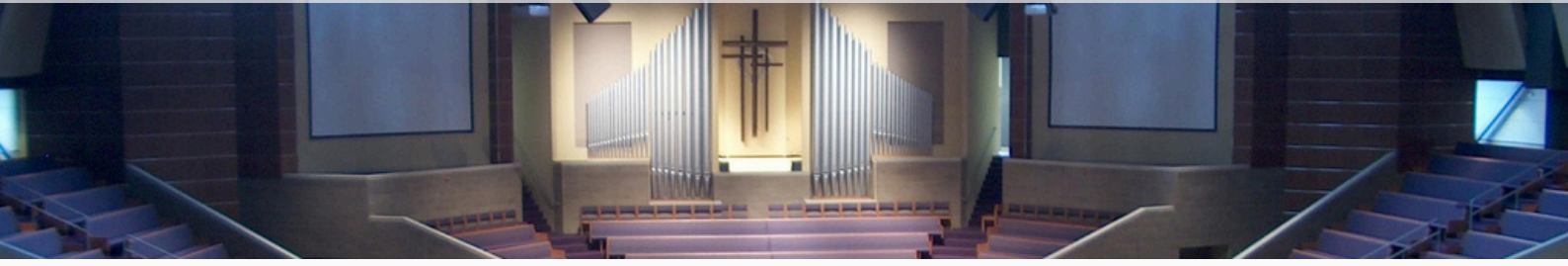

DAY 1

BUILDING ON THE SOLID ROCK

Matthew 7:24-27

Devotional:

Jesus' parable of the wise and foolish builders reminds us of the importance of our life's foundation. Just as a house built on rock withstands storms, so too does a life built on Christ's teachings remain steady in turbulent times. Today, reflect on your own life's foundation.

Application:

Are you actively applying God's Word, or merely hearing it? Consider areas where you might be building on sand - perhaps relying on worldly wisdom or popular opinion instead of God's truth. Pray for the wisdom and courage to build your life on the solid rock of Christ's teachings, knowing that this foundation will sustain you through life's inevitable storms.



DAY 2

CHOOSING WISDOM IN A WORLD OF DISTRACTIONS

Proverbs 2:1-11

Devotional:

In our fast-paced, information-saturated world, it's easy to be swayed by fleeting trends and hollow philosophies. The sermon reminds us to "use our head" and make wise choices. Proverbs echoes this, urging us to seek wisdom like hidden treasure. Today, examine the influences in your life.

Application:

Are you basing decisions on God's wisdom or the world's ever-changing opinions? Challenge yourself to actively seek God's wisdom through prayer, Scripture study, and godly counsel. Remember, true wisdom isn't just knowledge, but the application of God's truth in our daily lives.



DAY 3

THE TRANSFORMATIVE POWER OF OBEDIENCE

James 1:22-25

Devotional:

The transcription emphasizes that merely hearing God's Word isn't enough - we must apply it. James reinforces this, comparing those who hear but don't do to someone who forgets their own reflection. Today, focus on being a "doer" of the Word.

Application:

Identify one specific teaching from Scripture you've struggled to apply. It might be forgiveness, patience, or speaking truth in love. Pray for God's strength to put this into practice today. Remember, obedience isn't about perfection, but about a heart willing to be transformed by God's Word.



DAY 4

FINDING STABILITY IN CHRIST AMIDST LIFE'S STORMS

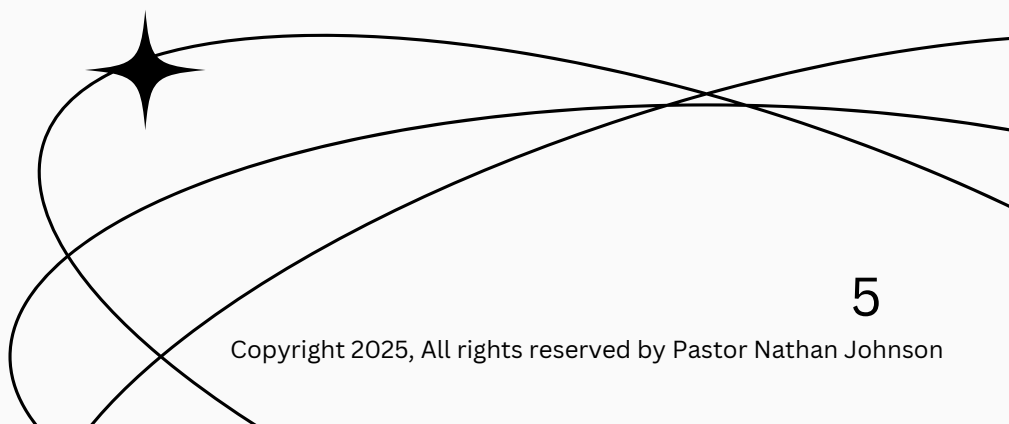
Psalm 46

Devotional:

Life's storms are inevitable, as the sermon points out. But our response to these challenges reveals the true nature of our faith. Psalm 46 beautifully illustrates God as our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. Today, reflect on the storms you're facing or anticipating.

Application:

Are you trying to weather them in your own strength, or are you anchoring yourself to the unchanging God? Take time to be still and know that He is God. Let His presence be your stability when everything else seems to be shaking.





DAY 5

THE UNSHAKEABLE HOPE OF THE RESURRECTION

1 Corinthians 15:12-22

Devotional:

The sermon culminates with the powerful reminder of Christ's resurrection - the ultimate demonstration of God's power over death and sin. This truth is the bedrock of our faith and hope. As you read Paul's words, let the reality of the resurrection sink in. This isn't just a historical event, but a living hope that transforms how we face each day.

Application:

In light of the resurrection, how does it change your perspective on your current struggles or fears? Today, live as one who has unshakeable hope, knowing that because Christ lives, we too shall live.
