THE REAL KING HAS ARRIVED


Psalm 24

Devotional:

As we read Psalm 24, we're reminded of the majesty and authority of our God, the true King. In a world full of "wannabe" leaders and false idols, it's crucial to recognize and honor the sovereignty of the Lord.

Application:

Reflect on areas in your life where you may have allowed other things to take God's rightful place. How can you "lift up the gates" of your heart today to welcome the King of Glory? Remember, everything belongs to Him – your possessions, your talents, even your very breath. Let this truth humble you and inspire gratitude for His gracious rule in your life.





GOD'S UNSHAKEABLE OWNERSHIP


Colossians 1:15-20

Devotional:

Today's passage affirms Christ's supremacy over all creation. Like the sermon emphasized, God owned everything "before time began." This eternal ownership should reshape our perspective on stewardship.

Application:

Consider how you view your possessions, your time, and your abilities. Are you holding them with open hands, recognizing they ultimately belong to God? Pray for wisdom to use all He's entrusted to you for His glory. Let the reality of Christ's lordship over all things give you peace in uncertain times, knowing that nothing is outside His control.





RESPONDING TO THE KING'S PRESENCE


Isaiah 6:1-8

Devotional:

Isaiah's vision of God's holiness led to profound worship and willing service. Similarly, the sermon called us to "take the top off" our praise and expectations of God.

Application:

Reflect on your own encounters with God's presence. Have you allowed familiarity or complacency to dull your sense of awe? Ask the Holy Spirit to renew your wonder at God's majesty. Consider practical ways you can "lift up your gates" in worship, whether through more intentional prayer, expressive praise, or acts of sacrificial service. Remember, when we truly recognize God's glory, we can't help but respond.





VICTORY THROUGH THE MIGHTY ONE


1 Corinthians 15:54-58

Devotional:

The sermon described Jesus as "the Lord of victory" and "mighty in battle." Today's reading celebrates the ultimate victory Christ has won over sin and death.

Application:

In what areas of your life do you need to claim this victory? Perhaps you're struggling with persistent temptation, fear, or discouragement. Remind yourself that the same power that conquered the grave is at work in you through the Holy Spirit. Stand firm in faith, knowing that your labor in the Lord is never in vain. Thank God for specific "battles" He has fought on your behalf, and trust Him with the challenges you face today.





CITIZENS OF AN UNSHAKEABLE KINGDOM

Hebrews 12:18-29

Devotional:

The sermon touched on the security of our "birthright citizenship" in God's kingdom. Today's passage contrasts the unshakeable nature of God's kingdom with the temporary things of this world.

Application:

As you read, consider what it means to live as a citizen of heaven while still on earth. Are there worldly attachments or concerns that are shaking your confidence? Ask God to help you fix your eyes on the eternal, letting go of what is temporary. Thank Him for the grace that allows us to "worship God acceptably with reverence and awe." Let this heavenly perspective shape your priorities and fuel your witness to others who need the hope of this unshakeable kingdom.
