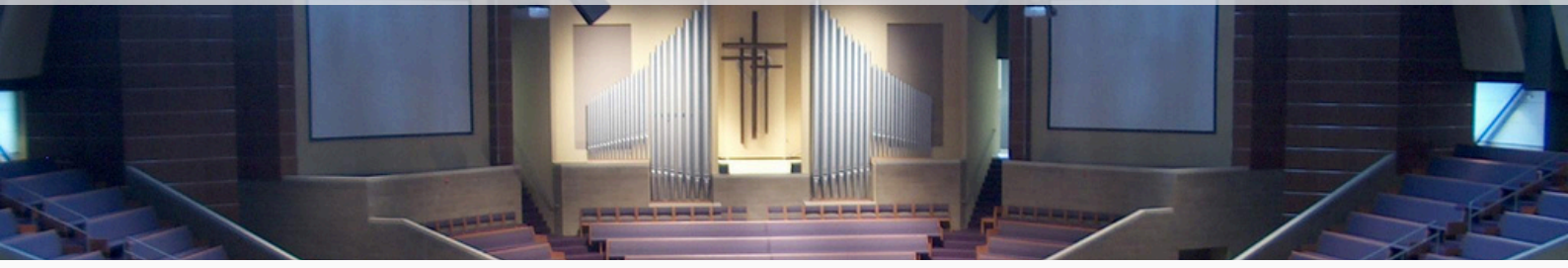

Psalm 113:1-9, NLT**

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DAY 1

THE MAJESTY OF GOD

Psalm 113:1-9

Devotional:

As we begin this journey, let's reflect on the incredible majesty of our God. The psalmist calls us to praise the Lord from the rising of the sun to its setting. Our God is high above all nations, and His glory is above the heavens. Yet, in His greatness, He stoops down to look upon the earth. Take a moment to consider the vastness of God's power and authority. How does recognizing God's majesty change your perspective on your current circumstances?

Application:

Today, practice praising God for His greatness, even in the midst of your daily routines.



DAY 2

GOD'S MERCIFUL NATURE

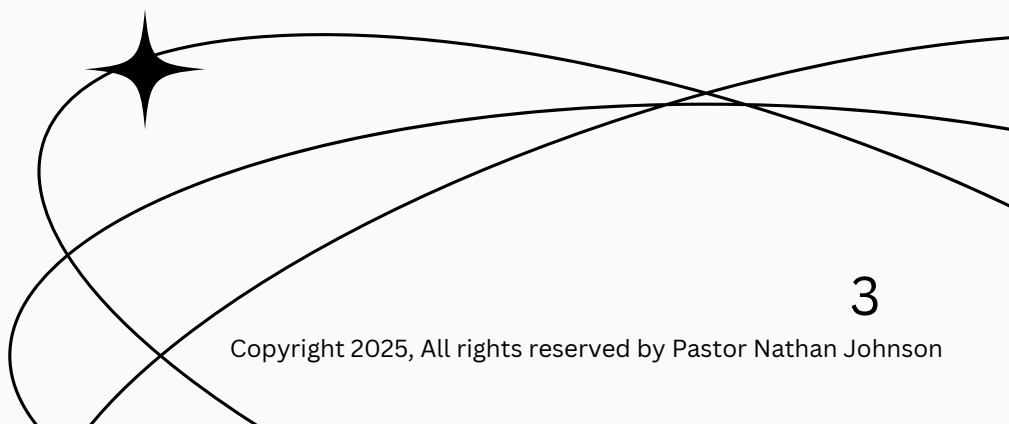
Ephesians 2:1-10

Devotional:

Yesterday we focused on God's majesty; today we turn to His mercy. Our God is not only transcendent but also immanent - both far above and very near. In Ephesians, we see how God, rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in our transgressions. Reflect on times in your life when you've experienced God's mercy. How has He lifted you from your "ash heap" and seated you with Him?

Application:

Today, extend mercy to someone else as a reflection of the mercy you've received.





DAY 3

THE GREAT REVERSER

1 Samuel 2:1-10

Devotional:

Our God is the great reverser of fortunes. In Hannah's prayer, we see how God lifts the poor from the dust and raises the needy from the ash heap. He grants children to the barren and humbles the proud. Think about areas in your life where you need God's reversing power. Are there situations that seem hopeless?

Application:

Remember, with God, nothing is impossible. Pray boldly today, asking God to reverse what seems irreversible in your life or in the lives of those around you.



DAY 4

PRAISING GOD IN ALL CIRCUMSTANCES

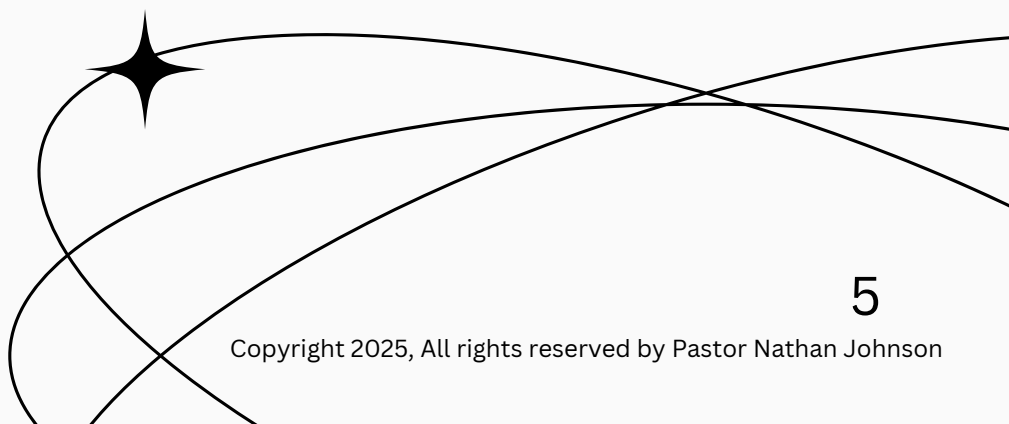
Acts 16:16-34

Devotional:

Paul and Silas, though imprisoned, sang praises to God at midnight. Their example reminds us of the psalmist's call to praise God from sunrise to sunset, in every place and circumstance. Reflect on times when praising God was difficult. How did (or could) praise change your perspective?

Application:

Today, challenge yourself to praise God in a difficult situation you're facing. Let your praise be a testimony to His unchanging goodness.





DAY 5

THE ULTIMATE REVERSAL - RESURRECTION POWER

1 Corinthians 15:12-28

Devotional:

We conclude our week focusing on the ultimate reversal - Christ's resurrection. This event changed everything, reversing the power of sin and death. Paul reminds us that because Christ was raised, we too have the hope of resurrection. How does the reality of Christ's resurrection impact your daily life? In what ways can you live today in light of this resurrection power?

Application:

As you go about your day, remind yourself that the same power that raised Christ from the dead is at work in you.
