THE UNCHANGING TRUTH OF GOD


Numbers 23:19-20, Malachi 3:6

Devotional:

Application:

GOD'S UNFAILING PROMISES


Isaiah 41:10, Joshua 23:14

Devotional:

God's promises are not mere words, but unshakeable commitments. The sermon reminds us of God's many "I will" statements throughout Scripture. Each one is a testament to His faithfulness and love for us.

Application:

Today, meditate on the promises God has made to you personally through His Word. Which one resonates most with your current situation? How can you live today in light of that promise? Let God's assured declarations embolden your faith and guide your actions, knowing that He who promised is faithful to fulfill.





RECOGNIZING GOD'S VOICE IN UNEXPECTED PLACES


Numbers 22:21-31, 1 Kings 19:11-13

Devotional:

The story of Balaam and his donkey teaches us that God can speak through unexpected sources. Sometimes, like Balaam, we can be so focused on our own agenda that we miss God's clear warnings or directions. Are there "donkeys" in your life – seemingly insignificant things or people through which God might be trying to get your attention?

Application:

Take time today to quiet your own thoughts and ambitions. Ask God to open your eyes and ears to His guidance, even if it comes from surprising places. Be ready to heed His voice, regardless of how it reaches you.





STANDING FIRM IN A TRUTHLESS WORLD


John 8:31-32, Ephesians 6:13-14

Devotional:

The sermon describes our current times as "truthless" and full of deception. As believers, we're called to stand firm in God's truth amidst this cultural backdrop.

Application:

How can you be a beacon of truth in your sphere of influence? Consider areas where you might be tempted to compromise or bend the truth for personal gain or comfort. Ask God for the courage to stand firm, even when it's difficult. Remember, our allegiance is to the God of truth, not to the shifting sands of societal norms or personal convenience.





RESTING IN GOD'S UNFAILING CARE

Matthew 6:25-34, 1 Peter 5:7

Devotional:

The sermon concludes with the comforting reminder that God will take care of us. In a world full of anxieties and uncertainties, this promise is a balm to our souls.

Application:

Reflect on areas of your life where you're struggling to trust God's care. What worries are you carrying that you need to surrender to Him? Today, practice actively casting your cares upon the Lord. When anxious thoughts arise, counter them with truths about God's character and His promises to care for you. Let His peace, which transcends all understanding, guard your heart and mind in Christ Jesus.
